CONTRACT CIRCULAR – AMENDMENT 3

CONTRACT RT27-2019: PROVISION OF DEBT COLLECTION SERVICES TO THE STATE FOR THE PERIOD 1 JULY 2020 TO 30 JUNE 2023.

1. This contract will be subject to the Master Transversal Contract and all its annexures issued in accordance with Chapter 16A of the Treasury Regulations published in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999). The Special Conditions of Contract and all the annexures are supplementary to that of the Master Transversal Contract. Where, however, the Master Transversal Contract is in conflict with the Participation Agreement, General Conditions of Contract and Special Conditions of Contract the Master Transversal Contract will prevail.
2. The contract circular for the aforementioned contract distributed to State Institutions together with all other annexures constitutes the official and binding agreement between the Service Provider and the State. State Institutions are, therefore prohibited from making any amendments of any nature to the aforementioned contract, except on the service levels.
3. The National Treasury will communicate all amendments, if any, to the State Institutions. It would only be at the receipt of such notification from the National Treasury that State Institutions can effect any changes to this contract.

5. Utilization Guidelines

5.1. Initial Process

- 5.1.1. The interested State Institutions must complete the Request to Participate Letter in order to be included as a participant on the contract. The letter must be submitted to National Treasury – Chief Director: Transversal Contracting for consideration to transversal.contracting1@treasury.gov.za. The office will respond officially to confirm participation.
- 5.1.2. All the sixteen (16) appointed Service Providers are qualified, have met the technical requirements of the bid and have demonstrated the capacity and capability to deliver the debt collection services to the State.
- 5.1.3. The commission fees chargeable was negotiated and approved by National Treasury. However, State Institutions may further negotiate the commission fee with any of the Service Providers (if necessary).
- 5.1.4. All of the Service Providers have signed the Master Transversal Agreement with National Treasury and are readily available to provide the debt collection services.
- 5.1.5. The appointment of all Service Providers was on an “*as an when required*” basis, therefore no guarantees of allocation of works must be made to the Service Providers.

5.2. Selection Process

- 5.2.1. Appointment of more than one (multiple) Service Providers is highly encouraged to effectively manage the performance of the appointed Service Provider(s). Successful collection will be measured against average performance of other Service Providers.
- 5.2.2. The State Institutions must follow the least cost model to select and appoint any of the listed Service Providers. If the Service Provider with a higher commission fee is appointed, the State Institution must be in a position to motivate the reasons for not selecting other service providers in favour of the Service Provider with a higher

commission fee and record such reasons for audit purposes.

5.2.3. The State Institutions may use the company profiles report to motivate the reasons for appointment or non-selection. If needs be, Institutions may request the Service Providers for presentations and demonstrations of their service offering.

5.2.4. State Institutions must conclude Participation Agreements with all the appointed Service Providers. Once the Participation Agreement is duly signed, the State Institutions will issue the Service Request(s) with the allocated debt book. All Service Requests must be signed off by both parties and attached to the relevant Participation Agreement as Annexures to the said Participation Agreement.

5.3. **Rotation Process**

5.3.1. State Institutions are encouraged to rotate the appointed Service Providers to ensure maximum successful collection and fair distribution/allocation of works.

5.3.2. In order to ensure a fair rotation process, the Institutions must request the Service Providers to declare the number of Institutions they have or are rendering services to in terms of RT27/2019 and the debt book value of such appointments. This will assist to determine the workload/allocation of work of all the appointed service providers for rotation purposes.

5.4. **Supplier Relationship Management Process**

5.4.1. State Institutions are responsible for performance management, supplier relationship management and dispute resolution. Failure to resolve the dispute, both parties may escalate and notify in writing to the National Treasury – Chief Director: Transversal Contracting for further dispute resolution, failing which parties may seek legal advice.

5.4.2. State Institutions and Service Providers are required to submit quarterly historic reports of all the services requests issued and progress thereof. The report will indicate the name of the service(s) providers/State Institution, debt book value, expected targeted value, actual collected value, commission fee payable, challenges, opportunities and success of the contract. This information will be analysed and be used for supplier performance management reviews by National Treasury. The reports to be send to transversal.contracting1@treasury.gov.za

5.5. **Administration Process**

5.5.1. In order to reduce the administration burden, State Institutions must refrain from requesting any bidding document including SBD documents every time they issue a Service Request to the awarded service providers as the competitive process was followed at National Treasury. The compliance documents including the SBD forms

can be obtained from National Treasury upon request. Upon signing of the Participation Agreement, all the supporting documents must be finished at this stage for the duration of the contract.

6. Contract Circular – Commission Fee Structure:

6.1. The debt collection services offered are on the basis of “No Successful Collection, No Commission Fee” payable. All commission fee percentages are inclusive of 15 % VAT.
