The New Development Bank (NDB), a Multilateral Development Bank, was established in the 2015 by the BRICS countries of which South Africa is a member. The incumbent is required to represent South Africa at the NDB for the period of 5 years.

Criteria for appointment as the Vice-President: • International experience in large organizations with international exposure and rich experience in infrastructure and development finance • Strategic thinking skills – an ability to translate concepts and general policy direction into workable and sustainable long-term strategies • Implementation skills – an ability to deliver the Bank's strategy, especially to fully implement the resolutions of the Board • Inter-personal skills, corporate behaviour and track record in being part of a cohesive and collective decision-making body • Communication and consultation skills and experience in dealing with the public and the media • Understanding of the Bank's mandate and policy issues, and a high level of commitment and energy to fulfil the mandate of the NDB • Knowledge of a language or languages of the Member Countries, in addition to English, would be desirable • Recognition of the BRICS spirit featuring mutual respect and understanding, equality, solidarity, openness, inclusiveness and mutually beneficial cooperation • A firm commitment to and appreciation for multilateral cooperation and international development, indepth understanding of multilateral rules and procedures of international organizations.
