1.7 Aligning departmental budgets to achieve government's prescribed outcomes

The Human Settlements Development Grant (HSDG) includes the Upgrading Informal Settlements Programme (UISP) component for 2020/21.

In 2020/21, this component will:

- Promote integrated sustainable urban settlements and improved quality of living environment as per the National Housing Code 2009, which include tenure security, health and security as well as empowerment.
- Serves as a planning and preparation platform towards the introduction of a new informal settlements upgrade.

The total allocation for the 2020/21 financial year amounts to R0.951 billion and comprises of following:

- Normal Project allocation R778.178 million
- Mining Town R30.000 million
- Upgrading Informal Settlements Programme (UISP) R142.620 million

It is expected that the total allocation of R0.951 billion will deliver 5 579 serviced sites and 3 744 completed houses. The 25.78 percent of the Human Settlement Development Grant has been allocated to Mangaung totalling R245.069 million and expected to deliver 600 serviced sites, 977 completed houses and 677 Title Deeds.

Lejweleputswa has been allocated an amount of R262.718 million or 27.63 percent of the grant and is expected to deliver 2 040 serviced sites, 600 completed houses and 230 Title Deeds.

With regard to Fezile Dabi, the allocated amount is R132.845 million or 13.97 percent; and expected to deliver 1 689 serviced sites, 574 completed houses and 584 Title Deeds.

The 13.62 percent of the grant has been allocated to Thabo Mofutsanyane totalling R129.482 million, it is expected to deliver 950 serviced sites, 597 completed houses and 636 Title Deeds.

Xhariep has been allocated R71.515 million or 7.52 percent of the grant and is expected to deliver 300 service sites, 366 completed houses and 336 Title Deeds.

As per sub programmes of the Human Settlements Development Grant, the Financial Interventions sub-programme has been allocated R154.611 million or 16.26 percent. The amount of R639.678 million or 67.28 percent has been allocated to the Incremental Housing Programme, whilst 16.46 percent or R156.508 million is allocated to the Social and Rental Programmes.

Title Deeds Restoration grant was introduced in 2018/19, to provide funding for the eradication of the Title Deeds registration, therefore the amount of R33.860 million has been allocated for the 2020/21 financial year.

2. Review of the current financial year (2019/20)

The Department experienced challenges due to the delays in the delivery of houses as contractors could not complete their work on time. However, the Department planned to deliver five thousand six hundred and seventeen serviced sites (5 617), and four

2. Review of the current financial year (2019/20)

The Department experienced challenges due to the delays in the delivery of houses as contractors could not complete their work on time. However, the Department planned to deliver five thousand six hundred and seventeen serviced sites (5 617), and four thousand two hundred and twenty-three (4 223) were part of the upgrading of informal settlements and new developments in green field areas.

However, the Department managed to exceed this target and serviced five thousand nine hundred and forty-seven sites (5 947). The informal settlements of the Department have increased from hundred and forty-three (143) to hundred and seventy-three (173). To date, nineteen (19) have been upgraded, this means that the basic services are available and people have security tenure.

The Department is currently busy with internal reticulation in forty-three (43) informal settlements and the projects are at various stages of implementation. These projects form part of the Informal Settlements Upgrading Programme. The following six municipalities have started with eight township establishment projects:

- **Setsoto:** Township establishment projects are in:
 - Masaleng (Senekal),
 - Clocolan.
- **Kopanong:** Township establishment projects are in:
 - Ipopeng,
 - Riverside.

In the last financial year, the Department committed to accelerate land redistribution in the province and this is well underway. The land represents our existence, culture and prosperity, it should be indicated that the Land Use Task Team has finalised packages of available land parcels for distribution. Of the four thousand, nine hundred and two (4,902) land parcels, two thousand six hundred and twenty-eight (2,628) have been earmarked to be transferred to the rightful beneficiaries and conveyancers have been appointed for this purpose.

There were discussions with the municipalities to release land and allocated sites to the communities and will be accelerated in the coming financial year. The communities were then requested to stop the pursuit of land; as strong action will be taken against unlawful acts.

Therefore, the Parliamentary Committee's task of amending section 25 of the Constitution to make land expropriation without compensation is much appreciated, as radical economic transformation will be achieved.

