1. Overview

1.1 Vision

Optimal health outcomes for the people of the Eastern Cape Province.

1.2 Mission

To attain Universal Health Coverage (UHC) for the people of the Eastern Cape Province, through Primary Health Care (PHC) approach utilising resources efficiently, to enable present and future generations to achieve optimal health outcomes and quality

1.3 Core functions and responsibilities

The outcomes are in line with the implementation of the National Development Plan (NDP), the Medium Term Strategic Framework (2020-2025), the National Health Council Priorities and the Provincial Medium strategic framework.

The core functions and responsibilities of the department are aligned to the national and provincial priorities including overhauling the provincial healthcare system by implementing and sustaining an evidence and result-based provincial health system. The core functions are also aligned to the National Health System (NHS), national and provincial legislative requirements and disease profiles. The department is building the required capacity to oversee and manage health services in the province through:

- Improving the quality and continuum of primary healthcare (including community-based and hospital services) by implementing a resourced package of services and improving clinical governance systems and processes; and

- Reducing morbidity and mortality due to communicable diseases and non-communicable illnesses and conditions by implementing high impact strategies to address prevention, detection, management and support at all levels of care.

1.4 Main Services

The main services provided by the Department of Health are as follows:

- **Primary Health Care** for the prevention of illnesses and provision of basic curative health services, including HIV, AIDS, STI and TB, Maternal Child and Women's Health and Nutrition, and communicable disease control. These services are provided through the District Health Services programme, which also includes coroner and other community health services;
- **Hospital Services** – district, regional and provincial hospitals cater for patients who require admission for treatment at general practitioner and / or specialist level. There are also specialised hospitals that cater for patients suffering from TB, mental illnesses, and patients who require long-term nursing care. Tertiary hospitals provide facilities and expertise needed for sophisticated medical procedures;
- **Emergency Medical Services (EMS)** provides emergency care and transport for victims of trauma, road traffic accidents, and emergency medical and obstetric conditions. Planned patient transport is provided for inter-hospital transfer, while indigent patients are transported between clinics and hospitals;
- **Forensic pathology services** renders forensic pathology and medico-legal services;
- **Health Sciences and Training** develops a capable health workforce for the Eastern Cape (EC) health system;
- **Other services** - Health Care Support services to ensure efficient health services as well as overall management and administration of public healthcare within the province. Also included are transversal health services (orthopaedic and prosthetic, rehabilitation, laboratory, social work and radiological services); and
- **Health Facilities Management** – upgrading and revitalization as well as maintenance of existing facilities including provision of appropriate health care equipment. The budget for minor maintenance has been decentralised to the district hospitals.

1.5 Demands for and expected changes in the services

The demand for Public Health Care in the province has continued to increase due to the increasing quadruple burden of disease (BOD) of HIV and TB, high maternal and child morbidity and mortality, rising non-communicable diseases and high levels of violence and trauma.

Tuberculosis (TB) remained the leading cause of natural death followed by Diabetes Mellitus. In the overall TB and HIV followed by non-communicable diseases remain the top leading causes of death in the Eastern Cape. The order of the top ten causes of death is changing and reflects the massive effort and expenditure on the HIV epidemic in the last two decades, which have reduced the contribution of deaths due to HIV in the province. The success of antiretroviral treatment programme, with focus on early initiation of treatment in the course of the disease has resulted in an improvement in life expectancy in the Province.

The implementation phase of the National Health Insurance (NHI) has been extended by three years to 2026. There is a steady improvement towards NHI readiness. All eight districts in the province are implementing NHI programmes and will continue to prioritise the re-engineering of Primary Health Care programme, in particular the number of Ward-Based Outreach Teams (WBOT) with Community Health Workers providing outreach preventive healthcare. This programme will be further strengthened by the integration with other departments through Operation Masiphathisane whose goal is to improve integrated service delivery and pooling of resources at the community level.

