Details of adjustments to Estimates of National Expenditure 2006

Roll-overs – R87,298 million

Programme 1: Administration

R2,5 million has been rolled over for consultancy services to determine the spread of economic activities in the country.

Programme 2: Economic Statistics

R4,598 million has been rolled over for processing data from the income and expenditure survey.

Programme 3: Population and Social Statistics

R79 million has been rolled over for the community survey. R19,9 million for satellite imagery data; R22 million for the dwelling frame unit; R23 million for the census surveys and administration system; R11,4 million for transport for data collection; and R2,7 million for IT infrastructure.

Programme 5: Statistical Support and Informatics

R1,2 million has been rolled over for upgrading information security.

Selected expenditure trends for the first half of the 2006/07 financial year

Expenditure in the first six months of 2006/07 was R409,774 million, or 35,3 per cent of the adjusted appropriation of R1,162 billion for the year as a whole. Spending is almost twice as much as in the first six months of 2005/06. The year-on-year increase in total expenditure relates to higher budgeted allocations in the baseline allocation for the community survey, R50,85 million earmarked for the 2011 census, R48 million for the income and expenditure survey, and R30 million for labour statistics, the consumer price index and capacity.

The main increases in the *Economic Statistics* programme are due to the fieldwork for the income and expenditure survey, which comprises approximately 85 per cent of the total budget for the survey. The survey began in the first six months and is planned to be completed by the end of October 2006. In the *Population and Social Statistics* programme, increases are related to increased activities in the community survey and the master sample survey, which did not take place in 2005/06.
