Details of adjustments to Estimates of National Expenditure 2005

Roll-overs – R89 million

Programme 2: Security

R26,302 million has been rolled over for the current payments portion for upgrading security equipment at correctional centres. The agreement was concluded in 2004/05, but payments were only made in 2005/06.

Programme 7: Facilities

R62,698 million has been rolled over for the payments for capital assets portion for upgrading fixed security equipment at correctional centres. The agreement was concluded in 2004/05, but payments were only made in 2005/06.

Details of savings

Programme 2: Security

Savings of R227,984 million arise from a decrease in overtime and the shifting of posts for central management committees to *Programme 3: Corrections* in line with the department's restructured establishment.

Programme 6: After-Care

Savings of R28,357 million arise from a decrease in overtime and the shifting of posts away from this programme to *Programme 3: Corrections* in line with the department's restructured establishment.

Programme 7: Facilities

Savings of R169 000 are due to the net effect of an increase in the provision for office accommodation and a decrease due to corrections to PERSAL in line with the department's restructured establishment.

Utilisation of savings

Programme 1: Administration

R13,905 million has been used to fund posts that were shifted to this programme in line with the department's restructured establishment.

Programme 3: Corrections

R127,743 million has been used to fund the case management committee posts that were shifted to this programme in line with the department's restructured establishment.

Programme 4: Care

R6,544 million has been used to pay the three meals per day nutritional system service provider.

Programme 5: Development

R15,249 million has been used to fund this programme's increasing establishment.

Programme 8: Internal Charges

R93,069 million has been used for the three meals per day nutritional system.

Other adjustments – R1,135 million

Self-financing expenditure

Programme 1: Administration

R15 000 was received from Grade Four Property Trust for the executive committee's strategic session.

Programme 5: Development

R39 000 was received from private companies to train 40 offenders in hydroponic farming.

R1,081 million was collected from hiring out prisoner labour at a rate prescribed by the department and approved by National Treasury. The full amount is deposited into the National Revenue Fund and 33 per cent is reallocated to the department to supplement the budget for prisoner gratuities.

Selected expenditure trends for first half of 2005/06 financial year

Expenditure in the first six months of 2005/06 amounted to R3,769 billion, or 40,4 per cent of the adjusted appropriation of R9,324 billion for the year as a whole.

The main increases are related to the further implementation of the new parole boards and the shifting of case management committees to *Programme 3: Corrections*.

The reallocation of Medcor expenditure from *Programme 1: Administration* in December 2004 resulted in a reallocation of expenditure across all programmes.

The increase is also due to increased compensation of employees for social work services and the introduction of three meals a day for inmates.