Challenges affecting the Departmental performance:

- Delay of verifications on incomplete houses affected progress in terms of completed houses.
- Title Deeds (Post 94 Housing Stock: TRG (Restoration Projects) and HSDG (Current Projects) and Pre- 94 Housing Stock/Act 81/1988.
- The National Department of Human Settlements did not provide the Provincial Department of Human Settlements with guidelines pertaining to dispute resolutions. The Provincial Department of Human Settlements drafted and approved provincial standard operating procedures (SOP)/guidelines to address this matter.
- The Department of Human Settlements identified 4 293 disputes dealing with cases where the HSS approved beneficiaries and the Title Deed holder is not the same person and family disputes are included in this number of disputes. Since the inception of these SOP, conveyancers submitted 519 dispute resolution reports to the Department.

Remedial actions to address the challenges

The Conveyancers are working with Departmental Legal Services in dealing with the disputes. Dispute resolution cases were conducted in Mohokare Local Municipality, Metsimaholo Local Municipality, Ngwathe Local Municipality, Mangaung Metro Municipality and Setsoto Local Municipality.

The Department conducted Consumer education programmes in the following Municipalities: Metsimaholo Local Municipality, Mangaung Metro Municipality, Moqhaka Local Municipality, Tswelopele Local Municipality, Mafube Local Municipality and Matjhabeng Local Municipality. The purpose of the Consumer education programme is to emphasize the importance of reporting deceased's estates to the Magistrates Court or the Master of the High Court. During the third quarter, 8,380 beneficiaries had undergone the Consumer education programmes.

Water and sanitation

There is a steady improvement at the national level with regard to the percentage of households with access to pipe or tap water in their dwellings, off-site or on-site; however; a decline was observed in five provinces between 2002 and 2018. The largest declined was observed in Free State (-4, 5 percentages points- from 91.6 in 2002 to 91.1 in 2018), followed by Mpumalanga (-4, 0 percentage points) and Gauteng (-1, 6 percentage points). However, in terms of the percentage of households that have access to improved sanitation per province from 2002/2018; the Free State showed a significant improvement as in 2002 it was at 64.7 and 85.5 by 2018 (Stats SA; General Household Survey; 2018).

The proper plan between the Department and the Municipalities on areas of concerned will have to be developed and captured in the IDP's so that the Department does not put infrastructure where there is no bulk water.

Population Growth

There is a steady increase of the population influenced by the number of reasons regarding emigration to other provinces amongst others (Stats SA; General Household Survey: 2018).

The South African mid-year estimates by population group and sex was at 58,8 million. The black African population is in the majority (47,4 million) and constitutes approximately 81% of the total South African population. The white population is estimated at 4,7 million, the coloured population at 5,2 million and the Indian/Asian population at 1,5 million. Just over fifty-one percent (30.000 million) of the population is female (Stats SA; Mid-year population estimates: 2019).

The slow population growth in the province and migration has a huge impact in terms of the allocation of budget. The in-migrates were at 114 624 and Out-migrates were at 154 573 with a net migration of 39 948 (Census 2011 as cited by Stats SA; Mid-year population estimates: 2019). The Department planned to meet the divergent needs of the Free State population for proper houses, amongst others the installation and connection of basic infrastructure (water, running water and electricity) jointly with the relevant stakeholders like the Department of Water and Sanitation, municipalities, Eskom, etc.; the registration and allocation of Title Deeds, provision of FLISP related subsidies; rental houses for those who would prefer to rent rather than to own a house.

Unemployment

According to Quarterly Labour Force Survey by Stats SA: 2018; in 2009, there were a total number of 4.3 million unemployed people in South Africa and it increased to 6.7 million by the end of the second quarter in 2019 which represent 29.0 percent unemployment rate. By the second quarter of 2019/20 financial year, the Free State stood at 34.4 percent unemployment rate, report from Quarterly Labour Force Survey (Stats SA: 2018)

Current Income

The South African economy grew by 1.3 percent in 2017 and 0.8 percent in 2018. Given population growth, gross domestic product (GDP) per capita growth has been close to nil since 2014, leaving little room to reduce poverty.

