## Details of adjustments to Estimates of National Expenditure 2005

### Roll-overs – R73,045 million

#### Programme 1: Administration

R12 million has been rolled over for capital projects in Addis Ababa, Abuja and Maseru that could not be completed on time.

R8 million has been rolled over for maintenance projects in Windhoek and Milan that could not be completed on time.

R6 million has been rolled over for the transaction advisor for the PPP project for the head office building.

#### Programme 2: Foreign Relations

R11,845 million has been rolled over for new missions in Damascus, Toronto, Abu Dhabi, Manila, Malabo and Asmara, which were opened later than planned.

#### Programme 3: Public Diplomacy and Protocol

R14,2 million has been rolled-over for the Progressive Governance Summit, which will be held in the current financial year.

#### Programme 4: International Transfers

R13 million has been rolled over for the South African government's contribution to the victims of the tsunami in Asia and East Africa.

R8 million has been rolled over for constructing a library in Mali. The funds were from the Presidential Inauguration.

### Unforeseen and unavoidable expenditure - R38,65 million

R38,65 million has been allocated for South Africa's commitment to the mediation effort in Côte d'Ivoire on behalf of the African Union.

### Details of savings

#### Programme 2: Foreign Relations

In a budget review exercise, savings of R13,823 million were identified due to over-budgeting for the maintenance of chanceries, residences, offices and motor vehicles.

**Utilisation of savings****Programme 1: Administration**

R5,661 million has been used for information and communications technology.

**Programme 3: Public Diplomacy and Protocol Services**

R8,162 million has been used for diplomatic immunities and Regional Services Council levies.

**Funds shifted within a programme****Programme 2: Foreign Relations**

R19,485 million has been shifted from payments for capital assets to goods and services to align with the new Standard Chart of Accounts (SCOA) reporting requirements.

**Programme 3: Public Diplomacy and Protocol Services**

R4,195 million has been shifted from goods and services to transfers to government departments and agencies due to a misallocation, and has been used for municipal rates and taxes for diplomatic missions.

**Other adjustments – (R13 million)****Shifting of funds between votes****Programme 4: Internal Transfers**

R13 million has been shifted to the Department of Provincial and Local Government in its capacity as government's co-ordinator of the tsunami relief efforts.

## Selected expenditure trends for first half of 2005/06 financial year

Expenditure in the first six months of 2005/06 amounted to R797,421 million, or 37 per cent of the adjusted appropriation of R2,694 billion for the year as a whole.

The year-on-year rate of increase is noticeably high, because delays in implementing the new SCOA reporting requirements in the first six months of 2004/05 forced the department to transact items in the latter part of 2004/05.