1.6 The Acts, rules and regulations

The legislative mandate of the department is derived from the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa section 27 and several pieces of legislation passed by Parliament. In carrying out its functions, the department is governed mainly by the following Acts and regulations: Allied Health Professions Act (of 1982), Births and Death Registration Act (of 1992), Chiropractors, Homeopaths and Allied Health Service Professions Act (of 1982), Choice of Termination of Pregnancy Act (of 1996, as amended), Dental Technicians Act (of 1979), Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act (of 1972), Health Act (of 1977), Health Professions Act (of 1974), Human Tissue Act (of 1983), International Health Regulations Act (of 1974), Medical Schemes Act (of 1997) Medicines and Related Substances Act (of 1965, as amended), Mental Health Care Act (of 2002), National Health Act (of 2003), National Health Laboratories Services Act (of 2000), Nursing Act (of 2005), Pharmacy Act (of 1974, as amended), Prevention and Treatment of Drug Dependency Act (of 1992), and South African Medical Research Council Act (of 1991) and the National Roads Traffic Act, (of 1996).

1.7 Budget decisions

The department continues to operate within a fragile space bedded within intractable service pressures with resource limitations. This fragility is fuelled by the escalating burden of disease, including the multi - morbidity from chronic diseases, mental illness and others. While the pace and scale of progress has been

constrained primarily through reduced budgets and the magnitude of historical medico legal claims brought against the department, the need to ensure uninterrupted service provision continues.

The department received an additional allocation of R1.331 billion for wage agreement and to support the department for the compensation of employees, service backlogs including antiretroviral therapy and TB, medicine and other goods and services, capacitate legal services and provision of energy due to load shedding in some facilities. Within this additional allocation, there is ring-fenced amount of R30 million in 2023/24, in support of the constitutional health defences of undertakings to pay. The department's baseline over the MTEF has been reduced by the Microsoft Licenses function shift to the Office of the Premier. Budget decisions were based on the available budget.

1.8 Aligning departmental budgets to achieve government's prescribed outcomes

The departmental budget is aligned directly to the achievement of the output targets related to Outcome 2 of the National Development Plan (NDP): "a long and healthy life for all South Africans" and indirectly to Outcomes 1, 8 and 12.

The department will reform the public health system by focusing on the following:

- Optimising the service delivery platform to improve service delivery efficiencies and effectiveness;
- Improved management especially at institutional level;
- Improved patient administration through the implementation of the Health Patient Registration Systems (HPRS) which will identify patients accessing services, assist with planning for provision of services based on catchment area population needs, and the tracking of patients across facilities and different levels of care; and
- Continuing to implement the department's e-Health Strategy for improved patient administration and billing in the department's facilities.
- Improved management of community-based outreach data including profiling and registration of community members at the household level using M-Health;
- Focus on maternal and infant health care in order to reduce maternal and infant mortality; and
- More and better trained health professionals'

2. Review of the current financial year (2022/23)

2.1 Key achievements

District Health Services

The Eastern Cape Department of Health (ECDOH) provides comprehensive integrated health services that are based on the Primary Health Care (PHC) model, driven through the District Health System. Various programmes are implemented in order to meet the strategic goals of the Department through

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community-based outreach services, clinics, community health centers and hospitals. During the reporting period PHC supervision visit rate achieved increased to 65.8 per cent, 510 facilities, the performance marked 25 per cent increase from the previous year.

The improved performance is attributed to the districts COVID-19 recovery efforts to catch-up with routine services due to reduction in COVID-19 infection rate. Fixed PHC facility supervisor coverage is at 70 per cent provincially with the most affected district at 27 per cent Alfred Nzo followed by Chris Hani district at 56.6 per cent.

There are 775 PHC facilities across the province, which are made up of 734 Clinics and 41 Community Health Centers (CHCs) complemented by 152 non fixed facilities and 66 district hospitals. PHC facilities are the entry points to the health systems and provide PHC package relevant for each level; and are referral points for the community-based services. In 2022/23, in improving community engagement Clinics and CHC committees for all public health facilities were established and trained.

National Health Insurance (NHI)

The implementation phase of the NHI has been extended by three years to 2026. There is a steady improvement towards NHI readiness.