South Africa is one of the most unequal societies in the world due to the segregation policies of the past. Furthermore, with respect to reinforcing spatial integration, investing an additional 1 percent of GDP every year into collective transportation systems and

social housing would reduce prices, and accelerate GDP growth through higher labour supply. This would lift an additional 0.5 million people out of poverty. The Gini coefficient was 0.63 in 2015, therefore Gini index of inequality would lower further by 0.7 point with vulnerable households and transient poor being the main beneficiaries (The World Bank in South Africa; 2019). Therefore, the Department's plan of constructing amongst other low-cost housing, provision of basic services and the construction of rental houses will be done in the spirit of advancing the integrated spatial planning: providing work opportunities and contributing towards the emergence of the new entrepreneurship cadres in order to reduce levels of poverty.

Spatial investment

The National Development Plan encapsulates the national priorities and the Provincial Spatial Development Framework (PSDF) helps in advancing the transformation agenda through coordinating and aligning the national and provincial departmental programmes.

Organizational Environment

The Department is geared towards the achievement of strategic goals and its objectives. It will engage in the process of restructuring in order to comply with the Public Service Regulations, which advocates for the reviewing of the organizational structures after every five years.

The Department recorded the following outputs at the end of the third quarter of 2019/20 financial year.

- 422 houses were enrolled with NHBRC.
- 907 new housing units completed (BNG)
- 8 380 households have been provided with consumer education
- 297 work opportunities were created through human settlements.
- 6 561 households were connected to basic services as part of the informal settlements upgrading programme
- 2 332 new sites connected to basic water and sanitation services as part of the Integrated Residential Development Programme
- 206 finance Linked Individual Subsidies Programme (FLISP) delivered, performance on FLISP has significantly since 2017 and 2018 financial years.
- Erven have been planned and surveyed
- 11 municipalities were supported for the expansion of the National Upgrading Support (Mangaung, Matjhabeng, Moqhaka, Metsimaholo Dihlabeng, Maluti-a-Phofung) an extension was made to other 9 municipalities
- 2 435 Post -1994 Title Deeds (Act 107 of 1997) were registered
- 297 Post -1994 Title Deeds (current) (Act 107 of 1997) were registered
- 302 Pre-1994 Title Deeds (Act 81 of 1998) were registered
- 5 Municipalities were supported towards pre-accreditation - (Matjhabeng, Moqhaka, Metsimaholo, Dihlabeng, Maluti-a-Phofung

3. Outlook for the coming financial year (2020/21)

Section 26(1) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa (Act No 108 of 1996) provides that everyone has the right to have access to adequate housing and subsection (2) obligates and enjoins the state through the Department of Human Settlements to use legislative and other measures to ensure the progressive realisation of this right.

Our focus, aligned to national priorities and overall key strategic areas of the mandate of human settlements, is anchored on:

- Informal settlements upgrading programmes
- Improved distribution of Title Deeds to ensure security of tenure
- Speeding up delivery of housing through catalytic projects, also referred to as mega projects

The Department will embark on the following Catalytic projects:

- Baken Park Project – Bethlehem
- Sasolburg subdivision for 7000 sites – Sasolburg
- Caleb Motshabi project – Bloemfontein
- Vista Ext 2 & 3 Infrastructure – Bloemfontein
- Estoire (Airport Node) – Bloemfontein
- Faster provision of housing for Military Veterans
- Establishment of a credible housing database and management of beneficiary database
- Ensuring empowerment of small businesses in the value chain through a focused small business-mentoring programme where 30% of our budget will be targeted towards youth and women.
- Focused attention on Finance Linked Individual Subsidy for the GAP market.

4. Reprioritisation

In the 2020/21 financial year, the increase in Compensation of Employees amounting to R 1.675 million was reprioritized from Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment within the programme. Therefore, Goods and Services budget decreased by R51.290 million in 2020/21 financial year compared to 2019/20 financial year's budget.

Changes in Programme 1:

Funds have been reprioritized in Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment within the programme to increase Compensation of Employees allocation with the amount of R6.800 million. Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment have both decreased by R5.200 million and R1.600 million respectively as compared to the main allocation of the previous financial year.

Changes in Programme 2:

Funds have been reprioritized in Goods and Services and Machinery and Equipment within the programme to increase Compensation of Employees allocation with the amount of R1.581 million. Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment have both

decreased by R0.281 million and R1.300 million respectively as compared to the main allocation of the previous financial year.

Changes in Programme 3:

Funds have been reprioritized in Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment within the programme to increase Compensation of Employees allocation with the amount of R1.384 million. The Goods and Services, Machinery and Equipment have both decreased by R1.184 million and R0.200 million respectively as compared to the main allocation of the previous financial year.

