## Details of adjustments to Estimates of National Expenditure 2006

### Roll-overs – R41,951 million

#### Programme 3: Marine and Coastal Management

R6,951 million has been rolled over for the completion of the project to replace the Marion Island Base, used for important weather observations and national and international scientific research.

R35 million has been rolled over for patrol and research vessels for operational costs.

### Unforeseeable and unavoidable expenditure – R1,8 million

#### Programme 5: Biodiversity and Conservation

R1,8 million has been allocated for flood damage to roads and tourism accommodation in the Karoo National Park.

### Selected expenditure trends for the first half of the 2006/07 financial year

Expenditure in the first six months of 2006/07 increased by 36,5 per cent compared to the same period of the previous financial year.

The main increases are due to spending on the *Social Responsibility Policy and Projects* programme, and increased transfers to public entities for infrastructure development for 2010. Payments for capital assets decrease because the Marion Island base building project will come to an end in 2007.