The province has established ward-based community outreach teams consisting of 3 823 community healthcare workers appointed during 2022/23. These Community Health Workers (CHW) have contributed to primary healthcare by tracing 1 994 HIV non-adherence clients, traced 9 535 TB patients and conducted counselling on treatment adherence of about 1 675.

The 184 Professional Nurses appointed to the Integrated School Health Programme (ISHP) teams expand the service by giving health education to learners on sexual reproductive health, disadvantages of teenage pregnancy, family planning, non-communicable diseases and dangers of drug abuse. During 2022/23 to date, 1 505 Grade 1 and 1 246 Grade 8 learners were screened. Learners with problems like developmental delays, hearing and visual impairment that were detected during these assessments have been referred to the relevant caregivers. The ISHP teams achieved 100 per cent of administering the second dose of Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) and yet another cohort of young girls are now protected against developing cervical cancer, one of the commonest cancers amongst women in the province.

By the end of 2022, the province had contracted 39 private General Practitioners (GP) to supplement the medical workforce and provided services to 77 primary healthcare services, increasing access to doctors in those communities.

Non-Communicable Diseases

District Golden Games took place in Nelson Mandela Bay in October 2022 to enhance active aging among older persons. The department rendered a comprehensive package of health services on the day of the event such as screening for non-communicable diseases, health education, physiotherapy services. There were 500 older persons benefited.

The department in partnership with South African National Council for the blind conducted 55 Cataract Surgeries at St Elizabeth Hospital in November 2022. Furthermore, the department distributed 800 Reading Spectacles to Chris Hani District to be made available to all eligible persons.

Highlights of maternal and child health outcomes

The department achieved a significant reduction in maternal mortality rates in the third quarter to 85.8 per 100 000 live births compared to around 157 deaths per 100 000 live births during COVID-19 and around 108 per 100 000 pre-COVID-19.

Significant reduction in Child Under 5 Years Deaths and a reduction in deaths due to Diarrhoea, Severe Acute Malnutrition and Pneumonia in children under 5 years with Immunization Under 1-year coverage remaining above 82 per cent, in the main due to the catch-up campaigns launched

COVID-19

The goal of the vaccination programme is to reach 70 per cent of the population. Total COVID-19 doses administered is 4 310 789. Total first doses administered is 258 855 or 52.3 per cent. Total persons fully vaccinated is 2 194 941 or 44.4 per cent. Total general boosters is 427 269 or 19.5 per cent. The largest number of second doses required in the OR Tambo District contributes 24.8 per cent to the provincial shortfall falling further behind. Four districts demonstrated a week on week increase in the number of persons requiring a second dose indicating that we are still reaching first time vaccinations

Digitalisation and eHealth

The department has rolled out Health Management System HMS2 to 19 hospitals, registered over 5 million patients; admitted more than 300,000 patient to wards and processed over 600,000 out-patients. The system also includes the eLiability and ePAIA systems so that facilities have live data pertaining to the medico-legal risk.

The department is in the process to rollout the Computer Aided Design (CAD) solution. The equipment for the solution and the customization of the software has been completed. The department is currently addressing the network connectivity in the selected call centres. Call taking agents have been appointed in the financial year as part of addressing human capacity gaps in the call centres. A technical advisor has been appointed to lead the technology support on the project.

Medico legal claims

The department continued to work on the strategies to deal with medico legal claims. There are steering committees with the State Legal Unit (SLU). The recent 7 February 2023 landmark judgement of the EC High Court gives us a glimmer of hope, as Judge Griffiths ruled to make it common law that reparation for medical negligence claims can be expanded to not only be the once and for all, lump sum cash settlements, but also include that services and supplies can be provided by the department of Health. The judgement also makes provision for the novel “undertaking to pay” defense which allows the State to undertake to provide for those services and supplies it may not have, as and when needed. The Court wisely ensures

that the Bill of Rights of the child with cerebral palsy is protected whilst also protecting the Bill of Rights of all other citizens that depend on the public sector for healthcare.

