

1. Scope

This specification covers the material and make of identification jackets for the personnel of the South African Police Service.

2. Definitions

For the purpose of this specification the definitions given in SANS 10371 "Terms and definitions for clothing" and the following shall apply:

acceptable: acceptable to the South African Police Service (SAPS).

nominal: subject to the tolerances normal to good manufacturing practice.

SANS: South African National Standard.



Figure 1 - Dimensions




Figure 2 - SAPS Emblem



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

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

Annexure A

(Informative)

CKS 129 - Colours for textiles

Textile colours are registered for a period of SEVEN YEARS only. Due to the fact that colours can change over this period of time, any colour standard which has been registered for more than seven years shall be considered archived and requires re-registration.

- A. Three metres of material to be submitted by the successful bidder when:
- 1. First time registration is required (CKS 129 colour number does not exist).
- 2. A colour standard is archived.
- 3. Colour standards are no longer available at SABS Standard Sales.
- B. Requirements for the submission of material as identified in A:
- 1. Material shall be submitted to the purchaser.
- 2. The colour shall be as agreed upon between the SAPS and the successful bidder.
- 3. SAPS shall be responsible for each colour name/title.
- 4. SAPS shall supply the approved three metres of material to the SABS for registration.

Requirements of the bid

- 1. Unless otherwise stated, the South African Police Service (or an organization or person appointed by SAPS) shall be the inspecting authority.
- 2. Three pre-production samples of each authority/rank identification jackets, shall have been inspected, tested and approved by the inspecting authority and the end user before bulk production is commenced. Each one of these samples shall be accompanied by a trim chart containing a sample of each component material (as given in 6) and the relevant certificates. It shall be the duty of the manufacturer to give adequate notice to the inspecting authority of the availability of these samples.
- 3. The jackets shall be subject to inspection during the course of manufacture. The inspector shall, during normal working hours, be given all reasonable facilities for carrying out his duties and shall have the right of entry into the contractor's factory and the factory or works of any subcontractor where work on jackets supplied to this specification may be in progress.
- **4.** The contractor shall inspect the finished jackets for compliance with the specification before submitting them to the inspecting authority for final inspection.
- 5. Before acceptance, the jackets shall have been inspected and tested by the inspecting authority and the end user and found to comply with the requirements of the specification.
- **6.** One container of each consignment shall be marked "DOCUMENTS" and shall, in addition to ID jackets, contain the following:
- the packing slip/delivery note;
- the inspection certificate(s) (where applicable); and
- a copy of the invoice containing the following:
 - > the order number; and
 - > a full description of the consignment, i.e. items, size(s), quantity, etc.
- 7. The bidder must be in possession of a capability report from an accredited institution.
- 8. Test reports must be obtained from an accredited test laboratory.
