## Details of adjustments to 2004 Estimates of National Expenditure

### Roll-overs – R2,202 million

#### Programme 1: Administration

R470 000 has been rolled over for a special presidential sports awards function, postponed due to the national elections in April 2004.

#### Programme 2: Funding, Policy and Liaison

R197 000 has been rolled over for a research project into the number of registered players in national federations. The project was only completed in April 2004.

#### Programme 3: Building for Sport and Recreation

R509 000 and R1,026 million have been rolled over because of delays in Building for Sport and Recreation projects at the Greater Groblersdal Municipality and Cape Town Metropolitan Council respectively.

### Unforeseeable and unavoidable expenditure – R5,790 million

#### Programme 1: Administration

R4,200 million has been allocated for costs associated with the new deputy minister.

#### Programme 2: Funding, Policy and Liaison

Following South Africa's successful bid, R1,590 million has been allocated for the additional capacity required for the department's responsibilities for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

#### Funds shifted within a programme

#### Programme 2: Funding, Policy and Liaison

R650 000 was shifted from goods and services and R1,500 million from transfers to sports federations (R2,150 million in total) to transfers to the South African Sports Commission (SASC)

for organising the Zone VI Games. This was not included in the allocation for the SASC in the 2004 Estimates of National Expenditure.
