# 2014/15 FINANCIAL YEAR-END PRELIMINARY OUTCOMES:CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT

The preliminary outcome presented in this release is an update of that published in the monthly Section 32 report on 30 April 2015. The spending data presented in the 30 April publication is actual expenditure as recorded on 31 March 2015.

During April 2015, departments clear all control accounts. Regular social grant transactions are amongst the items that were yet to be journalised at the time of the 30 April release, resulting in a substantive change to aggregate spending. Departments have now closed their accounting records for fiscal year 2014/15 and the spending outcomes in this note will be submitted for auditing. The National Treasury will review the publication process for the Section 32 reports and year-end spending report to eliminate any confusion regarding the preliminary outcome.

#### Main budget government fiscal framework

The latest main budget figures are shown in Table 1. Compared to the 2015 Budget figures, the 2014/15 main budget deficit moderates to 4.3 per cent of GDP from 4.7 per cent of GDP, reflecting higher-than-expected tax revenue collections and lower expenditure. Gross revenue collections are at R986.3 billion for the year 2014/15, R7.3 billion higher than the 2015 Budget estimate. Non-tax revenue is R2.2 billion higher than the 2015 Budget estimate.

Non-interest spending amounts to R1.02 trillion, reflecting underspending of R3.3 billion. Lower-than-expected interest payments contributes R0.2 billion to total underspending of R3.5 billion. The combination of higher tax revenues and lower spending translates into a borrowing requirement of R167.8 billion, compared to a budget estimate of R180.9 billion.

#### Consolidated budget government fiscal framework

The latest consolidated budget figures – which include departmental revenue, National Revenue fund receipts, provinces, and social security funds – are shown in Table 2. The consolidated budget deficit in 2014/15 is expected to narrow to 3.5 per cent of GDP compared to the 2015 Budget estimate of 3.9 per cent. Consolidated budget revenue is expected to amount to R1.10 trillion – R10.5 billion higher than the 2015 Budget estimate.

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Spending is estimated to be R4.5 billion lower than the 2015 Budget estimate. In total, the budget deficit is estimated to narrow by R15 billion in 2014/15.