Infrastructure

The mega investments in Alfred Nzo Districts of Sipetu Hospital, Meje CHC and Khutsong Hospitals have reached practical completion and the Department is currently preparing to move staff and patients into the new units. There is notable progress in various projects in the districts.

2.2 Key challenges

Emergency Medical Services (EMS)

The Department has experienced instability in the provision of Emergency Medical Services due to disruptive labour unrest at Amathole District and Buffalo City Metropolitan Municipality. The Department has consistently conducted intensive engagements with affected unions to find solutions to the matters in dispute which include delays in overtime payment.

The EMS experienced violent incidents of attacks to EMS vehicles by community members in the Nelson Mandela Metro. The Department has through cluster system of government established relations with crime prevention cluster to combat crime against Emergency Medical Services. There has been increased number of prank calls which results to wastage of limited resources. The EMS vehicles get broken-down frequently due to poor roads infrastructure. The broken-down vehicles stay longer at vehicle repair merchants which results to limited number of operational vehicles to attend to calls.

Network connectivity and copper cable theft have been reported in various parts of the province which makes it difficult for the communities to access emergency medical services. The department continues to engage with telephony service providers to improve network connectivity and also assist with diversion of calls to a stable phone line elsewhere in the province as may be required.

Infrastructure and IT infrastructure

Connectivity in the PHC facilities is weak with frequent downtimes and affect the timeliness and submission of data to the next level negatively. Improving connectivity to all health facilities is key in driving efficiencies within the department, the aim is to create a digitised organisation that will help standardise business processes and produce consistent information while reducing the cost of providing a world-class patient care.

Medico legal claims

The department has in the past and still continues to sustain high financial losses due to the scourge of Medico-legal Cases. Medico-legal claims account for the highest numbers of current contingent liability thereby making it the highest risk area.

Eastern Region (OR Tambo and Alfred Nzo Districts) has the highest litigation cases in the Province due to various reasons, which amongst other includes maternity related challenges, orthopaedic and other clinical challenges. These are also exacerbated by poor staffing, inadequate skills, other social determinants of health, e.g. poor road infrastructure thus affecting response by the EMS teams in certain areas, employment status, access to health care. Funds that are utilised in the payment of these claims deprive the Department of its ability to procure necessary materials, commodities and equipment's, and other clinical essential that contribute to the delivery of quality healthcare in the Province.

Whilst the department is faced with these challenges, it needs to be mentioned that, poor records is another challenge, which affects not only smooth running and accountability for operations, but affects the quality of defence when cases are presented in court. This challenge is also due to poor staffing at records management units and lack of focus on patient records management as a function separate from patient administration. The Department has made several appointments in the 2022/23 financial year to strengthen rehabilitation services, including critical operational and management posts at the three identified Rehabilitation Centres of Excellence at Nelson Mandela Academic Central Hospital (NMACH), Cecilia Makiwane and Frere Hospital academic complex; and Dora Nginza Hospital.

Impact of load shedding on health facilities

Since Eskom has escalated load-shedding to stage 6, more facilities are under strain to ensure continuity of healthcare services and mitigate any potential clinical risks to both patients and staff. The department had to dig deep into the already strained finances in order to provide electricity power supply-essentially through back-up generators. The higher the stage of load-shedding, the greater the dependence on generators for electrical supply, which leads to greater cost.

The increase in load-shedding also affects sensitive medical machinery and equipment. With suppliers of generators and medical equipment generally located outside of the provinces, and parts often sourced from overseas, there has been delays in repairs and this has affected the continuity of service delivery. Contingency measures the department introduced include transferring patients out of facilities, diverting patients requiring emergency care to other facilities, and increasing the patient loads at those already strained facilities.

Another challenge, especially at stage 6, is interruption in water supply. There are hospitals that receive water supply through electrical pumps from rivers in rural areas. When water supply is affected during high stages of load-shedding, the department had to arrange water to the affected facilities and install water tanks to supplement the system. The department also had to dig boreholes and, in some instances, install water purification systems so that the water from the bore-hole can be utilised.

