It will seek to appoint a number of technical experts on various PFM capacity development projects, such as on-site technical assistance, education and training solutions, organizational design and human resource management support. Given the scope and complexity of the programme, National Treasury is seeking to strengthen the Programme Coordinating Unit with the following two (2) year contract appointment.

The Project Coordinator will coordinate and manage all capacity building projects related to the broader programme.

Key responsibilities:

- Develop policies and procedures required for programme implementation;
- Facilitate the procurement and appointment of service providers for PFM capacity development projects in line with prescribed Supply Chain Management processes;
- Coordinate and manage consultants that are appointed for related sub-projects;
- Develop and schedule work plans in accordance with specifications and funding limitations;
- Coordinate and supervise the activities of programme staff and consultants;
- Timely preparation and quality control of all substantive technical reports, briefs and documents;
- Oversee and coordinate daily operations and activities;
- Coordinate activities of projects with beneficiaries to ensure optimum efficiency and compliance with appropriate policies, procedures and specifications;
- Prepare periodic narrative and financial reports of programme activities and progress;
- Monitor and evaluate programme effectiveness to develop improved methods and/or take appropriate corrective action;
- Develop and publish communications and promotional material;
