## 1. Overview

### 1.1 Vision

Integrated Sustainable Human Settlements with improved quality of household lives by 2030, for residents of Eastern Cape.

### 1.2 Mission

Provision of quality integrated and sustainable Human Settlements that offer our communities better living environment.

### 1.3 Core functions and responsibilities

- Upscaling the housing opportunities with special focus and prioritization of Destitute, Vulnerable Groups and Military Veterans;
- Systematic unblocking of historically blocked projects;
- Accelerated Registration and Issuance of Title Deeds to homeowners;
- Increase empowerment opportunities of SMMEs including women and youth;
- Upgrading of informal settlements and provision of social and economic amenities; and
- Continuous use and application of Innovative and Sustainable Building Technologies.

### 1.4 Main services

- Housing facilitation and emerging contractor development;
- Housing project management and quality assurance services;
- Finance Linked Individual Subsidy Programme (FLISP);
- Informal settlements upgraded;
- Housing policy, planning and research services;
- Consumer education, capacitation, and accreditation of municipalities services;
- Housing subsidy administration services; and
- Title deeds registration and issuance.

### 1.5 Demands for and expected changes in the services

The influx of people in the urban areas leaving rural areas is a major problem that is facing the department. This problem has a negative impact in the demands for social housing units in the urban areas which leads to more service protests by the communities. This relocation increases the number of backlogs and informal settlements.

This requires intense planning and reprioritisation by the department. New strategies are to be explored as to how to deal with this pressure. The department has taken a bold approach to prioritise beneficiaries who need services. The directive is to provide services to the poorest of the poor that is destitute beneficiaries, elderly, disabled, disaster affected beneficiaries, and child headed households and military veterans.

The unfavourable climate changes which leads to disasters and requires more attention by the department to provide temporary shelters and emergency housing for the affected communities.

### 1.6 The Acts, rules, and regulations

The mandate of Human Settlements emanates from Section 26 of the Constitution which provides that everyone has the right to access adequate housing. The state must take reasonable legislative and other measures within its available resources to achieve the progressive realization of this right and no one may be evicted from their home, or have their home demolished without an order of court.

The Mandate of the National Department of Human Settlements is also embedded in Section 3 of the Housing Act of 1997, as amended, which provides that the National government, acting through the Minister, should determine national policy. Such policy should, include norms and standards in respect of Housing Development. The National government should, amongst other functions, set broad national housing delivery goals and facilitate the setting of provincial and where appropriate, local government housing delivery goals.

There are several Acts that have been promulgated to further support the department's constitutional mandate and these include, among others:

- Prevention of Illegal Eviction from Unlawful Occupation of Land Act, 1998
- The Housing Consumer Protection Measures Act, 1998
- The Rental Housing Act, 1999 as Amended
- Social Housing Act, No.16 of 2008
- Home Loan and Mortgage Disclosure Act, 2000
- Housing Development Agency Act No. 23 of 2008
- Community Scheme Ombud Service Act No. 9 of 2011
- Sectional Titles Management Act No. 8 of 2011
- Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act No. 16 of 2013 (SPLUMA)

### 1.7 Budget decisions

The budget on Compensation of Employees (CoE) is based on the current warm bodies and 2022/23 vacant funded posts. Additional funding has been received on compensation of employees for the carry through costs of the 2022/23 cost of living adjustments. Change in the Provincial Equitable Share (PES) formula has resulted in the department receiving additional allocation which has since been allocated to contractual obligations to minimize cost pressures. The department's baseline over the MTEF has been reduced by the Microsoft Licenses function shift to the Office of the Premier. Budget decisions were based on the available budget.

The department will continue to adhere to the prescripts around cost containment measures and allocative efficiency while ensuring that key strategic priorities are met in line with the budget challenges over the 2023 MTEF. Decisions taken on allocations are based on the departmental Annual Performance Plan and

Operational Plan. The allocations are aimed at ensuring that the department continues to deliver on its mandate. Budget decisions in the department are largely influenced by the increasing demand of houses and migration patterns to the urban areas. In addition, the department is expected to adapt to these changes and demands, with a limited annual allocation of Equitable Share.

### 1.8 Aligning departmental budgets to achieve government's prescribed outcomes

The department's budget is aligned to National Priority number 8, of which the objective is "Sustainable Human Settlements and Improved Quality of Household Life", with the aim to develop quality human settlements for dignified social and economic livelihoods and human development by focusing on the following:

- Develop human settlements within the identified regions in a sustainable manner and support urban spatial restructuring through well located human settlements;
- Develop and strengthen mechanisms and instruments for integrated physical planning through a long-term credible human settlement project pipeline;
- Improve access to social rental housing in cities and towns;
- Explore innovative applications of existing funding instruments and subsidy schemes;
- Ensuring tenure security and promoting ownership through speedy issuing of title deeds;
- Explore alternatives to contractor driven RDP housing development such as Housing Cooperatives
   Method, expanding the People's Housing Process and voucher schemes; and
- Rural housing.

The following policy mandates and priorities are primarily for steering the work of the department:

- The National Development Plan 2030 (NDP) recognises that apart from the right of access to adequate housing being entrenched in the Constitution, it forms a key component to the country's economic development;
- National Department of Human Settlements has set out four strategic pillars for implementation in 2019-2025 financial year. These priorities are aligned to the departmental priorities which gave birth to the development of outcomes in the departmental strategic plan 2020 – 2025;
- The Provincial Development Plan vision 2030 provide a clear long-term vision and agenda for growth and development of the Eastern Cape Province in a manner that uplifts the human condition by building on the strengths and opportunities of the province;
- Provincial Medium-Term Strategic Framework (PMTSF 2020- 2025) is derived from the MTSF 2019-2025 approved by EXCO in March 2020; PMTSF 2019-2024 is a high-level strategic document developed to guide the country towards the achievement of the PPD vision 2030 goals with focus on the seven priorities of the 6<sup>th</sup> administration which will be implemented and monitored through outcomes and interventions within each of the identified priorities;
- The Prioritisation Framework and Mandate paper's objective is to outline the strategic framework for decision-making on budget priorities that are required to advance the priorities of the PMTSF and to also establish a systematic basis for making strategic choices among competing priorities and limited resources to better optimise the budget as a key lever for driving the P-MTSF; and

The District Development Model aims to improve the coherence and impact of Government service delivery with focus on 44 Districts and 8 Metros around the country as development spaces that can be utilised as centres of service delivery and economic development including the creation of jobs. Where is it focussing in the Eastern Cape? taking into consideration that it was launched in the OR Tambo District Municipalities, and its context for Human Settlement as a department.

# 2. Review of the current financial year (2022/23)

### 2.1 Key achievements

As at the end of the third quarter the department completed 3 083 of the annual planned 7 666. Sites serviced were 2 860 of the annual planned 6 205 and 371 housing units were rectified from the annual target of 1 120.

Policy amendments to the Finance Linked Individual Subsidy Programme (FLISP) have now been delinked and renamed the "Help me buy a Home" Programme. This means that beneficiaries do not need a bond to benefit but can use other means of sourcing funding such as:

- Housing loans granted or guaranteed by a pension and provident fund;
- Unsecured housing loans from any registered lender;
- Housing loans granted or guaranteed by cooperative- or community-based savings scheme or stokvels; and
- Housing loans supported by employer-based schemes.

The department approved 243 of the planned 235 units for the Finance Linked Individual Subsidy Programme (FLISP) and 39 Military Veterans were assessed and verified. 750 destitute and other vulnerable groups were assessed and verified for housing opportunities.

The department has registered 2 505 title deeds in the following categories: Pre-1994 (70), Post-1994 (2 066), Post-2014 (45) and new title deeds (324).

The Social Facilitation Programme continues to support human settlements development through customer care, consumer education and social facilitation. The current state of social unrest necessitates this so that projects are not stalled because of beneficiary disputes or dissatisfaction. The Social Facilitation Programme has been able to reach 4 485 housing beneficiaries through consumer education and supported 14 Project Steering Committees in this regard. Primary to the focus of consumer education is education on ownership and the pre-emptive clause to sales of houses.

115 informal settlements are currently being upgraded in the Amathole, Chris Hani, Joe Gqabi, OR Tambo and Sarah Baartman Regions. Activities being implemented include water reticulation from the drilled boreholes, installation of water tanks, grading of roads, installation of sanitation technologies and other interim services.

The Rental Housing Tribunal continues to regulate and enforce good relations between tenants and landlords and has resolved 253 disputes. The programme also runs an awareness programme for municipalities and the public to understand its responsibilities and how to access its services.

Through the implementation of the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) 4 944 jobs were created against a target of 7 500 in the various categories of Women, Youth, Male and people with disabilities. The Job Strategy further expanded the Emerging Contractor Support Programme whereby SMMEs are supported through formal training programmes and the provision of sub-contracting opportunities.

The department has an active Youth Brigade established in line with the National Youth Development Strategy to empower young people. In this current financial year, a total of 200 was targeted and managed to enrol 100 youth.

Small, Medium and Micro Enterprises (SMMEs) support is one of the National and Provincial priority in the MTSF. The support provided entails the provision of work opportunities, facilitation of training and development of SMMEs in partnership with NHBRC, Training institutions (SEDA AND CETA). In increasing the participation of SMMEs in human settlements development, the Department has now included the 30 per cent clause in its Terms of Reference for all projects exceeding R30 million. In this period, the department has facilitated training for 85 of a planned 80 SMMEs towards sustainable business enterprise.

### 2.2 Key challenges

The department is in the process of reviewing its Service Delivery Model (SDM) which will assist and support management in determining the most suitable operating model to meet the mandated and overall service delivery expectations. The purpose of the SDM is to provide the department with a systematic approach to deliver its strategy and goals. It also includes the approach with which the department intends to package its services and engage with its stakeholders. The intended outcome of this exercise is to determine departmental functions that be performed at the district offices instead of from the Head Office that would see a reduction in the high operating cost and the districts will be better capacitated to deliver. This would result in the resettlement of identified officials from Head Office to the Districts Office and the automation of the current business processes.

The department is maintaining an organisational structure that was created to execute a housing mandate, which is not in line with the expectations of leading an agenda for creation of integrated and sustainable Human Settlements. The continuous decline in the equitable share allocation will impact negatively on service delivery.

With the delineation of Housing from the Department of Local Government and Traditional Affairs in 2008 and the introduction of revised mandate of the Department of Human Settlements, several significant challenges had to be addressed on the inherited projects from the previous developers. This led to the department revoking the developer status from the non-performing municipalities.

Since then, there has been a continuous effort by the department to identify and de-commit funding from projects that were blocked due to the above-mentioned challenges. This was done with the aim of optimising departmental and State resources that could then be redirected to performing projects and to rural areas of the Province. All projects that have not moved for more than three years have been closed.

Should we not say anything about the changing needs for housing resulting from disasters – has to respond immediately with temporary housing.

The provincial department did not have allocated budget for the Provincial Emergency Housing Grant and the province had experienced disasters in April 2022. The department had to respond immediately with temporary housing structures. The budget was allocated in the fourth quarter of the 2022/23 financial year for the provision of temporary shelter assistance to households affected by disaster or to repair the damage to housing for low income households.

# 3. Outlook for the coming financial year (2023/24)

In 2023/24 financial year, we will continue to implement the broad Policy Priorities of the sector as set in the sixth term of administration:

- Provision of housing opportunities with special focus and prioritization of Destitute and Vulnerable Groups especially disabled, the elderly, child-headed families, and military veterans remain one of the government's priorities. The targets for the 2023/24 financial year include the delivery of 7 638 low-cost housing units, 320 Finance Linked Individual Subsidies and 38 Individual Subsidies. Service sites to be delivered will be 5 350.
- 60 blocked projects will be unblocked throughout the Province. The department is engaging
  municipalities and implementing agents to augment capacity on Human Settlements Development
  and implementation of these projects will be done in multi-years;
- The department will register 8 000 title deeds under the following categories: Pre-1994 750, Post-1994 3 500, Post-2014 2 500 and New 1 250 title deeds. The department will continue working with municipalities to ensure that the pre-conveyancing activities are resolved to enhance the speedy delivery of the tittle deeds;
- 160 Informal Settlements will be upgraded in various municipalities utilising the Informal Settlement Upgrading Partnership Grant (ISUPG) and 8 000 household will benefit. The department has

approved a new ISUP strategy with guidelines to permit the department to utilise the ISUPG to assist in unblocking the bulk challenges currently faced;

- Empowerment of Designated Groups, Skills Development and Job Creation through training towards sustainable business enterprises; 200 opportunities will be prioritized through the Youth Brigade Programme and 21 opportunities will be provided to youth through the Artisan Development Programme;
- The department will create 7 500 job opportunities through the Expanded Public Works Programme
- Priority Human Settlements Development Areas (PHSDAs) to be enforced through the 12
   Prioritised Development Areas (PDA's) as gazetted by the Minister of Human Settlements;
- Partnerships and Collaborations towards transforming the Human Settlements Sector as envisaged by the District Development Model (DDM) of intergovernmental development planning which include the building of new cities, District one-stop shop centres; small town revitalisation; relocation of government office parks and responding to housing needs of middle-income earners; and
- Public and consumer education through media communications and community engagements with a targeted 4 500 beneficiaries to be reached.

# 4. Reprioritization

The department has reprioritised its budget to core items to improve service delivery. The department is maintaining an organizational structure that was created to execute a housing mandate, which is not in line with the expectations of leading an agenda for creation of integrated and sustainable Human Settlements. The department continues to reprioritize within its baseline to accommodate budget challenges.

# 5. Procurement

Over the 2023 MTEF, major drivers of the procurement plan include construction procurement, maintenance of existing valid contracts and agreements for services relating to communication contracts and the leasing of government vehicles.

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer will ensure that the department's procurement is aligned to the departmental procurement plan. All committees (Bid Adjudication, Bid evaluation, etc.) will sit as planned to fast track all tenders in line with the Supply Chain Management (SCM). The department will contact Provincial Treasury (PT) for all matters relating to SCM for guidance. All staff in the SCM unit will receive continuous training on new policies, guidelines and new frameworks. In areas where there are variation orders to be done PT will be consulted. The department at all times will ensure that procurement processes are followed to avoid irregular and wasteful expenditure.

Table 2 above displays the summary of departmental receipts. The main source of receipts are the equitable share allocation and conditional grant. The departmental receipts increased from R2.311 billion in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R2.504 billion in 2022/23. The budget increased by 1.2 per cent from a revised estimate of R2.504 billion in 2022/23 to R2.535 billion in 2023/24.

The equitable share allocation increased from R98.953 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R501.471 million in 2022/23. In 2023/24 the allocation decreased by 11.1 percent from a high revised estimate of R501.471 million to R 445.889 million due to more payments for travel and subsistence made in December 2022 which caused high revised estimate.

The Conditional Grant allocations increase from the revised estimate of R2.003 billion in 2022/23 to R2.089 billion or by 4.3 per cent in the 2023/24 financial year to keep in line with inflation.

Table 3 above shows the summary of departmental own receipts and collection per item. Departmental receipts increase from R2.235 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R3.661 million in 2022/23. The department generates its revenue from sales of goods and services, which includes rental of capital assets, commissions and from interest earned from the trust accounts managed by municipalities. The difference between the estimate and the medium-term revenue and expenditure is due to collection from a transaction in financial assets and liabilities from previous year's debts.

# 7. Payment summary

### 7.1. Key assumptions

The following assumptions were taken into consideration when the budget was formulated:

- The department has made provision for pay progression at 1.5 per cent.
- The revised projections for Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation utilised for the determination of baselines over the 2023 MTEF are 4.42 per cent in 2023/24, 4.45 per cent in 2024/25 and 4.48 per cent in 2025/26;
- 2023 MTEF Baseline adjustments were effected as follows:
  - o An addition of R8.891 million in 2023/24; R8.984 million in 2024/25 and R9.116 million in 2025/26 for the cost of living adjustments;
  - Adjustments to baseline relating to data in the PES formula resulted to an additional amount of R1.154 million, R2.061 million and R2.016 million in 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26 respectively; and
  - Microsoft licenses function shift from the department to the Office of the Premier amounting to R5.330 million in 2023/24; R5.570 million in 2024/25 and R5.821 million in 2025/26.

Tables 4 and 5 above provides a summary of payments and estimates by programme and economic classification over the 2023 MTEF. Expenditure increase from R2.311 billion in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R2.504 billion in 2022/23. Expenditure comprises mainly of the HSDG and ISUPG, which accounts for about 82 per cent of the department's budget. Overall, the budget increased by 1.2 per cent from a revised estimate of R2.504 billion in 2022/23 to R2.535 billion in 2023/24.

Compensation of Employees increases by 3.4 per cent in 2023/24 which caters for improved cost of service where the budget increases from R365.006 million to R377.458 million due to additional funding allocated for the cost of living adjustments in the 2023 MTEF period.

Goods and services decrease by 16.1 per cent from a revised estimate of R66.086 million in 2022/23 to R55.465 million in 2023/24. Goods and services are driven by contractual obligations, an EPWP grant to strengthen the existing empowerment specifically for youth, women and people with disabilities and expenses related to the monitoring the running projects of the departments.

The main cost driver of the department's budget is the transfers and subsidies that increased by 1.8 per cent from a revised estimate of R2.052 billion in 2022/23 to R2.089 billion in 2023/24 financial year. This cost driver is mainly driven through the core business of the department.

Payments for Capital Assets decrease by 40.2 per cent from a revised estimate of R21.242 million in 2022/23 to R12.700 million in 2023/24 due to a roll-over allocated in the 2022/23 financial year for a commitment from the previous year. CAPEX is driven by contractual obligations for fleet rentals, cell phone rentals and the upgrading of ICT infrastructure.

Table 7 above shows the departmental expenditure on infrastructure for the 2019/20 to 2021/22, current year and the 2023 MTEF. Infrastructure payments for the delivery of housing units through various housing instruments which include Integrated Rural Development, Informal Settlements Upgrading, Peoples Housing Process, Project Linked Subsidies and EPWP. Expenditure increased form R1.897 billion in 2019/20 financial year to a revised estimate of R2.095 billion in the 2022/23 financial year. The infrastructure budget shows a decrease of 0.3 per cent in the 2023/24 financial year from a revised estimate of R2.095 billion to R2.089 billion when compared to the previous financial year due to high revised estimate in 2022/23 that include the approved roll over of funds.

Tables 10 and 11 above show the departmental payments and estimates of expenditure per sub-programme and by economic classification. Total expenditure increased from R158.429 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R192.542 million in 2022/23. The budget decreased by 7.6 per cent from revised estimate to R192.542 million in 2022/23 to R177.875 million in 2023/24 due to function shift of Microsoft licenses to the Office of the Premier.

Compensation of Employees is the main cost driver of the programme's budget and it is projected to increase by 3.0 per cent from a revised estimate of R119.409 million in 2022/23 to R123.017 million in 2023/24 due to additional allocation of the cost of living adjustments and is in line with assumptions of the annual recruitment plan for the 2023/24 financial year.

Expenditure on Goods and Services increased from R34.264 million 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R51.774 million in 2022/23. The estimated budget decreases by 19.9 per cent between 2022/23 and 2023/24 due to function shift of Microsoft licenses. Goods and services are driven by contractual obligations and administrative function support to core programmes implementing the mandate of the department.

Payments for Capital Assets decrease from a revised estimate of R21.242 million to R12.700 million or by 40.2 per cent due a roll-over allocated in the 2022/23 financial year for a commitment from the previous year. CAPEX is driven by contractual obligations for fleet rentals, cell phone rentals and the upgrading of ICT infrastructure.

Tables 12 and 13 above show the departmental payments and estimates of expenditure per sub-programme and by economic classification. Total expenditure increased from R19.166 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of R21.048 million in 2022/23. The budget increased by 2.1 per cent from revised estimate to R21.048 million in 2022/23 to R21.498 million in 2023/24.

Compensation of Employees is the main cost driver of the programme's budget, and it is projected to increase by 3.9 per cent from a revised estimate of R19.807 million in 2022/23 to R20.570 million in 2023/24 as a result of additional funding for the cost of living adjustments and is in line with assumptions of the annual recruitment plan for the 2023/24 financial year.

Expenditure on Goods and Services decreased from a revised estimate of R1.042 million in 2022/23 to R698 thousand in 2023/24. The estimated budget decreases by 33.0 per cent between 2022/23 and 2023/24. Goods and services are driven by activities related to planning and performance management.

Tables 15 and 16 above shows departmental payments and estimates by sub-programme and economic classification. The expenditure recorded in the 2019/20 financial year increased from R2.107 billion to a revised estimate of R2.260 billion in 2022/23 financial year. The budget for the programme has increased by 2.3 per cent from a revised estimate of R2.260 billion in 2022/23 to R2.313 billion in 2023/24 financial year.

Compensation of Employees is projected to increase by 3.6 per cent from a revised estimate of R204.754 million in 2022/23 to R212.156 million in 2023/24 due to additional funding for the cost of living adjustments and is in line with assumptions of the annual recruitment plan for the 2023/24 financial year.

Expenditure on Goods and services decreased minimally from R12.571 million 2022/23 revised estimate to R12.569 million in 2022/23. Goods and services are mainly driven by activities related to project execution and oversight.

Transfers and subsidies increased by 2.2 per cent in 2023/24 financial due to an increase in Human Settlements Development Grant (HSDG) allocation. Households is mainly comprised of the (HSDG) and the Informal Settlements Upgrading Partnership Grant (ISUPG) which drive the core business of the department in the creation of sustainable and integrated human settlements and the facilitation of a programmatic and inclusive approach to upgrading informal settlements.

Tables 18 and 19 above shows departmental payments and estimates by sub-programme and economic classification. The expenditure recorded in the 2019/20 financial year increased from R26.046 million to a revised estimate of R30.794 million in 2022/23 financial year. The budget for the programme has decreased by 26.6 per cent from a revised estimate of R30.794 million in 2022/23 to R22.605 million in 2023/24.

The budget for Compensation of Employees increased by 3.2 per cent from a revised estimate if R21.037 million in 2022/23 to R 21.715 million in 2023/24 due to additional allocation for the cost of living adjustments and is in line with assumptions of the annual recruitment plan for the 2023/24 financial year.

Expenditure on Goods and services increased from a revised estimate of R700 thousand in 2022/23 to R703 thousand in 2023/24. Goods and services is driven by activities related to housing sales and transfer of assets facilitate, co-ordination of land acquisition and tenure services and the implementation of social and rental housing.

The estimated budget of the programme decreased by 26.6 per cent between 2022/23 and 2023/24 due to the correction of the classification of the institutional support instrument which is part of the Human Settlements Development Grant under Programme 3.

Table 21 shows that personnel numbers increase from 572 at a cost of R357.492 million in 2019/20 to a revised estimate of 612 at a cost of R365.006 million in 2022/23 due to the increase of internship opportunities provided by the department. Compensation of Employees increases by 3.3 per cent in 2023/24 from a revised estimate of R365.006 million in 2022/23 to R377.458 million in 2023/24 which caters for improved cost of service of the department's full establishment and interns.

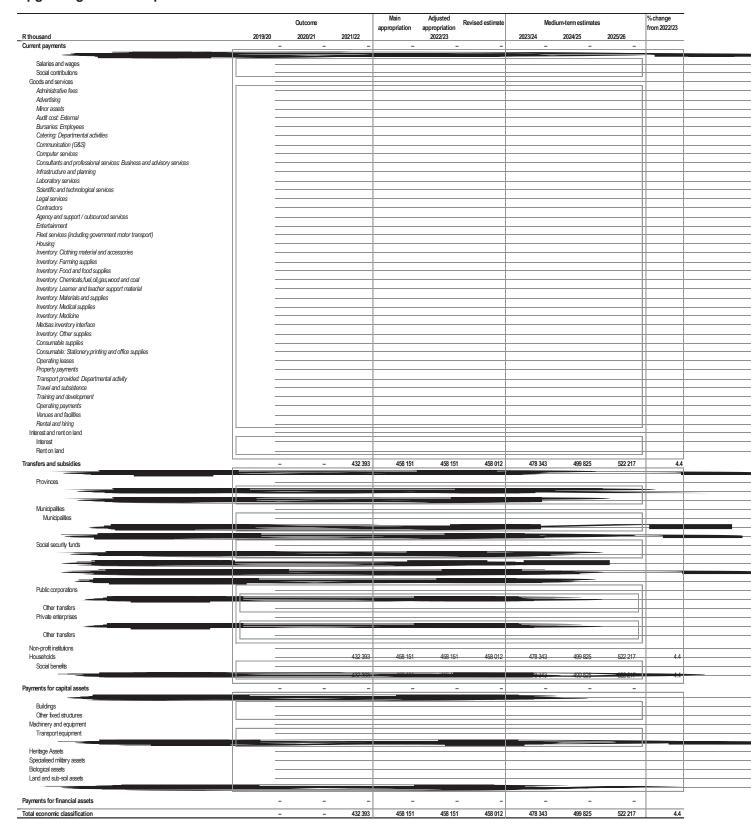
