1. STRATEGIC OVERVIEW OF INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMME FOR 2009 MTEF

Strategic Objectives

The Gauteng Department of Health (GDoH) is responsible for implementing policies and programmes that focus, inter alia, on increasing access to primary health care (PHC), hospital revitalisation, organisational development and resource management. To this end, significant investments have been made in developing and maintaining infrastructure in order to ensure appropriate access to health facilities, thus enabling GDoH to undertake its primary function of providing health care services. Management of infrastructure, which includes facilities such as hospitals, clinics, community health centres (CHCs), laboratories, laundries and mortuaries, encompasses the provision of new buildings and preserving the value of existing facilities by addressing life-cycle costs. This involves appropriate maintenance and the renewal of infrastructure.

GDoH facilities have been constructed over a period of more than 100 years, and hence are in different stages of the life-cycle, with conditions ranging from very good to very poor. This obliges the department to ensure that new and existing infrastructure can fully support continuous operation and service delivery in the critical care environment.

The GDoH infrastructure delivery programme involves planning, providing and equipping new facilities, and upgrading and rehabilitating CHCs, clinics, and district, provincial, specialised and academic hospitals and other health facilities in line with the principles of the Infrastructure Delivery Improvement Programme (IDIP) and the Government-wide Immovable Asset Management Act (GIAMA). This requires life-cycle management of immovable assets through the maintenance of all health facilities.

The infrastructure delivery programme complies with financial and non-financial regulatory requirements, such as the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA), Division of Revenue Act (DoRA) and Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP), as well as newly introduced requirements such as the Pharmaceutical Act. Planning for facilities is geared towards ensuring that service provision covers all areas where there is none at present.

2. REVIEW OF THE 2008/09 FINANCIAL YEAR

GDoH projects undertaken in the 2008/9 financial year were in line with national priorities, as reflected in the Hospital Revitalisation Grant and the Infrastructure Grant to Provinces (IGP), and with provincial priorities, notably the improvement of emergency medical service (EMS) facilities, the upgrading of various psychiatric hospitals, and critical maintenance projects. One-hundred and twenty capital projects were implemented in the 2008/09 financial year, of which 30 were in varying stages of construction. Projects included revitalisation of five hospitals (Mamelodi, Zola, Germiston, New Nataalspruit and Chris Hani Baragwanath), and building of regional pharmacies, CHCs and mortuaries. There were also 58 projects at the design stage, including 32 new clinics and the upgrading of existing clinics. Of the eight revitalisation projects, Mamelodi and Chris Hani Baragwanath are scheduled for completion in 2008/09, together with two CHCs and one mortuary.

Over the 2008/09 financial year, there were 68 rehabilitation/upgrading projects intended to enable health facilities to comply with legislative requirements and sector norms. Over the same period, maintenance was undertaken in 34 hospitals, 22 CHCs, four regional pharmacies, nine nursing colleges and four laundries. Also during the financial year, statutory maintenance was undertaken, with preventive maintenance being put on hold due to funding constraints.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

Capital works undertaken by GDoH can be categorised as follows:

Hospital Revitalisation projects

The Hospital Revitalisation Grant addresses the backlogs in hospital infrastructure and aims to improve the overall condition of health institutions. While it was initially meant to deal with the massive replacement costs for dilapidated infrastructure, its scope was broadened to include health technology, organisational development and quality assurance.

There are currently five approved and funded hospitals at various stages of construction under the Hospital Revitalisation Grant. During the 2008/09 financial year, the emphasis was on the completion and equipping of Mamelodi Hospital and of Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital's Accident, Emergency and Trauma (AE&T), Radiology, Pharmacy and Out-patient departments. Construction is ongoing at Nataalspruit, where work began on three floors with all structural elements (columns, beams, slabs) in place. The same progress was achieved at Germiston Hospital. There have been delays at Zola Hospital arising from revised contractual arrangements that saw the appointment of a new contractor to undertake construction.

Projects approved for subsequent years include work at Lillian Ngoyi, Daveyton, Tembisa, Protea and Sebokeng hospitals.

Infrastructure Grant to Provinces (IGP) projects

During the 2008/09 financial year, 19 projects were funded from this grant, of which eight are on-going, having commenced in previous financial years. The remaining eleven are new projects initiated in the current financial year. The on-going projects consist of three CHCs, upgrades of pharmacies and wards, and conversion of a boiler house into a store, all of which were scheduled for completion by the end of the financial year.