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With frequent load-shedding continuing unabated, the Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS) devices do not get enough chance to recharge adequately and when the next phase of load-shedding kicks in, the UPS cannot fully support machines used in hospitals. Due to interruptions of power supply, elective surgeries had to be put on hold in some facilities, adding to the post-COVID-19 backlog.

3. Outlook for the coming financial year (2023/24)

The department will continue to relook the service delivery platform so that it is able to deliver within the available resources through implementation of the turnaround strategy to guide the department towards the goal of quality health services, digitally enabled, data driven health care service. The interventions include:

Integrated Medical Legal Strategy

Towards Financial Sustainability: Continue to implement of medico legal strategy to stop haemorrhage of funds from the budget through strengthening of health systems for improved quality of care.

The improvement of maternal and child health services to improve clinical quality care is prioritized to reduce the new cases of medico legal liability. In the year under review, the department focused on the implementation of the Integrated Medico Legal Strategy, ensuring interventions focusing on administrative, clinical and defence capacities are put in place. This is also complemented by support from both Office of the Premier and the Provincial Treasury.

The Department of Health is implementing the following strategies to address medico-legal cases:

- Package interventions to prevent cerebral palsy.
- Implementation of an electronic patient records management system.
- Promotion of early intervention strategies.
- Designated district hospitals to have the full package of services.
- Rationalization of contingent liability records. Anti-corruption and Fraud Multi Group (AFMG) on Medico Legal Claims Double Dipping Prevention Task Team (DDPT)

Service Delivery Optimization

The service delivery optimization (SDO) pillar aims to deal with such inefficiencies and optimally utilize existing infrastructure and human resource capabilities in a district. The SDO will improve organizational performance and will ensure prudent use of scarce resources. It is an exercise that will also promote policy alignment with key policies. The SMS rationalisation – Transitional arrangements letters issued to affected staff. The department is mapping the Service Delivery Platform – facilities and referral systems while also understanding capability of the organisation in terms of organisational structure; human resource; infrastructural condition; budget and decentralised delegations political leadership will be pivotal in engaging with our key stakeholders to explain the rationale of the proposed SDO plan and prevail on the

support of our stakeholders to improve the quality of care we can provide through consolidation and equitable redistribution of health resources.

Implementation of the measles vaccination

South Africa is faced with localised measles outbreak, The Department has undertaken another big task of vaccinating all children from 6 months to under 15 years, in and out of school, regardless of their measles vaccination status. HPV vaccination will only be administered to grade 5 girl learners aged 9 years and older in schools. For Vitamin A, the target is all children missing their routine doses (catch-up) up to 59 months.

Health system strengthening and improved patient experience of care

Support the “hub and spoke” model to ensure that not all district hospitals are providing all services, but that referral pathways are set up and supported by districts and EMS. The focus will be on 8-10 priority hospitals ensuring staff, infrastructure and equipment is available. Suggested: St Patricks, Uitenhage, Butterworth, St Barnabas, Taylor Bequest (Matatiele), Holy Cross, All Saints, Madwaleni, Zithulele, Madzikane kaZulu. Consider Aliwal North (not as high inpatient load but strategic for Joe Gqabi). Appoint family physicians in these first priority hospitals to support skills development. Surgical procedures to focus on: wound washouts, below knee amputations, orchidectomy, skin grafts, lymph node biopsy, drainage abscess, tendon repairs, ectopic. Next level: hernia repairs, appendectomy. Ensure budget issues are addressed for these district hospitals to be providing expanded services

Emergency Medical Services

The department has maintained the total fleet of 808 vehicles which include 447 ambulances, 181 patient transport vehicles, 118 response vehicles, 41 rescue vehicles, and 21 administration vehicles. The department has on average of between 60 – 70 per cent operational fleet while the vehicles are often grounded with a long turnaround time at local merchants. Emergency Medical Services replaced ageing fleet that was non-compliant and had high mileages exceeding 300 000km per 40 months. A total of 57 replacement ambulances were received in this financial year. A total of 115 frontline supervisors were trained in management development programme. Emergency Medical Services signed a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with Livingstone Hospital Emergency Department. This collaboration will assist in strengthening continuum of quality care and later rollout to Central and Eastern Region. Preparations for the rollout of the Call taking and Dispatch system included procurement of equipment, readiness assessment of sites in Gqeberha, East London and Komani, 600 handheld radios supplied to staff to improve communication while in transit. Aero medical services resumed in the province .

