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### 1. STRATEGIC OVERVIEW OF INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMME FOR 2006/07 MTEF

#### Strategic Departmental Objectives

The purpose of this programme is to plan, provide and equip new facilities/assets, upgrade and rehabilitate community health centres, clinics, district, provincial, specialised and academic hospitals, and other health-related facilities and maintain community health centres, clinics, district, provincial, specialised and academic hospitals, and other health-related facilities.

Health Facilities Management developed its plans for the MTEF from the platform created by the department's strategic goals, specifically Strategic Goal 3: Strengthen the district health system and provide caring, responsive and quality health services at all levels and Strategic Goal 6: Operate smarter and invest in health technology, communication and information management systems.

Priority activities and key actions identified to achieve these objectives are to implement a capital redevelopment programme. The funding from the Hospital Revitalisation Grant will be used to refurbish and revitalise identified hospitals. Processes to provide needed equipment to health facilities must be improved and an equipment management strategy must be developed.

### 2. REVIEW OF THE 2005/06 INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMME

The programme to build 10 new clinics in the next 5 years is on track. These clinics are in Soshanguve, Eersterus, Orange Farm (Bristlecone Clinic), Eldorado Park, Randfontein, Atteridgeville (Bophelong Clinic), Evaton (Johan Deo Clinic), Orlando (Mandela Sisulu Clinic), Boikhutsong and Cullinan. Mobile facilities will be replaced where necessary with fixed or satellite clinics in order to provide basic health care to communities in underserved areas.

Delivery of the Soshanguve Clinic took place in May 2005 and the planning of the Eersterus Clinic is at an advanced stage. We are awaiting registration of the township and township bulk services in Orange Farm while a project implementation plan has been received in respect of Eldorado Park. The geotechnical survey of the Randfontein site has been undertaken; Bophelong is currently being planned and the project implementation plan for the Johan Deo Clinic has been approved. Planning of the Mandela Sisulu Clinic is progressing well and a project implementation plan is expected shortly. The scope of work for Boikhutsong has been finalised and Cullinan has been planned and is in the final stage of approval.

A specialist business consultant was appointed to prepare and submit business cases on behalf of this department in respect of revitalisation projects. Business cases were submitted for Chris Hani Baragwanath (CHB) Level 1 Hospital (Lilian Ngoyi), Zola Level 1 Hospital (300 beds) and Nataalspruit Hospital (760 beds) to replace the existing Nataalspruit Hospital under risk due to dolomite conditions on the site.

Business cases were also submitted for Germiston Hospital (closely aligned with the Nataalspruit Hospital revitalisation as services will be shared between the two hospitals), Daveyton Hospital (where there are currently no hospital facilities), Tembisa and Sebokeng Hospitals (where projects are currently underway but funded through provincial and national infrastructure grant funding).

Formal approval has been received in respect of the business cases already submitted for Chris Hani Baragwanath / CHB Level 1 Hospital (Lilian Ngoyi), Zola, Natalspruit, Germiston and Daveyton while approval is awaited for Tembisa and Sebokeng to be included in the revitalisation programme.

### **Key Outcomes to be achieved for the 2005/06 financial year**

#### **Capital projects**

Initiatives have been put in place to increase the pace of capital expenditure to address the need for upgraded and increased capital infrastructure:

- Appointment of the Project Management Resource Group (PMRG) by the Department of Public Transport, Roads and Works (DPTRW) has increased capacity in order to monitor, manage and expedite capital projects on site;
- Alignment of the Department of Health projects and priorities with DPTRW project lists and cash flow projections. A number of meetings have been held in this regard and regular meetings are held between the Chief Financial Office, Deputy Director-General, project managers and the Executive Support Programme Manager of the respective departments. An Indaba between the respective Heads of Departments and officials was held on 14 September 2005;
- Appointment of dedicated project managers for each Revitalisation project in order to strengthen the capacity to manage, monitor and expedite projects in conjunction with DPTRW is underway;
- An early warning system has been implemented as part of the routine reporting by institutions in order to identify problems on site at an early stage;
- Flagship projects have been identified which will merit special attention by both departments;
- The Service Level Agreement (SLA) has been circulated to all health institutions and final comments have been received and incorporated as needed. A consultant has been appointed by DPTRW to finalise the agreement and submit the SLA to both departments for signature;
- Closer cooperation and communication with institutional Facility Management Units (FMU's) has been implemented in respect of planning to finalise user requirements before a brief, requirements and schedule of accommodation is conveyed to DPTRW;
- Projects that can be initiated at short notice will be planned to tender documentation stage if cash flow trends demand expedited expenditure;
- Projects have been initiated to exceed the budgeted amount in order to allow for delays or under expenditure. A target budget for 2005/06 has been agreed. Projects have been planned to document stage and "stockpiled" for execution at short notice to address under expenditure. Projects for the 2006/07 financial year have already been conveyed to DPTRW;
- Reporting formats have been aligned between Health and DPTRW in order to facilitate monitoring, cash flow projections and reporting.

Voted capital funds will be expended in accordance with priorities within the financial year in which they are allocated.

#### **Revitalisation projects**

Outstanding business cases for identified revitalisation projects have been finalised and approval obtained from the National Department of Health and National Treasury.

#### **Maintenance & minor new work projects**

The key focus will be to prioritise and manage maintenance and minor new work projects and devolve the maintenance budget to 4 additional pilot sites and one Region in respect of the Clinic maintenance programme. Progress on site must be monitored and institutional and regional FMU staff must be supported, assisted and trained. It is envisaged to finalise procedures and protocols for FMU's and establish regional and institutional FMU capacity as necessary. Expenditure trends will be monitored to ensure expenditure is in accordance with cash flow projections and corrective action will be instituted to ensure completion of projects in accordance with planning and to meet budget targets.

#### **Equipment**

The key priority will be to finalise the provincial equipment priority list and equip the new Pretoria Academic Hospital in order to commission the hospital during the financial year.

#### **Maintenance Review**

Period contracts are in place in 85 percent of institutions while the Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) special project is progressing well. A project has been commenced to ensure that pharmacies comply with legislative requirements and the same process is being followed in respect of waste management at facilities. The strategic plan has been reviewed and the Pretoria Academic Hospital emergency generator and disparities addressed.

#### **Revitalisation Overview**

- 3 business cases were finalized and presented to National Health for consideration;
- The Provincial overview and analysis and priority list has been agreed upon;
- A model for equipment needs for Level 1 & 2 hospitals was developed;
- At CHBH the Hand Unit project was started, stores completed and the relocation of areas to be demolished is 95 percent complete.

#### **Land and Site Issues resolved**

An audit on state houses was conducted and a RFI on state houses requested; 15 contracts were renewed and the contract at Johan Fotheringham cancelled. The contract was finalized for Hugh Solomon building as well as Curlitzia contract and 6 cafeteria contracts.

### **3. OUTLOOK FOR 2006/07 MTEF INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMME**

It is one of the stated goals of the Gauteng Health Department to provide the correct number and level of beds within the province to best serve the population reliant on public health services. This must be done within the limits of affordability as determined by the funding allocation.

The provision of beds is clearly guided by the Primary Health Care (PHC) approach to service delivery and the provision of generalist level 1 beds is of paramount importance. Coupled with this will be a consolidation of level 2 (general specialist) beds within existing facilities and the consolidation of subspecialist units in order to eliminate duplication of expensive tertiary services. This will also be accompanied by a reduction in level 3 (tertiary or sub-specialist) beds in line with national guidelines for the provision of the various bed types to serve the population.

It is not possible to easily distinguish between level 1 and level 2 patients in existing hospitals. Each level of care has a differentiated patient day cost and separation of the levels of care into appropriate facilities will ensure a more affordable health care system. In order to achieve this objective it is necessary to provide adequate level 1 beds and that new level 1 bed hospitals are built. At the same time the tertiary services will need to be rationalized and patients shifted from the tertiary (level 3) to secondary (level 2) and primary (level 1) beds.

### Needs Analysis

Based on an analysis of the Service Improvement Plan and an evaluation of identified needs in terms of the revitalisation grant funding, a further analysis of Gauteng Province health needs was undertaken. The analysis used the 1995 census figures and updated the data to include the 2001 census and projected the need forward to 2014. The revised need analysis confirms the initial assumptions as contained in the departmental strategic position statement and the service improvement plan. The infrastructure plan is aligned with both the above and seeks to provide facilities in support of the plan.

In order to reach the goals as set out in the departmental strategic position statement and the service improvement plan, it is necessary to improve PHC services, increase the number of district hospital beds and reduce expensive tertiary and to a lesser extent secondary beds and services. To this end, it is envisaged to reduce the bed numbers at Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital from 2,800 to 1,510 by providing four district hospitals of 300 beds each to serve as district referral centres for CHB. This initiative is a key component of the revitalisation project.

## Needs Analysis

### Maintenance

The Budget for 2005/06 is inadequate to maintain period contracts. As a result, the cost for maintaining facilities is escalating forward. Insufficient funding will have an impact on the planned and preventative maintenance measures and implementation. A backlog in maintenance from previous years already exists over and above the need to maintain new facilities that have been built.

The planned strategic outputs for the MTEF period are aimed at:

- Maintaining existing facilities
- Maintaining facilities through period contracts
- Maintaining new facilities

The implication for the department as a result of inadequate funding is:

- Deterioration of facilities
- Non compliance to the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Act and other legislative requirements
- Unforeseen mechanical breakdowns can compromise services