New projects consisted of nine new clinics (Alexandra, Vlakfontein, Matoleville, Grasmere, Diepsloot, Cosmo City, Braamfischerville, Boitumelo and Steve Biko), three CHCs and extension of three clinics to CHCs. Identification, deciding on feasibility, design and tendering were undertaken early in the financial year, with construction beginning in the latter part of 2008/09. During the same period, upgrades to Tshwane District Hospital (converting cubicles into wards) and construction of the new Hillbrow regional pharmacy were also undertaken.

Provincial Equitable Share

During 2008/09, 98 projects were funded from this source, of which 26 were on-going from previous financial years. They consisted of administration and student facilities at Ann Latsky College, refurbishment of pharmacies, upgrading of lifts, intensive care unit (ICU) renovations and domestic water reticulation. Of the 72 projects initiated during 2008/09, the majority were identified as maintenance work but some were converted to capital projects due to the wide scope of work required. These projects included upgrading of main kitchens, replacement of chimney stacks and grit collectors, repairs to and painting of roofs, replacement of gutters, electrical upgrading (replacement of generators, upgrading of High Tension (HT) switchgear), upgrading of



sewer and steam reticulation, sprinkler systems, air-compressors, and chilling plants. The purpose of these works was to enhance the functionality of health facilities in the province.

Construction is still to be completed at Eersterus CHC, Mandela-Sisulu CHC, Phedisong 4 Clinic, Ga-Rankuwa View Clinic and Dark City Clinic, as will upgrading of wards, OPDs, accident and emergency Units, ICUs, pharmacies, medical gas and sewer and water reticulation at nine health facilities. These are Tshwane, South Rand, Jubilee, and Pretoria West District Hospitals, Leratong Regional Hospital, Weskoppies Psychiatric Hospital, East Rand TB Hospital, Pretoria Regional Pharmacy and Masakhane Laundry.

Public Private Partnership (PPP) - reconstruction, revitalisation and upgrading of Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital

The new Chris Hani Baragwanath (CHB) Hospital will be a referral hospital for Level II and III patients, and will also cater for acute psychiatry. The Updated Needs Statement for the Soweto region indicates a total bed requirement of 1 769 for the CHB Hospital, which will serve a population of 3.7 million; and 1 634 Level I beds (5 district hospitals) for the region to serve a population of 2.1 million. During 2008/09, a feasibility study report was completed and the project registered with the National Treasury. GDoH and Gauteng Treasury have committed upfront funding for the project to start in the outer years of the 2009 MTEF, and there has been an application for treasury approval.

The table above shows that the budgetary allocation for infrastructure over the 2009 MTEF amounts to R5.729 billion, of which R3.452 billion is dedicated to new infrastructure. Under existing infrastructure assets, a distinction is made between maintenance and repair, upgrading and additions, and rehabilitation and refurbishment of existing facilities, for which R1.582 billion, R131.144 million and R563.964 million respectively are allocated over the 2009 MTEF.

New Construction

New construction accounts for the bulk of the allocation under this programme. There are 23 new projects to be implemented over the 2009 MTEF period, which include one academic hospital, two regional hospitals and five district hospitals, as well as four new clinics, four new CHCs and one new regional pharmacy. In addition, the Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital PPP project will be implemented as from the 2010/11 financial year. During the 2009 MTEF period, the hospitals being constructed under the Hospital Revitalisation Grant will be equipped. In the 2009/10 financial year, 16 projects will be undertaken. These include the continuation of construction at Germiston, Nataalspruit and Zola hospitals. Construction will commence at Braamfischerville clinic, and at



Boikhutsong, Ratanda and Sunnyside CHCs. A new regional pharmacy at Hillbrow will also be under construction as from 2009/10.

Planning for Tembisa and Protea Hospitals will commence, while outstanding business cases for identified revitalisation projects will be finalised and submitted to the National Department of Health for approval. These business cases are at advanced developmental stage for Level 1 hospitals in Ennerdale/Orange Farm (300 bed), Lenasia South (200 bed) and Diepsloot (300 bed).

Upgrading and Additions

There are 13 projects to be undertaken over the 2009 MTEF period. Nine of these will be implemented in the 2009/10 financial year, encompassing extensions to Atteridgeville, KT Matubatse, Nellmapius and Rethabiseng clinics, and Lilian Ngoyi, Esangweni and Midvaal CHCs. Upgrading works will also continue at Tshwane District Hospital and the Oncology unit at Steve Biko Academic Hospital.

Rehabilitation and Refurbishment

In this category, there are thirty-seven projects to be undertaken over the 2009 MTEF period. Thirty projects will be implemented in the 2009/10 financial year. These can be described as critical maintenance, and include the rehabilitation of lifts, emergency generators, steam boilers and uninterrupted power supply (UPS) for intensive care and high care units at various hospitals. Major refurbishment projects include sewer lines, renovation of wards, electrical reticulation and drainage systems and fire prevention systems. These will be undertaken at Sebokeng, Dr. George Mukhari, Leratong, Kalafong, Weskoppies and Jubilee hospitals. Equipment will be replaced at Masakhane Laundry. Four new anti-retroviral (ART) sites are being refurbished at Phola Park clinic, Bekkersdal CHC, Devon Clinic and Tembisa Health Centre.

MAINTENANCE OUTLOOK

The available budget only caters for statutory, condition-based and routine maintenance – which would be adversely affected in case of emergency maintenance works. However, if preventative maintenance is not done it accumulates over time and leads to deteriorating facilities. Some urgent preventative maintenance has been capitalised under the equitable share, but this is not enough to deal with all requirements.

The initiatives taken by the GDoH Facility Management Directorate through the Government-wide Immovable Asset Management Act are intended to ensure that assets retain their capacity to support service delivery and that the capital invested in the assets is maintained consistent with age and market value. It is expected that existing facilities will be restored to an acceptable level and maintained at that standard.

Other benefits will include the most productive application of funds through the establishment of priorities for maintenance based on service delivery requirements and risk analysis. In addition, a rational and systematic approach to performance management will facilitate the establishment and development of performance measures.

Gauteng health institutions have a unique opportunity to make quality maintenance an issue in the delivery of health services, showing leadership in the implementation of strategic asset plans and linking assets to service delivery objectives.

Government-wide Immovable Asset Management Act

Government policy in South Africa has increasingly focused on balancing requirements for new infrastructure with the need for sustainability. National Treasury prepared the Asset Guidelines for national and provincial spheres of government in order to achieve this and in November 2007, the Government-wide Immovable Asset Management Act (GIAMA) was legislated. This act prescribes the need for public entities to prepare Asset Management Plans for immovable assets focused primarily but not exclusively on accommodation. The Act requires users and custodians to prepare a User Immovable Asset Management Plan (UIAMP) and a Custodian Immovable Asset Management Plan (CIAMP) respectively.

The minimum contents of the UIAMP are:

- A strategic needs assessment to ensure that accommodation needs are aligned to the strategic intent of the user
- An acquisition plan for required accommodation
- An operations plan for maintenance



- A surrender plan for assets that are no longer necessary or that no longer serve the needs of the user

Ways to Address Maintenance Budget per Institution

Many of our buildings are in a state of serious neglect, reflecting on building maintenance practices. Because it is difficult to quantify the cost of neglect and because of the general belief that preventative maintenance can easily be postponed until budget constraints may be less tight, maintenance work has always tended to be subjected to budget cuts. The problem is that budget constraints seldom relax, and insufficient funds force maintenance managers to do only day-to-day, ad hoc or emergency maintenance. This type of maintenance is disruptive and ineffective.

A further reason why maintenance budget allocations are insufficient is the lack of accurate and current information on building conditions. This is being addressed through the Government-wide Immovable Asset Management Act.

Life Cycle Asset Management

Full life-cycle asset management includes the entire process from pre-planning, through tendering, design, construction, maintenance and disposal or surrender. It is clear that this method of asset management can span the fifty years or more of the life cycle of a building. When the maintenance plan is followed to the correct level of detail, all services and replacements of components of the building are anticipated in advance and hence the budget is planned for the entire lifespan of the asset. As long as the manufacturer's specified maintenance routine is adhered to, the asset will perform its function as required for at least the full length of the expected useful life (EUL).

Failure to adhere to the maintenance routine will result in a shortening of the life cycle performance of the asset due to premature failure. The time period between a date after the acquisition of the asset and the end of the EUL, known as the remaining useful life, can be assessed in relation to the condition of the asset at any given point in time. Life-cycle asset management stresses the importance of following the recommended maintenance routine. The cost of regular maintenance is much lower when compared with ad-hoc, reactionary or day-to-day maintenance, which often results in the premature replacement of the asset.
