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## **1   Overview**

### **Vision**

Delivery and maintenance of quality infrastructure for sustainable growth and development.

### **Mission**

To provide quality provincial infrastructure and ensure better service delivery.

### **Values**

### **Core functions**

- Implementation of maintenance activities, routine, scheduled conditions assessment of all buildings and other fixed structures;
- To manage the property portfolio of the province including the establishment and management of the provincial strategic and infrastructure plan;
- To manage the operations of buildings including facilities management, cleaning, greening, beautification, interior decoration and designs as well as day to day preventative maintenance of electronic, electrical and mechanical equipment for all services related to managing a building;
- To promote accessibility support and the safe, affordable movement of people, Goods and Services through the delivery and maintenance of transport infrastructure that is sustainable,

integrated and environmentally sensitive, and which supports and facilitates social empowerment and economic growth;

- To develop new, re-construct, upgrade and rehabilitate and maintain roads and infrastructure;
- To plan, regulate and facilitate the provision of integrated land transport services through co-ordination and co-operation with national planning authorities and the private sector in order to enhance the mobility of all communities particularly those currently without or with limited access;

The department is amongst others guided by national policies aimed at transforming the public service, such as Batho-Pele and the White Paper on transformation of the Public Service. The department is also bound by centrally negotiated agreements regarding conditions of service for its employees.

#### **1.1 Aligning departmental budgets to achieve government's prescribed outcomes**

The Department's contribution to the National Policy Outcomes is mainly in respect of Policy Outcomes 5 and 6, as targets that have been included in the Service Delivery Performance Agreement entered between MEC of Department of Public Works and Roads and the Premier. In response to cabinet lekgotla held in January 2010, the department adopted the outcome-based approach to planning.

This approach requires explicit statement of the outcome expected and clear indicators, baselines and targets to:

- Focus on results
- Clarify the assumption that inform plans and resource forecasting
- Linking activities to outputs and outcomes
- Improve coordination and alignment of activities.

The department intends to give expression on National Development Plan (NDP), particular focus is on the development of rural economy as well as provisioning, upgrading and maintenance of economic infrastructure.

The following are policy outcomes that link National Development Plan (NDP) and Annual Performance Plan (APP) of the Department:

**A skilled & capable workforce to support an inclusive growth path (Outcome 5):**

The department has committed to mentor and provide internship, leanership and apprenticeship to graduates of South African Universities, Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Colleges for the acquisition of skills and knowledge to meet the present and future needs of the economy and society in general. The economic growth of the province and country in general requires engineering skills to deliver the massive infrastructure programme at an advanced level. Coaching and mentoring of the existing personnel and new recruits will precisely deliver outcome 5. The department will be delivering infrastructure projects earmarked to be implemented under contractor development and has an EPWP mode (Itirele road infrastructure projects).

**An efficient, competitive and responsive infrastructure network (Policy Outcome 6):**

The department will relentlessly invest in the strong economic infrastructure network designed to support medium and long term economic and social objectives of the province. This outcome will be achieved through road construction and maintenance in rural villages and farms. The fifth administration has placed the infrastructure development at the forefront of the government agenda to transform the economy, stimulate economic growth and to create jobs. The department has strengthened service delivery mode by focusing on intake of women, youth and persons with disability in the implementation of infrastructure projects on built and road sectors.

## **2 Review of the current financial year (2022/23)**

The section provides a performance review of the 2022/23 financial year, outlining the main achievements and progress made by the department, as well as outlining a brief narrative discussion on new departmental developments.

In this current financial year, the department applied for the roll-over and approval of unspent budget that resulted from prolonged appointment of contractors and process of Supply Chain Management (SCM) to source quotations for procuring other goods and services.

**Building Infrastructure and Facility Management:**

The department has established the Provincial Government Immovable Asset Management Act (GIAMA) forum to serve as a consultative platform for engagements between the department, Provincial Treasury, the office of the Premier, Legislature and other Provincial User departments. The department further participates in GIAMA technical Committee (GTC) which is chaired by the National Department of Public Works. As a sole custodian of provincial state-owned immovable asset, which is land, building and facilities is also responsible for the implementation of GIAMA.

The provincial immovable assets register has been aligned to the minimum requirements of an immovable assets register as published by the National Treasury. The physical infrastructural progress of projects mentioned in the previous financial year discussed below in order to assess whether they are currently operational or completed:

- Installation of transformer and generators at Garona;
- Construction of New Offices for Public Works and Roads Sub-District Workshop, Vryburg Roads camp;
- Construction of Perimeter Wall at Geoscience building;
- NMM Sub-district offices Extensions; and
- Repairs and Renovations to offices, Moretele Office Park phase 2b.

An amount of R1 million from roll-over was received for repair and maintenance of Geo science wall during the 2022/23 adjustment budget.

**Transport Infrastructure:**

The programme's allocation increased to R2.016 billion during the 2022/23 Adjustment budget period, of which R222.246 million came after the approval of roll-over and R111.1 million was additional funding for Provincial Roads Maintenance Grant (PRMG) to assist on floods damage that the province has currently experienced, while an amount of R50.5 million (equitable share) was allocated to transport infrastructure for roads upgrading and additions.

