#### Programme 1: Administration

When the minister was transferred to the Department of Justice and Constitutional Development her assets were transferred with her, including a vehicle for which the Department of Housing was

refunded R532 883. The present minister's car was in an accident and was auctioned for R90 000. These funds were transferred to the National Revenue Fund and will be used to defray expenditure on new cars for the minister.

### Selected expenditure trends for the first half of the 2006/07 financial year

Expenditure in the first six months of 2006/07 was R3,5 billion, or 47,7 per cent of the adjusted appropriation of R7,3 billion for the year as whole.

Expenditure in the first six months of 2006/07 has increased by 28,5 per cent compared to the same period of the previous financial year. The main increases are a result of transfers made by the *Housing Development Funding* programme to the integrated housing and human settlement development grant and by the *Housing Sector Performance and Equity* programme to public entities.
