1 Overview

1.1 Vision

A sustainable agricultural sector, rural livelihoods and food security for all.

1.2 Mission

To improve agricultural production to stimulate economic development, food security and integrated rural development through:

- Agrarian reform;
- Targeted support to farmers;
- Commercialization and transformation of the agriculture sector;
- Innovation, research, technology development and transfer;
- Facilitating partnerships;
- Sustainable livelihoods; and
- Access to opportunities for youth, women and other vulnerable groups.

1.3 Core functions and responsibilities

The core functions of the department are driven by the following targeted outcomes which emanate from the departmental Strategic Plan 2020 - 25.

- Growing sustainable agricultural value chains,
- Improved food and nutritional security for all,
- Integrated rural development,
- Improved corporate governance.

The department seeks to achieve the above outcomes by pursing the following responsibilities:

- Provide agricultural support services to farmers in order to ensure sustainable development and management of agricultural resources.
- Provide support to farmers through agricultural development programmes focusing on animal and crop production.

- Provide veterinary services to clients in order to ensure healthy animals, safe animal products and wellbeing of animals and the public.
- Provide expert and needs based research, development and technology transfer impacting on development objectives.
- Provide timely and relevant agricultural economic services to ensure equitable participation in the economy.
- Facilitate and provide structured and vocational agriculture, education and training in order to establish a knowledgeable, prosperous and competitive sector.
- Coordinate and facilitate development programmes by stakeholders in rural areas.
- Manage and formulate policy directives and priorities and, to ensure there is appropriate support service to all other programmes with regard to finance, personnel, information, communication and procurement.

1.4 Main Services

- Supporting and promoting enterprise development in rural areas using Eastern Cape Rural Development Agency (ECRDA) as the implementing agent for High Impact Projects (HIPs) which provide high returns on investment;
- Rural Development facilitation and coordination which is planning and alignment of rural development activities, promotion of social facilitation, initiating capacity building programmes, support of rural business and non-farm rural activities, increased rural participation and social mobilisation and attracting rural investments and partnerships, referrals, monitoring, evaluation and reporting;
- Creating short term jobs (agricultural infrastructure) through the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) Integrated Grant for Provinces and the Comprehensive Agricultural Support Programme (CASP) conditional grant;
- Increasing crop production and improving production;
- Applying technologically advanced diagnostic procedures for diagnosis and research on animal diseases of economic importance to the province and zoonotic diseases that may pose a risk to human health;
- Supporting human capital development initiatives in order to boost skills in the agricultural sector in the province through the implementation of the Agriculture Education and Training Sector Strategy;
- Expanding on the research support to commercial and emerging farmers to boost productivity and enhance access to marketing services; and
- Providing agricultural training to commercial farmers, emerging farmers, agricultural students and people residing in rural areas.

1.5 Demands for and expected changes in the services

The province continues with its focus of being the primary producer of agricultural products in order to make the Eastern Cape a food basket of the country given its agricultural potential. However, the province is unable to attract the investment required to fully utilise the natural resources that will allow the province to produce a variety of high value commodities. Currently, the contribution of the agricultural sector to the provincial Gross Domestic Product (GDP) currently stands at a very low 1.7 per cent which demonstrate the need for an aggressive approach and interventions by the department to address poor performance of the sector.

In addition, the migration of young active people from the province to areas of higher economic activity such as Gauteng and Western Cape results in insignificant increase of the provincial population, and the net effect of the stagnant population growth is a reduction of budget allocation for the province and the department thereof. To overcome these challenges of, the following is needed;

- Support farmers with incentive grants and infrastructure to enable them to engage industry and commercial partners to leverage investment, agri-business acumen, capacitation and market access to increase the competitiveness and levels of sustainable commercial agri-business.
- Enable farmers the opportunity to develop business networks and business skills wherein they can manage their own development and economic growth while mitigating risks.
- Provide funding opportunities through blended finance and syndicated funding involving development and commercial financing institutions.

Cannabis is prioritized as a potentially new industrial crop that the province can exploit to increase the growth and employment of rural communities. In this regard the department will explore development of cannabis as a potentially new sub-sector in agriculture through breeding, selection and development of cultivars within existing local hemp and cannabis populations for fibre, seed-oil, cannabinoid (CBD) or tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) levels.

Furthermore, agronomic trials and optimization of yield and income at farmer's level; Cannabis regulations so that hemp products are able to be sold and commercialized in collaboration with SAPS and Department of Health (DoH); as well as development of local and international markets to secure off-take and distribution agreements for cannabis primary and bi-products.

1.6 The Acts, rules and regulations

The key mandate of the department is derived from Schedules 4 and Section 25 of the Constitution. There are a number of Acts that have been promulgated to further support the department's constitutional mandate. Agricultural Pests Act of (1983), Agricultural Research Amendment Act of (2001), Animal Diseases Act of (1984), Animal Improvement Act of (1998), Animal Protection Act of (1962), Basic Conditions of Employment Act of (1997), Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, Act 108 of (1996), Conservation of Agricultural Resources Act of (1983), Division of Revenue Act of (2009), Eastern Cape Rural Finance Corporation, Act 1 of (2012) Act No. 9 of 1999 as amended by Act of (2012), Fencing Act of (1963), Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act of (1947), Livestock Improvement Act of (1997), Marketing of Agricultural Products Act of (1996).

1.7 Budget decisions

The department implemented baseline budget reductions both on Equitable share and Conditional grants, and these were effected mainly on Payments for Capital assets, and Goods and Services.

In order to increase the number of veterinary doctors produced in South Africa, the department has committed to support the University of Fort Hare in its bid to establish a Veterinary Sciences School within the University's faculty of agriculture, and as such funds have been reprioritised over the 2020 MTEF.

The department reprioritised funds to the Eastern Cape Rural Development Agency to cover operations at Magwa and Majola Tea Estates, as well as supporting the Rural Enterprise Development (RED) Hubs that are focusing on maize production, processing, marketing and distribution through the development and support to co-operative organisations.

In an effort to develop cannabis industry in the province, the department will through ECRDA support the identified 32 farmers to obtain permits for processing hemp, also provide awareness campaigns, training and development, storage facilities, market access, analytical services, research site and establishment of sites. As well as, funds to cover shortfalls experienced between the cost of production and the sales revenue derived from tea, for Magwa and Majola Tea Estates.

In light of the severe drought conditions that has affected the province, the department allocated funds for livestock water supply development within the infrastructure budget, comprising of dam scooping, borehole development, and fodder production, which will assist both crop and livestock production.

Furthermore funds have been reprioritised from expected attritions and non-core items to fund critical posts to be filled in 2020/21.

1.8 Aligning departmental budgets to achieve government's prescribed outcomes

The department has aligned its programmes and budget to achieve the National Development Plan (NDP) vision of making rural areas spatially, socially and economically well integrated across municipal, district and regional boundaries – where residents have economic growth, food security and jobs and as a result agrarian transformation and infrastructure development programmes, and have improved access to basic services, health care and quality education. By 2030 agriculture is expected to create close to 1 million jobs contributing significantly to reducing overall unemployment.

In line with the NDP, the provincial development plan has developed five goals to guide its implementation of the NDP; they are as follows: an inclusive equitable growing economy for the province; An educated, innovative and empowered citizenry; a healthy population; vibrant equitable enabled communities; capable agency across government and other institutional partners committed to the development of the province. These goals will be pursued with the focus on the rural development with specific emphasis in Ilima Labantu as an agricultural development initiative that aims to revive rural economy and encourage other areas of development in the province.

The policy approach of the department is guided by the priorities of outcome 7 (vibrant, equitable, sustainable rural communities contributing towards food security for all).

2 Review of the current financial year (2019/20)

2.1 Key achievements

The department continues to implement the Agricultural Economic Transformation Strategy, and success factors have begun to show results especially in high value crops harvesting, that is, crop yields and seasonal jobs created. In terms of maize, the Eastern Cape is a small player in the industry as it contributes less than 1 per cent to the National production of maize, and for the period under review it contributed only 0.97 per cent.

The province experienced a severe drought resulting from climatic changes that contributed significantly to the lower than expected yields, negatively affecting the Eastern Cape's maize production. However, planting continued in some areas within the short-planting season covering a total area of 18 656 ha across the province, against a planned target of 31 294 ha. Grain production was implemented in partnership with Whip-hold and Grain Farmer Development Association (GFADA).

In addition, to mitigate the negative effects of drought in livestock production, 480 ha of lucerne were planted in Chris Hani and Sarah Baartman, while 650 ha of winter grazing oats and barley were planted in Chris Hani and Joe Gqabi benefiting 109 farmers. Furthermore, in response to the drought conditions that experienced during the 2019/20 production season, the department provided drought relief mitigation support in the form of 4 496 tons of Lucerne hay, 1,098 tons maize and 4 167 lick blocks, and 22 595 beneficiaries received livestock feed.

With regards to rural development coordination the Magwa and Majola Tea Estate planted 1 516 ha producing 624 tons of tea during the recent harvesting. Extensive repair work to the factory, machinery, equipment, vehicles and staff accommodation has been undertaken during the period. New teabag machine has been purchased with a capacity to process approximately 15 360 kg of tea into teabags on a two shift labour basis. To take advantage of the economic potential available for agriculture, agro-processing and tourism in the rural areas of the Eastern Cape. A Rural Development and Investment Indaba was held in January 2020.

In addition, the department through ECRDA continued to support the 5 Rural Enterprise Development (RED) hubs in Mqanduli, Ncora, Emalahleni, Mbizana focusing on maize production, processing, marketing and distribution through the development and support to co-operative organisations, and Tshabo Flora Red hub which focuses on flora production. The entity continues to maintain market linkages with SPAR Eastern Cape by supplying 12 supermarkets and Umtiza Farmers' Cooperative. This initiative has since created a total of 79 permanent jobs and supported by 38 primary cooperatives.

The department continued to support 31 black citrus farmers with production inputs in Amathole and Sara Baartman district. To ensure that the value of the citrus production in the Amathole district meets international standards, the department supported 3 groups of smallholder citrus farmers through a government established pack shed (Ripplemead) in the Amathole district, creating 140 permanent jobs and 980 seasonal jobs.

In support of commercialization of livestock, 56 002 slaughter sheep were exported to the United Arab Emirates. The package of export products included amongst others; 52.6 tons of chilled lamb and 4.4 tons of chilled beef exported, 79.5 tons of chilled beef exported to Jordan, 7 500 live cattle and 3 248 sheep exported to Mauritius, 1500 dairy cattle exported to various African countries, 300 000 bales of wool to China, India and Egypt, and this opportunity created jobs for 1 000.

