

Press alert: Release of the OECD Economic Survey of South Africa

The Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) will release its economic survey of South Africa on Monday 19 July 2010. The survey looks at measures to boost long-term growth and employment in the country, ranging from labour markets to fiscal policy issues. The OECD released its first Economic Assessment of South Africa in 2008.

Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan and OECD Secretary-General Angel Gurría will host a press conference regarding the survey, as per the details below:
