

PUBLICATION OF CIVIL SOCIETY REPRESENTATIVES NOMINATED TO THE PARTICIPATORY MECHANISMS IN FISCAL POLICIES PILOT PROJECT

National Treasury made an open call for groups or coalition of civil society organisations (CSOs) with an interest in budgeting and fiscal policy matters to nominate one person to be part of a 3-year pilot project in South Africa.

Out of the 14 nominations that were made, only five were in line with the communicated requirements. See the attached annexure for the disclosure of all nominations received. There is no further level of selection necessary. From the nominations, the following names will be representing CSOs in the advisory body that will be formed with government to work on this project:

These names will be submitted to the project sponsors, the International Budget Partnership (IBP) and the Global Initiative for Fiscal Transparency (GIFT), for noting and necessary communication wherever necessary. We will also be extending the invitation to the launch of this project that will happen on 2-3 March 2020, in Pretoria, where the other countries such as Benin, Liberia, Nigeria and Senegal will join South Africa in strategising on how best fiscal policies can best be open for the public to participate.
