








- Durban is Africa's Premier Port

- Economic strategy pinned on strengthening gateway status to enhance manufacturing; trade, tourism and ocean economy industries











STRONG FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

- Unqualified Auditor General report since inception (2000)
- Best collection rate in country 104.84% (2013/2014 FYE)
- Cash on hand: R5.5 billion equating to 109 days operating costs
- Under-geared balance sheet due to controlled borrowings and careful management of expenditure
- Credit rating best in municipal sector (AA- in long-term with positive watch and A1+ in short-term)
- Net debt to total income at 19% reduced from 40% and represents 4% of EThekwini GDP

Particularly high growth in terms of rates and electricity income has seen eThekwini Municipality report high revenue growth and robust surpluses over the review period. The metro reports robust solvency and a lowly geared balance sheet, which together with the aforementioned liquidity results in a very strong credit risk profile."









INVESTMENT IN SERVICE DELIVERY AND SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE CONTINUES TO GROW

- Full (100%) expenditure of 2014/15 capital budget of about R6bn
- 2015/16 capital budget of >R6bn funded principally from internal revenue and grants
- Between 1994 2014 we delivered more than
 183 589 subsidised housing units (highest among Metros) and 500 000 new residential electricity connections
- Approximately 20% of total budget is spent on capital projects for the last 10 years.
- 53% of capital expenditure on new assets and 47% on asset renewal
- 11% of total operating budget on maintenance (benchmark is 10%)
- Capital expenditure for revenue generating projects is increasing in real terms










DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY IS ALIGNED TO DEMONSTRATED DEMAND

- We're directing investments into efficient growth corridors




R120bn in or near implementation






WHERE TO NEXT