The Department vaccinated cattle against Anthrax and Quarter Evil, whereby 1 073 661 cattle were vaccinated. The major achievement during the first quarter was SANAS accreditation of the Grahamstown Veterinary Laboratory, a recognition that the Department struggled to attain over a number of years. The Accreditation Certificate for Grahamstown Veterinary Laboratory was received from SANAS on 12th June 2019. This means that, once the antigen is received from National Labs, testing for Controlled Diseases will resume, which will greatly reduce Under Performance in this area.

The success of primary production depends on the availability of the suitable on-farm infrastructure to this end 104. 4 km's of fencing and 4 storage sheds were completed to support grain infrastructure, and to support the production of the macadamia nut the irrigation water pipes and pump have been installed, and feeder dam completed. In addition, 5 handling facilities, 5 stock water dams, 20 diptanks, 15 km of fencing and 3 shearing sheds were provided in support of livestock Infrastructure. Furthermore, fencing at Chris Hani covering 8 kilometres was completed for horticultural projects.

Land degradation is one of the most significant environmental treats, through the land care programme, 2 853 ha of grazing and arable land was rehabilitated, against a target of 3 681 ha. This benefited 754 land users, created 568 green jobs and completion of 38 farm plans. A total of 1 704 beneficiaries adopting/ practicing sustainable production technologies and practices for improved livelihoods. Furthermore, to promote climate smart and conservation agriculture the department procured 86 weather station equipment to conduct constant surveillance of the weather conditions. In order to ensure value for money in data utilization, provincial strategic institutions have been engaged.

To upscale youth programmes and skills development 473 students were registered at the departments agricultural colleges - TARDI and Fort Cox, with 129 expected to graduate in the fields of Animal and Crop Production, Agribusiness, Forestry and Animal Health. With regards to youth in agriculture the department has trained 244 (72 males and 172 females) out-of-school-youth on a 8 month learnership program on animal and crop production, and 118 (62 females and 56 males) unemployed graduates were placed in commercial farms. Furthermore, 2 097 (996 males and 1 101 females) participants were trained in primary production and entrepreneurial skills. This included 111 (80 males and 31 females) farm workers.

2.2 Key challenges

Disaster drought conditions declared during the quarter impacted service delivery in relation to production of agricultural products, especially dryland cropping and extensive livestock production. The total area affected in the province is 20.5 per cent, with Amathole, Chris Hani, Sarah Baartman, and OR Tambo being the worst affected areas.

3 Outlook for the coming financial year (2020/21)

The department is committed to promoting and supporting commodity value chain investments to increase productivity and competitiveness. Black producers will be supported to increase production and competitiveness in citrus fruit, deciduous fruit, macadamia nut, subtropical fruit, commercial grain production (in identified corridors), and in 2020/21 a total of 29 000 ha will be under production. In addition,

30 000 vulnerable households for food and nutrition security will be supported to increase food production by provision of agricultural inputs coupled with technical extension advice. Furthermore, through ECRDA 25 agro-processing facilities will be supported and 100 per cent RED hubs will be functioning optimally by 2025, and farmer owned mechanization centres will be established in each district to reduce cost of production.

In an effort to develop cannabis industry in the province, the department will through ECRDA support the identified 32 farmers to obtain permits for processing hemp, also provide awareness campaigns, training and development, storage facilities, market access, analytical services, research site and establishment of sites.

The expansion of the two tea estates (Magwa and Majola) will not only see the diversification of crops including avocado, hemp and macadamia nuts, vegetables and support farmers to become agro entrepreneurs and exploit opportunities brought about Wild Coast N2. The department as part of its diversification working through CRDA will explore Eco-tourism opportunities around the tea estates.

To improve the quantity and quality of beef, mutton and wool production whilst maintaining a healthy provincial herd, the department will proactively prevent the occurrence of anthrax by vaccinating 1.2 million cattle, and for the purposes of controlling external parasites responsible tick-borne diseases, dipping of 1.2 million cattle will be carried out. In addition, a total of 3.6 million treatments will be applied to sheep for the control of sheep scab in order to improve the quality and quantity of the wool clip. Moreover, the Poultry Master Plan pronounced by the President in his State of the Nation Address (SONA, 2020) will be pursued to leverage production and export opportunities.

In order to promote marketing of livestock from rural communities/farms, the department will support the Sakhisizwe commercial feedlot benefitting 160 livestock farmers and 20 custom feeding programmes will continue to be supported.

Furthermore, an estimated 820 export control certificates will be issued for the export of animals and animal products in support of commercialisation and foreign earnings by producers. Ninety-five compliant abattoirs will be registered and monitored in order to promote food safety.

Ocean's economy is one of the less explored area of the provincial economy, the newly developed Ocean Economy Masterplan includes the aquaculture and fisheries sector. To stimulate the sector, the department will work with industry role players to increase participation of previously disadvantaged individuals, by intensifying aquaculture development through incubator initiatives for freshwater and explore potential of new candidate species in the freshwater systems. In addition, ensure that coastal communities with fishing licenses have fishing equipment to fully utilise their licenses for economic development.

In order to have a sustainable agricultural commodity value chain, on-farm infrastructure is a critical success factor, in 2020/21, the department will erect 574 kilometres of fencing in support of livestock and crop production; renovate 37 dipping facilities renovated and construct 12 new dipping facilities to support livestock production; drill 62 boreholes and equip for provision of water for stock water and irrigation; construct 31 animal handling facilities to support livestock production; 37 shearing sheds to improve wool income for smallholder and subsistence farmers, and scoop 186 earth dams for provision of livestock water.

Irrigation development and maintenance support to the existing irrigations to improve productivity at Ncorha, Qamata, Bilatye, Shiloh, Kieskamma, and Tyhefu will continue with specific emphasis on infrastructural provision. In addition, the new irrigation capacity covering river valleys - Mzimvubu (Tsitsa & Thina rivers), Msikaba, Mthentu, Mthatha, Mbashe river will be initiated with the completion of the feasibility study. In addition, the province with the assistance by the World Bank plans to improve the effectiveness of rural and agricultural development planning through better information management amongst other things, identification and prioritization of potential investment in irrigation as basis for the development of high value irrigated agriculture and improved water use efficiency.

In relation to agricultural research and development, research will focus on projects supporting climate smart agriculture, ensuing mitigation and adaptation strategies to improve agricultural production. i.e. animal science, pasture, horticulture and crop production. Areas of focus will be indigenous knowledge systems, integrated pest and diseases management systems, promotion and use of adapted breeds, cultivars and landraces, promotion of low cost bio-fertilisers etc. Also, the department developed Spatial and Planning Information Systems (SPISYS), a central repository spatial information system to enable integrated planning, project monitoring and enhance decision making in order to improve service delivery.

In addition, an agricultural Early Warning and Disaster Management Centre will be established at Dohne Agricultural Research Development Institute (ARDI) to operationalize 86 weather stations across the province. The centre will provide forecast on water resource (dam levels, river flows, temperature etc.). Moreover, possible animal and plant disease outbreaks will be monitored, efficiencies on water uses determined and strong collaboration with relevant institutions will be pursued.

To ensure self-sustainable livelihoods rural communities will be empowered to become the main agents of change for sustainable livelihood through rural development initiatives such as cooperative rural skilling in home industry; rural community training centres using polytechnic models, working with TVETs for sawmills, mining, construction and vocational skills will be explored. In addition, Good Agricultural Practises (GAP) accreditation remains one of the crucial factors limiting market access (local and international) for emerging black farmers, the department will support 10 producers to qualify for SA GAP certification.

Furthermore, the department will build capacity for youth to participate in the services component within the agriculture value chain focusing on new venture creation (agri-business services as assessors, auctioneers, facilitators, land valuers, mechanics, electricians) in order to reduce unemployment. The skills provided above will improve the marketing of rural produce through product aggregation using current marketing facilities.

In line with agricultural skills development 2 000 producers/farmers will supported with agricultural skills and 120 youth will qualify from Agricultural Colleges with agricultural qualifications. Furthermore, a targeted 75 youth will undergo an incubation program to capacitate them to form Agri-Business cooperatives using the Fort Cox Rural Wealth Creation Centre. Capacity building programmes will be implemented to support youth to venture in the services component within the agriculture value chain. A Graduate Placement Programme for 120 unemployed graduates including placement in Research stations and training institutions will be initiated and collaboration with other role-players such as industry partners and commercial farms.

4 Reprioritisation

Given the reduction of the department's budget baseline over the 2020 MTEF period through national and provincial budget cuts, which includes reduction of CASP baseline budget. The department has reprioritised its budget from non-core to core items in order to fund shortfalls in the key service delivery areas.

5 Procurement

The department continues with the multi-year cropping contracts that were awarded in 2017/18 for supply and delivery of chemicals, fertilizers and seeds. In support of Local Economic Development (LED), 30 per cent of the cropping awards have been sub-contracted to SMMEs and Co-operatives from within the province.

In sourcing mechanization services, the department developed a database of mechanization contractors that is updated annually, the department will on annual basis analyze performance of the mechanization contractors, both financial and non-financial capacity will also be assessed annually. In addition the department will then limit bidding to procure mechanization to service providers proven to perform.

Furthermore, in support of the LED the department will utilize the services of the local suppliers and cooperatives up to a ward/ municipal level. Procurement for infrastructure is done through open competitive bidding and service providers are encouraged to sub-contract to designated groups for all bids above R3 million.

Table 2 above shows the summary of departmental receipts from 2016/17 to 2022/23. There are two main sources of revenue for the department: equitable share and conditional grants. Total receipts increased from R2.184 billion in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R2.469 billion in 2019/20.

In 2020/21, total receipts decreases by 2.3 per cent to R2.411 billion, and it increases moderately over the years.

Table 3 above shows the summary of department receipts from 2016/17 to 2022/23. The department's primary source of own receipts is from the sale of goods and services other than capital assets, which relates mainly to the sale of livestock, agricultural products and veterinarian services.

Own receipts have increased from R29.160 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R38.876 million in 2019/20 due to once off surrender of surplus funds from the ECRDA and recoveries from Microsoft South Africa and South African Revenue Services (SARS) for over payment made by the department for ex-employees' tax debt.

In 2020/21, own revenue are projected to decreases to 81.4 per cent to R7.215 million.

Tables 4 and 5 above show the summary of payments and budget estimates per programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Total expenditure increased from R2.184 billion in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R2.469 billion in 2019/20 mainly attributed to additional funding allocated for the implementation of the Agricultural Economic Transformation Strategy.

In 2020/21, the budget decreases to R2.413 billion, reflecting a growth of 2.3 per cent mainly due adjustments to the baseline due to impact of new data updates in the PES formula; fiscal consolidation

and adjustment to cost of employment due to revised CPI inflation projections). It increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased from R1.112 billion in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R1.277 billion in 2019/20 mainly to cover the payment of Improvement on Conditions of Services (ICS). In 2020/21, the budget is estimated to grow by 5.6 per cent to R1.348 billion mainly due to provision made for ICS adjustment .

Goods and Services increased from R556.760 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R571.451 million in 2019/20 owing to adjustments to the baseline due to impact of new data updates in the Provincial Equitable Share (PES) formula mainly implemented under this economic classification. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 19.7 per cent to R458.791 million due to baseline reductions. It increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Transfers and Subsidies increases from R278.370 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R435.466 million in 2019/20, mainly due to additional funding made available during the 2018 MTEF to assist in the Magwa Business Rescue process, as well as funds allocate during the 2019/20 adjustment period to assist in the Magwa and Majola Tea Estates. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 24.7 per cent to R327.846 million attributed to reprioritisation of funds to EC Rural Development Agency (ECRDA) for the mechanisation services and continuous implementation of Rural Enterprise Development (RED) hubs, as well as provision for bursaries to Fort Cox College students.

Payments for Capital Assets decreased from R227.577 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R185.277 million in 2019/20, attributed reprioritisation to Goods and Services to fund drought relief support, and also to curb anticipated shortfall for Magwa and Majola Tea Estates. The department utilised savings in this economic classification as there were delays in the implementation of infrastructure related projects which led to the department revising its project list. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 50.1 per cent to R278.015 million due to construction of shearing sheds deferred to 2020/21 financial year due to delayed procurement of hay related equipment as the province is faced with drought conditions.

Table 7 above shows the summary of infrastructure payments and budget estimates from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Infrastructure expenditure decreased from R172.075 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R146.069 million in 2019/20 due to reprioritisation to Goods and Services to fund drought relief support, and also to curb anticipated shortfall for Magwa and Majola Tea Estates.

In 2020/21 the budget increases by 39.5 per cent to R203.773 million. The budget for infrastructure increases over the 2 outer years due to stock water infrastructure in order to provide medium to long term drought mitigation measures.

Infrastructure current transfers, increases from R12.000 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimates of R16.360 million in 2019/20, mainly due to provision made for the Amajingqi Macadamia nut and infrastructure to support livestock commercialization.

In 2020/21 there are no infrastructure transfers, as the department has transferred its entire contribution of 49 per cent to Amajinqa Macademia nuts project.

Tables 8 and 9 above show the conditional grants expenditure and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Conditional grants decreased from R350.142 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R345.125 million in 2019/20, due to reduction in baseline allocation for CASP. In 2020/21, conditional grants decreases by 6.5 per cent to R322.574 million mainly due reprioritisation from CASP to Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) to support animal and plant health to sustain exports, as well as from Ilima/Letsema grant to fund the newly created indirect component to enable the completion of the National Food and Nutrition survey. It increases moderately in the outer years.

The Comprehensive Agricultural Support Programme(CASP) grant continues with its focus in the following areas: revitalisation of the Tsolo and Fort Cox Agricultural Colleges, Extension Recovery Plan (ERP), Farmer training and farm infrastructure projects (crop and livestock infrastructure), cropping projects. The Ilima/Letsema grant funding will continue to assist developing farmers' access to crop production inputs and materials. The Land Care conditional grant funding continues to be channelled towards increasing awareness on sustainable use of natural resource. In addition, the EPWP grant continues to compensate beneficiaries employed in infrastructure projects.

The department transfers funds to ECRDA and Magwa and Majola Tea Estates as public entities under the ownership control of DRDAR in support of their legislative mandate. Table 11 above shows the summary of transfers to other entities from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Transfers increased from R63.071 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R83.219 million in 2019/20 due to the introduction of Circular 21 National Treasury. In complying with this circular, the department allocated the budget back to Goods and Services and Capital Payments given that the funds to the strategic partners were not meeting the criteria of being a transfer as stipulated in Circular 21, and funds allocated during the 2019 MTEF to support the establishment of the Vet school at the University of Fort Hare.

Objectives: To manage and formulate policy directives and priorities and, to ensure there is appropriate support service to all other programmes with regard to finance, personnel, information, communication and procurement. This programme is divided into 5 sub-programmes:

- **Office of the MEC:** To set priorities and political directives in order to meet the needs of clients. (For the efficient running of the MECs office).
- **Senior Management:** To translate policies and priorities into strategies for effective service delivery and, to manage, monitor and control performance;
- **Corporate Services:** To provide support service to the other programmes with regard to human resources management and development, Information Technology and Communication service;
- **Financial Management:** To provide effective support service (including monitoring and control) with regard to Budgeting, Provisioning and Procurement; and
- **Communication Services:** This sub-programme proposes to focus on internal and external communications of the department through written, verbal, visual and electronic media as well as marketing and advertising of the departmental services.

Tables 12 and 13 above show the expenditure and estimates for Administration per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure for the programme increased from R435.427 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R499.516 million in 2019/20 mainly due to provision made for payment of contractual obligations (fleet services, legal costs, computer services and operating

leases), and to cover ICS adjustments. In 2020/21, the allocation decreases by 3.6 per cent to R481.509 million owing to implementation of baseline budget cuts. It increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased from R285.591 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R324.747 million in 2019/20, to mainly cover ICS adjustment and planned recruitment. In 2020/21, it increases by 5.2 per cent to R341.652 million to cover ICS adjustment.

Goods and Services increased from R106.615 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R131.076 million in 2019/20 mainly due to payment of contractual obligations. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 16.6 per cent to R109.302 million due to reprioritisation and reduction in baseline.

Transfers and Subsidies decreases from R26.532 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R23.745 million in 2019/20 due to decrease in the number of personnel leaving the service. In 2020/21, it decreases by 35.9 per cent to R15.210 million, owing to a decrease in the number of personnel leaving the service.

Payments for Capital Assets increases from R16.636 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R19.952 million in 2019/20 due to provision made for the procurement of office furniture, laptops and cell phones for the newly appointees. In 2020/21 decreases by 23.1 per cent to R15.345 million mainly due to baseline budget cuts.

8.2 Programme 2: Sustainable Resource Management

Objectives: To provide agricultural support services to farmers in order to ensure sustainable development and management of agricultural resources. It has 4 sub-programmes:

- **Engineering Services:** Provides engineering support (planning, development, monitoring and evaluation) with regards to irrigation technology, on-farm mechanization, value adding, farm structures, resource conservation management, operation and maintenance of farm equipment and machinery, tools and implements solutions;
- **Land Care:** Promotes the sustainable use and management of natural agricultural resources;
- **Land Use Management:** To promote the implementation of sustainable use and management of natural agricultural resources through regulated Land Use (Act 43 of 1983, Act 70 of 1970, and related legislation); and
- **Disaster Risk Management:** To provide agricultural disaster risk management support services to clients / farmers.

Tables 14 and 15 above show the summary of payments and estimates for Sustainable Resource Management per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure of the programme increased from R114.516 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R146.070 million in 2019/20 due to funds rolled over to Land Care grant for procurement of 86 weather stations. It then decreases by 5.1 per cent to R138.660 million in 2020/21 due to once off additional funding in 2019/20. It increases moderately in the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increases from R82.360 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R101.960 million in 2019/20 to the filling of critical posts and payment of ICS adjustments. In 2020/21, it increases by 5.0 per cent to R107.042 million mainly to cover ICS adjustment.

Goods and Services increased from R26.487 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R30.982 million in 2019/20, and decreases by 17.7 per cent to R25.491 million in 2020/21 due to the implementation of baseline budget cuts.

Payments for Capital Assets increased from R5.669 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R13.128 million in 2019/20 due to funds rolled over for Land Care grant for procurement of 86 weather stations. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 53.3 per cent to R6.127 million due to the reprioritisation and baseline budget cuts.

Tables 17 and 18 above show the summary of departmental payments and estimates for the Farmer Support and Development programme per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure decreased from R805.544 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R787.064 million in 2019/20 due to funds allocated over the 2016 MTEF on a sliding scale for agricultural production, agro-processing and drought relief. Furthermore, the department was allocated and additional funding over the 2017 MTEF for the implementation of the strategy. In 2020/21, the budget for the programme slightly increases by 4.8 per cent to R824.971 million mainly to cover ICS adjustments. The budget increases in the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased from R327.312 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R376.298 million in 2019/20 mainly due to the filling of critical posts and payment of ICS adjustments. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 3.9 per cent to R391.131 million.

Goods and Services decreased from R318.774 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R275.438 million in 2019/20 due to the reprioritisation of funds from Goods and Services (Farming supplies) to Payment for Capital. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 28.6 per cent to R196.540 million is attributed to SCOA reclassification of the contractor items linked to infrastructure, and reprioritisation of funds to ECRDA for mechanisation services and Payments for Capital Assets for construction of shearing sheds.

Transfers and Subsidies decreased from R18.157 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R18.449 million in 2019/20, reclassification of funds from biological assets for the establishment of the Vet school at Fort Hare University. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 5.1 per cent to R19.390 million additional funding allocated to ECRDA to curb anticipated shortfall at Magwa Tea business. The budget increases in the outer years.

Payments for Capital Assets decreased from R141.301 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R116.879 million in 2019/20 due reprioritization of funds from Goods and Services and Transfers to this item for commodity partners in order to align to the National Treasury circular 21. In 2020/21, the budget

increases by 86.4 per cent to R217.910 million mainly attributed reprioritisation of funds for construction of shearing sheds.

This programme will mainly support the Agricultural Economic Transformation (AET) Strategy which is based on the commodity and cluster models that seeks to enable rural communities. The focus will be increasing grain, horticulture production, and livestock production.

8.4 Programme 4: Veterinary Services

Objectives: To provide veterinary services to clients in order to ensure healthy animals, safe animal products and welfare of people of South Africa. The programme has 4 sub-programmes namely:

- **Animal Health:** To facilitate and provide animal disease control services in order to protect the animal and human population against identified infectious, zoonotic and / or economic diseases, through the implementation of the Animal Diseases Act (Act 35 of 1984), and primary animal health programme/projects;
- **Export Control:** To provide control measures including risk assessment and health certification in order to facilitate the exportation of animals and animal products;
- **Veterinary Public Health:** To ensure the safety of meat and meat products through the implementation of the Meat Safety Act (Act 40 of 2000), the Animal Diseases Act (Act 35 of 1984), and other relevant legislation.; and
- **Veterinary Laboratory Services:** To render veterinary diagnostic, laboratory and investigative services that will back the control of animal diseases for adherence to hygienic standards and to generate data.

Tables 20 and 21 above show the summary of departmental payments and estimates for Veterinary Services per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure increased from R295.262 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R335.620 million in 2019/20 due to provision made to cover cost pressures on operational costs for Veterinary Services. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 3.0 per cent to R345.753 million mainly due to funds allocated for establishment of a Vet school at Fort Hare University, and procurement of storage containers for animal medicine.

Compensation of Employees increased from R219.723 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R252.366 million in 2019/20 to mainly cover for the payment of ICS adjustments and the filling of critical posts. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 5.2 per cent to R265.412 million to fund the ICS adjustments.

Goods and Services increased from R57.998 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R68.877 million in 2019/20 for vaccines, medicines and fleet services. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 6.8 per cent to R64.186 million due to baseline budget cut.

Transfers and Subsidies increased from zero in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R5.200 million in 2019/20 due to funds allocated for the establishment of a Vet school at Fort Hare University. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 5.4 per cent to R5.481 million.

The Payments for Capital Assets increased from R8.520 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R9.177 million in 2019/20 mainly to fund cost pressure. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 16.3 per cent to R10.674 million due to provision made for procurement of storage containers for animal medicine.

The programme is a crucial component of livestock programmes, providing animal health services such as the vaccination of 1.5 million animals against controlled diseases, certification of experts (animals and animal products), control of sheep scab and treatment of animals to control external parasites.

8.5 Programme 5 Research and Technology Development Services

Objectives: To render expert and needs based research, development and technology transfer services impacting on development objectives. The programme has the following 3 sub-programmes, namely:

- **Research:** To conduct, facilitate and co-ordinate research and to participate in multi-disciplinary development projects;
- **Technology Transfer Services:** To disseminate information on research and technology developed to clients; and
- **Infrastructure support services:** To provide and maintain infrastructure facilities for the line function to perform their research and other functions (i.e. experiment farms).

Tables 23 and 24 above show the summary of departmental payments and estimates per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure decreased from R176.281 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R137.795 million in 2019/20 mainly due to reprioritization of funds of Agricultural Information Management System (AIMS) to Farmer Support and Development. In 2020/21,

the budget increases by 6.8 per cent to R147.210 million for provision made for rolling out of the Spatial and Planning Information Systems (SPISYS). The budget grows moderately over the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased from R101.357 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R111.150 million in 2019/20 mainly due to the payment of ICS adjustments. In 2020/21, the budget increases to R118.291 million by 6.4 per cent mainly to cover ICS adjustment and recruitment.

Goods and Services increased from R18.169 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R21.999 million in 2019/20 for renovations of the satellite power station in Dohne. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 12.2 per cent to R24.676 million due to provision made for rolling out of the Spatial and Planning Information Systems (SPISYS).

Transfers and Subsidies decreased from R20.700 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimates of R0 in 2017/18 due to the department making its full contribution for the establishment of AIMS system. In 2020/21, there is no allocation provided due to the department making its full contribution for the establishment of AIMS system.

Payments for Capital Assets decreased from R36.055 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R4.646 million in 2019/20 due to the reclassification of the funding for biological assets to Famer Support and Development. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 8.7 per cent to R4.243 million due to implementation of baseline budget cuts.

Tables 26 and 27 above show the summary of the departmental payments and estimates per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Total expenditure decreased from R33.839 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R33.738 million in 2019/20 mainly due to reclassification of transfers (Magwa) to Rural Development Co-ordination. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 3.0 per cent to R34.763 million to cater for planned recruitment as well as provision made for computers and office furniture. It increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased moderately from R24.526 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R30.052 million in 2019/20 to cater for planned recruitment and cover ICS adjustments. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 5.1 per cent to R31.577 million to cover ICS adjustments and planned recruitments. It increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Goods and Services decreased from R4.097 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R3.130 million in 2019/20 due to reprioritization to fund cost pressures in other programmes also affected by baseline cuts. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 12.7 per cent to R2.733 million due to implementation of baseline budget cuts.

Transfers and Subsidies decreased from R4.814 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of zero, the department has taken a decision to reclassify the budget of Magwa and Majola Tea Estate to Rural Development Co-ordination programme.

Payments for Capital Assets increased from R402 thousand in 2016/17 to revised estimates of R556 thousand in 2019/20 owing to provision made for computers and office furniture. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 18.5 per cent to R453 thousand mainly due to implementation of budget cuts.

Tables 29 and 30 above show the summary of departmental payments and estimates for Structured Agricultural Training per sub-programme and economic classification from 2016/17 to 2022/23. Expenditure increased from R141.539 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R185.091 million in 2019/20 due to reprioritisation to fund catering services for students at the Tsolo Agricultural Rural

Development Institute (TARDI). Currently students in the agricultural colleges are not receiving the Financial or Assistance as other students in the institutions of higher learning in the country.

In 2020/21, the budget decrease by 0.4 per cent to R184.337 million due to reprioritisation to fund catering services for students at TARDI and farmers during trainings. The budget increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Compensation of Employees increased from R56.389 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R63.185 million in 2019/20 to cater for planned recruitment and to cover ICS adjustments. In 2020/21 the budget increases by 19.3 per cent to R75.381 million mainly due to a provision made for ICS adjustment, and Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF).The budget increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Goods and Services increases from R19.330 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R25.514 million in 2019/20 mainly attributed to provision made for catering services for TARDI students and farmers. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 3.8 per cent to R24.553 million mainly attributed to reduction in the CASP budget.

Transfers and Subsidies increased from R47.464 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R75.930 million in 2019/20 to funds allocated to Fort Cox college for bursaries. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 19.3 per cent to R61.301 million mainly due to budget baseline cuts. The budget increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Payments for Capital Assets increased from R18.356 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R20.462 million in 2019/20 due to reclassification of contractors related to infrastructure projects from Goods and services for college revitalisation. In 2020/21, the budget increases by 12.9 per cent to R23.102 million mainly for revitalization of Agricultural Colleges. The budget increases moderately over the 2 outer years.

Tables 32 and 33 above show the summary of the departmental payments and estimates for the Rural Development Co-ordination programme from 2016/17 to 2022/23. In 2016/17 the programme increased from R182.121 million to a revised estimate of R344.406 million in 2019/20 due to funds to support business operations at Magwa, Amajingqa macademia nut project, RED Hubs, and development of a legitimate cannabis industry. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 25.6 per cent to R256.284 million due to once off funding allocated to Magwa and Majola Tea Estates for business operations.

Compensation of Employees increased from R15.490 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R17.343 million in 2019/20 due to planned recruitment and ICS adjustment. In 2020/21, the budget increased by 5.8 per cent to R18.349 million in order to fund ICS adjustment.

Goods and Services increased from R5.290 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R14.444 million in 2019/20 mainly due for reprioritization of funds to purchase of toilets material, spring water, brick making, sewing machines. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 21.7 per cent to R11.310 million mainly due to baseline budget cuts.

Transfers and Subsidies increased from R160.703 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R312.142 million in 2019/20 due to funds allocated to support business operation for Magwa and Majola Tea Estates, Amajingqa macademia nut projects, RED Hubs, and development of a legitimate cannabis industry through ECRDA. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 27.4 per cent to R256.284 million due to once off funding allocated to Magwa and Majola Tea Estates during the 2019 adjustment estimates.

Payments for Capital Assets increased from R638 thousand in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R477 thousand in 2019/20 due to renovation for Nomabali Arts Centre at Coffee Bay. In 2020/21, the budget decreases by 66.2 per cent to R161 thousands mainly due to phasing out of the Nomabali Art Centre.

Table 35 above show the summary of personnel numbers and cost per component from 2016/17 to 2022/23. The headcounts increased from 2 815 in 2016/17 to 2 609 in 2019/20. In 2020/21 the personnel increases to 2 898 or 3.6 per cent. The department has reviewed its Organisational Structure supported by Human Resource Plan which is aligned to the AET Strategy.

Officials will be trained in technical, business skills and reporting according to the milestones embedded in each commodity group that has signed Service Level Agreements (SLAs) with the department. This step will ensure that a paradigm is taken to increase the capacity of farmers as well as officials in various aspects of the agriculture sector industry.

The department will continue in prioritising the filling of critical posts that will add value in the implementation of the strategy and continue maintaining the acceptable vacancy rate of 5 per cent.

Tables 36 and 37 show the departments' information on training from 2016/17 to 2022/23. The training budget increased from R8.583 million in 2016/17 to a revised estimate of R9.105 million in 2019/20. In 2020/21 the budget increases by 5.5 per cent to R9.607 million due to the provision made to capacitate and improve both hard and soft competency skills of departmental personnel as per Skills Development Act and Department Public Service and Administration (DPSA) directives.

The department is amongst organisations that have created a training and experiential space for youth and unemployed graduates in the past financial years. The intention of the programme is to equip the interns with knowledge, skills, and practical work experience preparing them for the labour market, cooperatives and entrepreneurial space. In 2019/20, the department appointed 120 interns and 25 experiential learners were offered practical work experience in fields such as animal health, analytical chemistry, plant pathology, soil science, financial management, Human Resource Management and Development.

In 2020/21, department will offer opportunity to develop agriculture industry related knowledge that will enhance skills of 125 interns and 25 experiential learners in a professional work setting.

The department in 2019/20 provided financial assistance to 33 students from designated groups benefiting in the form of bursary scheme in the fields of Veterinary Science, Plant Pathology, Agricultural Engineering, Soil Science and other Agricultural related qualifications to deal with the scarcity of skills in these fields in the province. Out of the 33 external bursary holders, 17 are females and 16 are males. Out of 6 internal employees who are getting financial support, 3 are females and 3 are males a commitment by the department in addressing employment equity targets. For 19-29 the department will provide financial assistance in the form of a bursary to 50 employees.

For 2020/2021 the Department will offer bursary opportunity to 30 students from designated groups in the fields of Veterinary Science, Agricultural Engineering, Plant Pathology and Veterinary Technologist. Departmental employment equity targets will be taken into consideration when awarding bursaries. 80 Employees will be offered bursary opportunities to enhance the skills of the departmental human resources.
