Appropriation of amounts of money for requirements of State

Subject to the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), there are hereby appropriated out of the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State 5 in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2003, the amounts of money shown in the Schedule.

Short title

2. This Act is called the Appropriation Act, 2002.