Disaster Management

An Internal Disaster Management Committee was established in the previous financial year and will continue monitoring the flood situation in the province. The Department has a representative that forms part of the Provincial Disaster Management Centre with COGTA, playing the lead role in the management of disasters in the province. The Department has a disaster preparedness plan that it will implement in case of disasters.

Improve medicine availability

The department continues to prioritise the medicine availability in all facilities. During the third quarter the availability of medicines at facility level was recorded at 84.6 per cent, which exceeded the quarterly target for medicine availability by 4.6 per cent. The PPE availability was recorded at 89.4 per cent, also exceeding the quarterly target by 9.4 per cent. Interventions to bridge the gaps are planned to provide drugs and other related supplies in clinics. In the long term, district pharmacists are needed in the organogram and pharmacist assistants in all clinics.

Infrastructure plans 2023/24

The main focus in the coming year will be on buildings maintenance of existing, rather construction of new facilities. The department will be collaborating with the private sector to ensure there is sufficient capacity within Health Infrastructure to achieve objective. The department will allocate more than 60 per cent of its budget to maintenance with a few exceptions including St Elizabeth Hospital Core Block. The Provincial Government has resolved to commence construction of St Elizabeth Core Block project with our limited funds while awaiting additional funding from National Treasury. The designs are complete and the contractor is expected on site before the end of the financial year. The project is expected to be over a billion rand on completion. The Contractor for the oncology project has completed the designs under the "design and built" approach and construction work is expected to commence in the first quarter of the financial year. The department is investing over R80 million on upgrading of security at health facilities to protect patients and staff at facilities. The department has already started negotiations with relevant stakeholders to find ways to mitigate the impacts of load shedding. Amongst the interventions will be the installation of roof top solar systems at various facilities across the province, use of energy saving and planning techniques and procurement and replacement of obsolete generators starting with district hospitals. The recent declaration of Energy crisis as a disaster will enable the department make use of per cent Infrastructure budget for this purpose.

eHealth Project Implementation

The solution also makes provision for the stabilisation and replacement of dilapidated server infrastructure. The e-Health systems project aims to support the strategic objectives of the department through the use of information communication technologies to promote, support and strengthen healthcare in the province. The Eastern Cape Department of Health is at a turning point where enterprise architecture is now in place and aligned to the National Department of Health e-Health strategy. The e-Health systems project for the department aims to support the outcomes of the Department through the use of information communication technologies to promote, support and strengthen healthcare in the Province of the Eastern Cape.

Health Facilities' Access to Broadband

In total 804 health facilities will be connected under the Provincial OTP Broadband Project with 100MB fibre connections. The rollout of these sites falls under the State Information Technology Agency (SITA)/ Liquid Telecom (LTSA) agreement. Thus far assessments have been completed at 19 sites.

As part of the ECDoH ICT innovation, the HMS2 electronic medical record system will be implemented as part of the e-Health suite of products. The system is in-house developed and has gone through the NDoH review process and has been certified for HPRS integration.

4. Reprioritisation

The department has reprioritised its budget to core items to improve service delivery. The department is maintaining an organizational structure that was created to execute a housing mandate, which is not in line with the expectations of leading an agenda for creation of integrated and sustainable Human Settlements. The department continues to reprioritize within its baseline to accommodate budget challenges.

5. Procurement

In 2022/23, Goods and Services required as per procurement plans to be sourced from the national contracts in respect of inventories (medicine and medical supplies) and the provisional transport trading entity for fleet services. National agreements are already in place with the National Health Laboratory services (NHLs), South African National Blood Services (SANBS) and Telkom. The department will continue to improve the Local Economic Development (LED strategy) focusing on local procurement for services.

Table 3 depicts the summary of departmental own receipts. It shows that receipts increased from R246.559 million to a revised estimate of R297.412 million. Departmental revenue is expected to grow by 4.5 per cent from R297.412 million in 2022/23 to R310.796 million in 2023/24 due to review and patients utilising health care facilities more frequently. A focus area for revenue collection will be on medical aid schemes, Road Accident Fund (RAF) and the rolling out of an efficient revenue system to all health

institutions. The department has had challenges in receiving payments for services rendered to RAF and settle amounts owing.

7. Payment summary

7.1 Key assumptions

- The department has made provision for pay progression at 1.5 per cent.
- The revised projections for Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation utilised for the determination of baselines over the 2023 MTEF are 4.42 per cent in 2023/24, 4.45 per cent in 2024/25 and 4.48 per cent in 2025/26;
- 2023 MTEF Baseline adjustments were effected as follows:
 - An additional of R380.415 million in 2023/24; R390.194 million in 2024/25 and R395.902 million in 2025/26 for cost of living adjustments ;
 - Adjustments to baseline relating to data in the PES formula resulted to an additional amount of R58.502 million, R105.189 million and R99.258 million in 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26 respectively.
 - An additional of R967.768 million in 2023/24; R1.005 billion in 2024/25 and R1.039 billion in 2025/26 for Health Pressures such as CoE, service backlogs including ART and TB, medicine & other goods and services; of which R30 million is ring-fenced in 2023/24, R35 million in 2024/25 and R40 million in 2025/26 for the constitutional of care defences for the undertaking to pay.
 - An additional of R5.150 million in 2023/24 for the capacitation of legal services and an amount of R42 million for energy (diesel) costs for the facilities not exempted from load shedding; R5.150 million in 2024/25 for the capacitation of legal services and R827.403 million in 2025/26 for the carry through costs of COE shortfall; and
 - Microsoft licenses function shift from the department to the Office of the Premier amounting to R63.477 million in 2023/24; R66.333 million in 2024/25 and R69.318 million in 2025/26.

Tables 6 and 7 above shows the summary of payments and budget estimates per programme and economic classification from 2019/20 to 2025/26. The total payments increased from R26.188 billion in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R28.226 billion in 2022/23. In 2023/24, the budget is declining by 0.3 per cent from R28.226 billion in 2022/23 to R28.139 billion as a result of high revised estimate.

Compensation of employees shows an increase of 0.9 per cent from R18.859 billion to R19.022 billion in 2023/24 when compared to revised estimate as a result of PES formula and allocation for cost of living adjustments.

Good and Services show a positive growth of 4.2 per cent from R7.182 billion to R7.482 billion in 2023/24 when compared to the revised estimate due to additional funding to fund shortfalls in core items.

Transfers and subsidies show a negative growth of 57.3 per cent from R634.381 million to R270.569 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to high revised estimate as a result of payment of medico legal claims.

Payments for capital assets show a negative growth of 10.3 per cent from R1.520 billion to R1.363 billion when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to high revised estimate.

Table 9 above shows summary of infrastructure expenditure per category from 2019/20 to 2023 MTEF. Infrastructure spending shows a decrease from R1.569 billion in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R1.564 billion in 2022/23. Overall, the budget shows a positive growth of 3.1 per cent from R1.564 billion to R1.613 billion due to additional funding allocation on the Health Facilities Revitalisation Grant. The bulk of the budget is in the existing infrastructure for maintenance and repairs.

7.5.2 Maintenance

In terms of the norms for infrastructure maintenance, a minimum of 2.5 per cent of the replacement value of assets should be allocated for maintenance annually or 20 per cent of the overall Infrastructure allocation. In 2023/24, the department has allocated 36 per cent which is R738.085 million of the overall Infrastructure allocation for maintenance.

7.5.3 Non-infrastructure items

The budget for non-Infrastructure is allocated under goods and services for the maintenance of water and sanitation systems, commissioning and recommissioning of existing facilities. In 2023/24, a total budget of R326.261 million is allocated.

Tables 13 and 14 above shows the summary of payments and estimates from 2019/20 to 2022/23 and over the 2023 MTEF period per sub-programme and economic classification. The programme's total expenditure increased from R589.052 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R722.089 million in 2022/23. In 2023/24, the budget increases by 10.6 per cent from R722.089 million to R798.917 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to additional funding for is this true – in terms of the national allocation letter, its mostly for COE and goods and services.

Compensation of employees and goods and services, which make up current payments, are the major cost drivers of the programme. Compensation of employees shows a positive growth of 17.2 per cent from R399.934 million to R468.796 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due provision of critical vacant funded posts, pay progression and additional funding for the cost of living adjustments

Goods and services shows a positive growth 27.7 per cent from R203.599 million to R259.960 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due internal reprioritisation and additional funding as a result of PES formula.

Transfers and subsidies show a negative growth of 44.7 per cent from R3.744 million to R2.072 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to reduction in the payment of leave gratuities.

Payments for capital assets show a negative growth of 39.2 per cent from R111.987 million to R68.089 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to Microsoft licenses function shift to the Office of the Premier.

8.2 Programme 2: District Health Services

Objectives: To render Primary Health Care Services and District Hospital Services. This Programme has 9 sub-programmes with the following objectives:

- **District Management:** Planning and administration of services, managing personnel- and financial administration and the co-ordinating and management of the Day Hospital Organisation and Community Health Services rendered by Local Authorities and Non-Governmental Organisations within the Metro and determining working methods and procedures and exercising district control;
- **Community Health Clinics:** Rendering a nurse driven primary health care service at clinic level including visiting points, mobile- and local authority clinics;
- **Community Health Centres:** Rendering a primary health service with full-time medical officers in respect of mother and child, health promotion, geriatrics, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, psychiatry, speech therapy, communicable diseases, mental health, etc.;
- **Community Based Services:** Rendering a community-based health service at non –health facilities in respect of home-based care, abuse victims, mental- and chronic care, school health, etc.;

Department: Health

- **Other Community Services:** Rendering environmental, port health and part-time district surgeon services, etc.;
- **HIV & AIDS:** Control Rendering a primary health care service in respect of HIV/Aids campaigns and Special Projects;
- **Nutrition:** Reduction Rendering a nutrition service aimed at specific target groups and combines direct and indirect nutrition interventions to address malnutrition;
- **Coroner Services:** Rendering forensic and medico legal services in order to establish the circumstances and causes surrounding unnatural death; and
- **District Hospitals:** Rendering of a hospital service at district level.

The programme's total expenditure increased from R13.640 billion in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R14.932 billion in 2022/23. In 2023/24, the budget decreases by 5.0 per cent from R14.932 billion to R14.188 billion when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate.

Compensation of employees and goods and services, which make up current payments, are the major cost drivers of the programme. Compensation of employees shows a negative growth of 1.8 per cent from

R10.205 billion to R10.025 billion when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to a high revised estimate as a result of a 2022/23 additional allocation to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic.

Goods and services shows a negative growth 8.6 per cent from R4.233 billion to R3.869 billion when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to reprioritisation to fund medical equipment within the programme.

Transfers and subsidies show a negative growth of 65.2 per cent from R339.789 million to R118.094 million when compared to the 2022/23 revised estimate due to high revised estimates in 2023/24 as a result of payment of medico legal claims.

Payments for capital assets show a positive growth of 25.6 per cent from R139.014 million to R174.629 million when compared to the 2022/23 due to funds reprioritised for medical equipment to monitor high risk pregnancies, new-borns and children such as incubators, CPAP compressors and diagnostic sets.

- **Psychiatric / Mental Hospitals:** Rendering a specialist psychiatric hospital service for people with and intellectual disability and providing a platform for the training of health workers and research.