Changes in Programme 4:

Funds have been reprioritized in Goods and Services within the programme to increase the allocation of Compensation of Employees allocation with the amount of R0.004 million. Therefore, Goods and Services have decreased by R0.004 million.

5. Procurement

The establishment of policies in line with Section 217 of the Constitution which give guidance to procedures, sound systems of control and accountability for the Departmental reform. The primary objective of the Department is to provide adequate shelter to the beneficiaries and to build sustainable human settlements, and this can only be achieved through the utilization of procurement as a tool to promote economic spinoff of the country.

Furthermore, the tenders are advertised with the Pre-qualification criteria for preferential procurement in an effort to advance previously disadvantaged groups. Where feasible the department apply sub-contracting as a condition of the tender. The department ensures cost effectiveness and value for money through recommending bidders who have quoted market related prices after the competitive bidding process or price quotations.

The Department continues to ensure that it complies with the relevant prescripts to ensure that, among other things, integrated human settlements, infrastructure delivery are prioritised.

Moving forward to 2020/2021, the Department will spend substantial budget on procurement contractors to do the following projects:

- Water and sewer
- Completion of incomplete houses
- Township establishment
- Planning and surveying of the land identified for human settlement
- Construction of houses
- Subdivision and Rezoning
- Women and youth owned projects

The Department continues to build municipal capacity and skills to increase the number of officials at municipal level so that they can improve their performance and take on increased responsibilities such as beneficiary registration, consumer education, site identification etc.

7. Payment summary

7.1. Key assumptions

The following assumptions were taken into consideration during the preparation of the departmental budget.

- Equitable share increased by R5.877 million or 2.5 percent in 2020/21 and increased by R9.773 million or 4.0 percent in 2021/22 and R11.519 million or 4.5 percent in the outer year.

- Conditional Grant decreased by R140.769 million or 12.5 percent in 2020/21 and increased by R27.597 million or 2.8 percent in 2021/22 and increased by R40.349 million or 4.0 percent in the outer year. The allocation for mining towns has decreased by R29.598 million or 49.7 percent in 2020/21 and no allocation for two outer years 2021/22 and 2022/23 financial year.
- The 2020/21 budget is R1.275 billion and increased to R1.312 billion in 2021/22 and further increased to R1.364 billion in the outer year.
- The allocation of R31.000 million over the 2020/21 MTEF was Earmarked for the Demolition and Construction of two roomed houses. The funds were allocated by the province as part of the Equitable Share.
- The department received Earmarked funding for the Top Up of Military Veterans' Houses over the 2020/21 MTEF amounting to R15.000 million respectively.
- The CPI projections for the Departmental Compensation of Employees budget increases are as follows:
 - 2020/21 financial year: Salary Level 1-7: 5.8 percent, Salary Level 8-10: 5.3 percent and Salary Level 11-12 4.8 percent.
 - 2021/22 financial year: Salary Level 1-7: 5.8 percent, Salary Level 8-10: 5.3 percent and Salary Level 11-12 4.8 percent.
 - 2022/23 financial year: Salary Level 1-7: 5.8 percent, Salary Level 8-10: 5.3 percent and Salary Level 11-12 4.7 percent.

7.5. Conditional Grants

The Human Settlements Development Grant has decreased by 10.9 percent; the allocation of the conditional grant was R1.093 billion in 2019/20. The allocation for the MTEF is R950.798 million in 2020/21, R786.254 million in 2021/22 and R813.041 million in the outer year of 2022/23.

In terms of the Division of Revenue Bill of 2020, Human Settlements Development Grant seeks to establish habitable, stable and sustainable human settlements in which all citizens have access to social and economic amenities. Over the 2020 MTEF period, a total of R2.550 billion has been allocated to this grant.

The allocation formula of the grant is divided into the following three components:

- The first component shares 70 percent of the total allocation between provinces in proportion to their share of the total number of households living in inadequate housing.
- The second component determines 20 percent of the total allocation based on the share of poor households in each province.
- The third component, which determines 10 percent of the total allocation, is shared in proportion to the number of people in each province, as measured in the 2011 Census.

