I, Pravin J Gordhan, Minister of Finance, acting in terms of section 15(2) and 25(2) of the Division of Revenue Act, 2013 (Act No. 2 of 2013), as amended by the Division of Revenue Amendment Act, 2013 (Act No. 29 of 2013), hereby publish in the attached Explanatory Memorandum and Schedules:

- (a) Additional conditional allocations to provinces and municipalities authorised in terms of the Adjustments Appropriation Act, 2013;
- (b) Roll-overs of conditional allocations to provinces and municipalities not transferred by national departments during the 2012/13 financial year, authorised in terms of the Adjustment Appropriation Act, 2013;
- (c) The allocation of unallocated conditional grants to provinces and municipalities;
- (d) The re-allocation of stopped conditional allocations between municipalities in terms of section 18 and 19 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2013, as amended;
- (e) Technical adjustments on conditional allocations to provinces and municipalities; and
- (f) Additional and amended frameworks in respect of conditional allocations to the provinces and municipalities.

For ease of reference only and where applicable, the attached Schedules reflect the main allocations, roll-overs, adjustments and total adjusted allocations.

This government Notice is set out as follows:

- Part 1: Conditional allocations to municipalities;
- Part 2: Additional and amended frameworks and conditional allocations to Provinces; and
- Part 3: Additional and amended frameworks and conditional allocations to municipalities.

Explanatory Memorandum to the Allocations set out in the attached Schedule

This *Gazette* is published in terms of the Division of Revenue Act, 2013 (Act No. 2 of 2013), as amended by the Division of Revenue Amendment Act, 2013 (Act No. 29 of 2013) and provides information on additional allocations and adjustments to existing allocations to provinces and municipalities in the 2013/14 national financial year.

This is necessitated by the need to allocate the unallocated allocations to provinces and municipalities, and the re-allocation of funds in terms of Section 19 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2013, as amended.

This *Gazette* therefore updates information that was originally published in Government Gazettes No. 36581 of 24 June 2013.

This notice affects the following grant programmes:

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

1. The National Health Grant (NHG) is a schedule 6A indirect grant with two components; the national health insurance component and the health facility revitalisation component.
2. The NHG differs from a schedule 5A grant in that the funds reside in the budget of the NDOH and is not transferred to the respective province. The NDOH instead, using the funds, implements projects on the respective province's behalf.
3. In the 2013/14 financial year, R291 million was appropriated for the NHI component. The main purpose of this component is to:
 - Develop and implement innovative models for contracting general practitioners within selected NHI districts;
 - Identify and test alternative reimbursement models for central hospitals in readiness for the phased implementation of NHI; and
 - Support central hospitals in strengthening health information systems and revenue management.
4. While NDOH assumes responsibility for the implementation of projects on the indirect grant, the Division of Revenue Act makes provision, in section 20, for the grant to be converted to a direct grant to provinces. Before the grant can be considered to be converted, the NDOH must be satisfied that:
 - The conversion will prevent under expenditure or improve the level of service delivery on the allocation in question; and
 - The affected national or provincial department or municipality has demonstrated the capacity to implement projects.
5. After verifying capacity, the NDOH requested for an amount of R2 452 780 to be converted to National Health Insurance grant, which is a schedule 5A direct grant, and be allocated to the Western Cape Department of Health.

6. The allocation would be used to implement the General Practitioner contracting project, for which the NDOH has received and approved a business plan.
7. The conversion will comprise of a shift of R2 452 780 from the NHI component of the NHG (Schedule 6A) to the NHI grant (Schedule 5A).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

8. The following matters in relation to the local government sphere, are covered in this memorandum and the proposed *Government Gazette*:

Adjustment allocations for new allocations, re-allocations, roll-overs, additional funds and the technical movement of allocations between Schedules of the 2013 Division of Revenue Amendment Act.

Re-allocation of funds between municipalities

9. The Neighbourhood Development Partnership Grant is being re-allocated to other municipalities due to non-performance of the grant allocation. These funds will be re-allocated to municipalities that have fast tracked the implementation of the projects and have accelerated expenditure against the original allocation.
10. The national Department of Energy is re-allocating funds between municipalities, under the Integrated National Electrification Programme (INEP 5) and Electricity Demand Side Management Grant. Slow spending and delays in contractual agreements, poor business plans and non compliance by municipalities are the main reasons for the decision to re-allocate between municipalities.
11. The Public Transport Infrastructure Grant is being re-allocated to municipalities that have accelerated expenditure against their current allocation. The main reason for re-allocation is due to municipalities indicating that they would not be able to spend their full or portion of the allocation for the 2013/13 financial year.
12. The Water Services Operating Subsidy Grant is being re-allocated to other municipalities because of poor performance against the allocation.
13. The Infrastructure Skills Development Grant (ISDG) is being re-allocated between municipalities because of the anticipated under-spending against the programme and the funds are being allocated to other municipalities that can spend.
14. The Municipal Water Infrastructure Grant is also re-allocating funds in order to shift the funding from municipalities that are not water service authorities to those municipalities which are water service authorities.

Unallocated funds

15. An amount of R57 million is scheduled to be transferred from an unallocated 2013 Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) championship from a total allocation of R120 million. The purpose of the grant is to assist host cities with the operational responsibilities associated with hosting 2014 Africa Cup of Nations Championship.

Roll-over of funds

16. Equitable Share: a roll-over amount of R13.2 million was approved as the result of funds not being transferred to Bela Bela Municipality and Bojanala Platinum District Municipality during the 2012/13 financial year.

17. **Municipal Infrastructure Grant:** A roll-over of R2.4 million was approved as the result of funds not being transferred to Bela Bela Municipality during the 2012/13 financial year.
18. **Regional Bulk Infrastructure Grant:** A roll-over of R58 million was approved as a result of funds committed to projects in 2012/13. This is an indirect grant through which is used by the national Department of Water Affairs to build bulk water supply systems that cut cross municipal boundaries on behalf of municipalities.
19. **Expanded Public Works Programme Integrated Grant:** A roll-over of R600 thousand was approved as the result of funds not being transferred during 2012/13 financial year.
20. The Department of Human Settlement also roll-over an amount of R100.5 million for the Rural Households Infrastructure Grant as an in-kind allocation for eradication of rural water and sanitation backlogs.

New conditional grant

21. The adjustment provides for a new programme namely the Municipal Disaster Recovery Grant and is scheduled to transfer to municipalities an amount of R118 million in the 2013/14 financial year. These funds are allocated to rehabilitate and construct municipal infrastructure damages caused by disasters.
22. A summarised breakdown of the 2013 adjusted allocations to local government is listed below:
