## Details of adjustments to 2004 Estimates of National Expenditure

### Roll-overs – R124,868 million

#### Programme 5: The Enterprise Organisation

R98,185 million has been rolled over for Critical Infrastructure Programme (CIP) projects, which extend over more than one financial year. Upfront payments were not an option and payments will be made in tranches, based on expenditure incurred by the contractor. R5,602 million is for the East London Development Corporation, R33,133 million for the Richards Bay Development Corporation (John Ross Freeway), and R59,450 million for other CIP projects.

#### Programme 6: Trade and Investment South Africa

R1,683 million was rolled over for the Youth Internship Programme (YIP), which started eight months later than expected due to a delay in obtaining approval from the Department of Labour for the Department of Trade and Industry to run the programme for two years before it was transferred to the Department of Labour.

#### Programme 7: Marketing

R25 million has been rolled over to reimburse the department for its contribution to the 2010 FIFA World Cup bid.

### Unforeseeable and unavoidable expenditure – R500 million

#### Programme 5: The Enterprise Organisation

R500 million has been allocated to finance the Pebble Bed Modular Reactor programme. The PBMR company had planned to secure external financing from a strategic partner but this did not materialise, jeopardising the integrity of the project plan. The socio-economic benefits of this

investment in developing a low-cost and safe nuclear option for the generation of electricity, will include local industrialisation of component manufacture and significant job creation.

### ***Details of savings realised on the above programmes***

#### **Programme 4: Consumer and Corporate Regulation**

Savings of R27,581 million were mainly due to unfilled vacancies.

#### **Programme 6: Trade and Investment South Africa**

The R79,519 million savings were mainly surplus funds identified by the Export Credit Insurance Corporation (ECIC) due to the introduction of the new interest make-up scheme. There were also savings as a result of vacant positions not being filled.

### ***Utilisation of savings to augment the above programmes***

#### **Programme 1: Administration**

R22,442 million was used to defray payments to transactional and facility advisors for public-private partnerships (PPP), for professional services for the learning centre, and for the finalisation of the cleaning and security services at the House of Trade and Industry and Fedlife buildings.

#### **Programme 2: International Trade and Economic Development**

R2,500 million was used to finance increased operational expenditure relating to technical teams established to enhance international negotiations.

#### **Programme 3: Enterprise and Industry Development**

R16,576 million was used to partly fund the recapitalisation of the National Empowerment Fund to finance the increased demand for projects in agribusiness, aquaculture, tourism, mining and agro-biodiversity, among others, and to augment the allocation to the Development Bank of Southern Africa for the community PPP programme.

R300 000 will be used to finance the new transfer payment to the Council for Science and Industrial Research in respect of the Aerospace Industry Support Initiative.

#### **Programme 5: The Enterprise Organisation**

R30,282 million was used to increase the transfer payment to Enterprise Development for the significant increase in the number of new applications to the Small Medium Enterprise Development Programme.

R15 million will be used to partly finance the new transfer payment to the Pebble Bed Modular Reactor which will offer South Africa a state-of-the-art and cost-competitive alternative for generating electrical energy and processing heat on an environmentally friendly and sustainable basis.

#### Programme 7: Marketing

R20 million was used to fund economically active citizens' increasing demand for **the dti's** products and services.

#### **Funds shifted within a programme**

##### Programme 3: Enterprise and Industry Development

R1 million was shifted from goods and services to the transfer payment to the National Research Foundation: Centres of Excellence Programme.

##### Programme 5: The Enterprise Organisation

R45 million was shifted from the transfer payment: Small and Medium Manufacturing Development Programme and R40 million from goods and services to the new transfer payment: Pebble Bed Modular Reactor.

##### Programme 6: Trade and Investment South Africa

R19 million was shifted from the transfer payment: Export Credit Insurance Corporation to the new transfer payment: Aichi Exposition 2005.

#### **Other adjustments – R150 million**

#### ***Expenditure announced in the 2004 Budget but not allocated***

R150 million has been allocated to augment the transfer to the National Empowerment Fund. The funds will be used within the framework of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act (2003) to finance medium-sized transactions.