In 2019/20, the structure of Human Settlements Development Grant was changed to intensify efforts to upgrade informal settlements in partnership with communities. To promote this objective, a new component was introduced with specific conditions relating to such upgrades.

The new component amounts to 15 percent of the formula-based grant allocation to each province. The funds ring-fenced for each province are a minimum expenditure requirement, allowing them to invest more if necessary. This component requires the use of a partnership approach that promotes community ownership and participation in the upgrades. Provinces are required with municipalities to identify and prioritise informal settlements for upgrading and to submit a plan for each settlement to be upgraded, prepared in terms of the National Upgrading Support Programme's methodology.

This component will remain in place in 2020/21, serving as a planning and preparatory platform for the introduction of a new Informal Settlements Upgrading Grant in 2021/22. The new grant will be created by reprioritising funds from the Human Settlements Development Grant. A similar approach is being taken in the Urban Settlements Development Grant, with an informal settlements upgrading component and the intention to introduce a separate grant for metropolitan municipalities in the outer years of the MTEF period. The allocation for Informal Settlements Upgrading Grant will be R228.001 million in the 2021/22 financial year and R241.563 million in the 2022/23 financial year.

In the past the funds from Human Settlements Development Grant were ring-fenced for the eradication of the pre-2014 title deeds registration backlog, given the slow progress to date, along with the impairment it had on the functioning of the property market, the Title Deeds Restoration Grant was introduced to accelerate the backlog eradication process. The grant was introduced in 2018/19 financial year and comes to an end in 2020/21 with an allocation of R33.860 million. It has an allocation of R0.578 billion nationwide in 2021/22, which has been indicatively incorporated back into the Human Settlements Development Grant baseline in that year.

In terms of the outputs as per Title Deeds Restoration Grant framework, the following have to be taken into consideration;

- Number of title deeds issued to beneficiaries of government-subsidized housing (pre 1994, post 1994 up to 31 March 2014).
- Number of township register opened.
- Number of beneficiaries confirmed as legitimate in registered townships.
- Number of ownership disputes resolved.

The Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) integrated grant for provinces incentivises provincial departments to use labour-intensive methods in infrastructure, environmental and other projects. Grant allocations are determined upfront based on the performance of provincial departments in meeting job targets in the preceding financial year. The grant is allocated R2.000 million in the 2020/21 financial year.

9.2. Programme analysis

Programme 1: Administration has been allocated a budget of R139.333 million for the 2020/21 financial year and the increase from the previous year's budget amounts to

R9.338 million which is 7.2 percent. This is due to the current financial years revised estimates which projects expenditure of R136.061 million. The budget is set to increase across the outers years as 2021/22 allocations amounts to R145.599 million an increase of 4.5 percent and 2022/23 allocations amounts to R156.606 million an increase of 7.0 percent.

The programmes main spending items include Audit Fees, Fleet Services and Operating Payments related to the lease of government vehicles. These are the core items which assist the programme to achieve its objectives and they are in-line with the departmental policy.

Programme 2: Housing Needs, Research and Planning has been allocated a budget of R21.191 million for the 2020/21 financial year and the increase from the previous year's budget amounts to R1.433 million which is 7.3 percent. This is due to the current financial years revised estimates which projecting expenditure of R21.560 million. The budget is set to increase across the outers years as 2021/22 allocations amounts to R22.358 million an increase of 5.5 percent and 2022/23 allocations amounts to R24.188 million an increase of 8.2 percent.

The programmes main spending items include Travel and Subsistence, Training and Development. These are the core items which assist the programme to achieve its objectives and they are in-line with the departmental policy.

Programme 3: Housing Development has been allocated a budget of R1.113 billion for the 2020/21 financial year and the decrease from the previous year's budget amounts to R0.146 billion which is 13.2 percent. This is due to the current financial years spending patterns related to the Conditional Grant which is set to underspend its allocation for the year. The budget is set to increase across the outers years as 2021/22 allocations amounts to R1,143 billion an increase of 2.7 percent and 2022/23 allocations amounts to R1.182 billion an increase of 3.5 percent.

The programmes main spending items include Consultants and Professional services, Agency and Support, and Travel and Subsistence. These are the core items which assist the programme to achieve its objectives and they are in-line with the departmental policy.

Programme 4: Housing Assets Management has been allocated a budget of R0.635 million for the 2020/21 financial year and the increase from the previous year's budget amounts to R16 thousand, which is 2.6 percent. This is due to the current financial years revised estimates which is projecting expenditure of R1.388 million. The budget is set to increase across the outers years as 2021/22 allocations amounts to R0.671 million an increase of 5.7 percent and 2022/23 allocations amounts to R0.712 million an increase of 6.2 percent.

The programme provides for the effective management of housing.

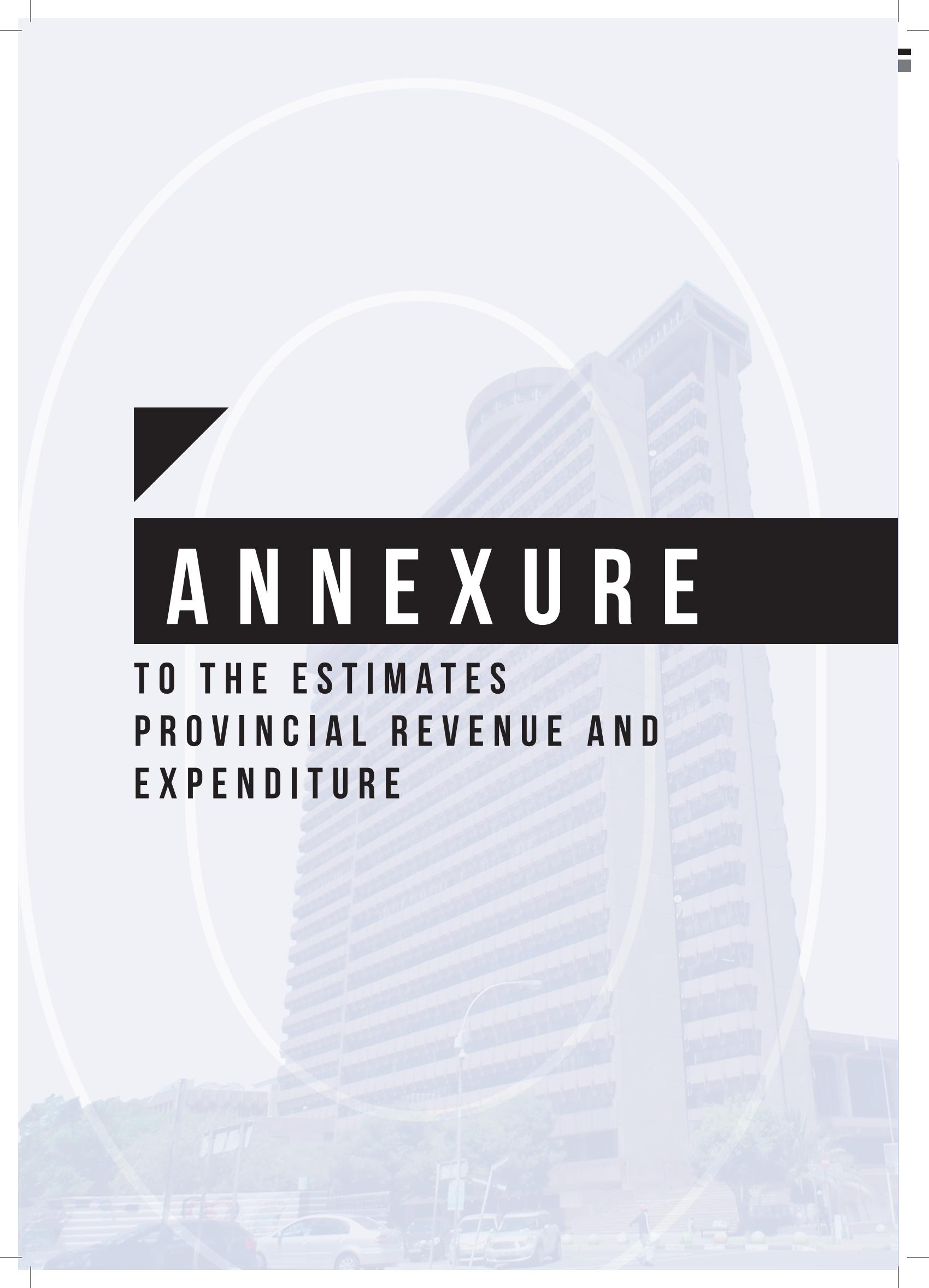