- Re-gravelling and Routine Maintenance of Road D604 from Road D634 to end tar in Bojanala District;
- Rehabilitation Road P31/1 Gauteng border (Phelindaba)to P123/1 in Hartbeespoort;
- Special Maintenance of road D109 (Bethanie) from P511 to R511 in Brits;
- Special maintenance on Critical sections of Road P2/4 (R104) from Majakaneng to Hartbeespoort;
- Pothole patching and reseal of road D980 (K8) between Brits and Rosslyn including intersection improvement and R512 approximately 21.5 km (Safety Improvement);
- Sectional Patch & Rehabilitation of road P63/1 from Maboloka to Fafung;
- Special Maintenance on Road D625 and Road D626 in Maubane approximately 10 km;
- Re-gravelling and stormwater improvement of Road P51/2 from Makweleng to Road D56 through the villages of Kwa Masekolane and Sig approximately 23 km;
- Pothole Patching, Reseal of Road D604 and Z607 in Makaunyane approximately 7 km;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road p124/1 from Dwarsberg to Derdepoort road, Phase III from Molatedi Village to Madikwe game reserve (3 km);
- Rehabilitation of Road P175/1 from Potchefstroom to Vanderbijlpark (border Gauteng – 35 km) Phase 2 - 22.5 km;
- Investigate sinkhole & required intervention on Road P137/1 (Hartbeesfontein near Orkney);
- Rehabilitation of Road P117/1 from Ottosdal (P13/2) to Hartbeesfontein;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road Z374 from Austrey to Goodwood of approximately 45 km (Phase I 15 km);
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road D201 from Pampierstad to Matlapaneng to N18;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road D327 from Ganyesa to Vragas to Madinonyane (57 km), Phase II of road D327 from Vragas to the northern Cape border and of Road Z389 from road D327 to Madinonyane;
- Rehabilitation of road D933 from Lichtenburg to Gelukspan and a portion of road D2095 to road P183/1 passing through Dudefield and Sephaku mines - approximately (40 km);
- Rehabilitation, repair and reseal of Road P152/1 from N18 at Setlagole to P34/4 in Delareyville, (Phase 2) (28 km);
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road Z422 from intersection of Albert Luthuli Road through Lokaleng and Mogosane village to Tlapeng (30km) Phase 1 (15 km);
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard(tar) of Road Z482 from Madibogo through Madibogopan to the intersection at D1727 between Stella and Delareyville, 13 km;

- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road from Gopane passing villages Maphephane, Mmutshweu, Ga-seane to Lobatleng; Road D417 (Lobatleng to Motswedi) of approx 27 km (phase II 13 km);
- Upgrading from Gravel to Surface Standard of Road D514, Z561, D503 and D501 from access to Ramokokstad to Mmorogong via Pylkop access approximately 21 km (including 2 water crossing bridges);
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of Road D479 from Khunotswana village towards N4 at Tweefontein (27 km), Phase 3 for 11 km;
- Special maintenance on the section of Nelson Mandela Road between Danville and Dada motors in Mahikeng town, approximately 4 km;
- Special Maintenance on Road P183/1 between Goedgevonden and N18 approximately 27 km
- Special maintenance on sections of road D414 between Makgobistad through Logagane, Makgori to Tshidilamolomo approximately 46 km.

#### **Expanded Public Works Programme:**

The Expanded Public Works Programme is one of the flagship programmes and priorities of the department to create employment and development of emerging contractors. The Department will continue with the implementation of the Vuk'uphile Contractor Development and Itirele Programme in partnership with the National Department of Public Works, and Department of Transport with the intention of job creation, maximization and development emerging contractors.

The R198 million was allocated for Programme 4 which is Community Based Programme which spent 70 per cent at the end of third quarter, the R60 million which was initially allocated for NYS and Itirele Beneficiaries. The remaining R138 million was allocated for grass cutting projects which were introduced during the financial year 2022/23. In the financial 2022/23 the department targeted to employ beneficiaries and this was a success (Itirele 11 000 and Capex/ Opex 1 000). The vote is reporting 11 159 work opportunities that have been created (i.e Itirele 11 399 (103 per cent) and CAPEX/OPEX 67 (7 per cent).

### **3 Outlook for the coming financial year (2023/24)**

This section outlines what the department is intending to achieve in the next financial year of business operations as well as briefly looking at the challenges and proposed new developments. The non-availability of the electricity impacts negatively on service provider's payment and service delivery. The continuous load-shedding compounded by the theft of Eskom cables prompted the department to procure and maintain the generators to mitigate this challenge.

The continuous running of the generators need diesel and given unstable stages of load shedding, the allocated may be under pressure. The main aim is to ensure uninterrupted service delivery by keeping the financial systems such as PERSAL, Walker, BAS (Basic Accounting System) mainframe,

telephones, Emails and air-conditioners functional. The department will be exploring other energy alternatives to aid the situation.

The department is faced with the challenge of constant procurement of petrol and diesel for backup generators due to the increase of stages in load-shedding. In the 2023/24 the maintenance of yellow fleet will be centralized to head office in line with RT46 in 2023/24, an introduced transversal policy that governs management of yellow fleet. The department had set aside an amount of R15.7 million for procurement of yellow fleet and R12.9 million for procurement of roads material for pothole patching in the 2023/24 financial year.

### **Public Works Infrastructure**

The programme is intending to provide building infrastructure that is accessible, integrated and environmentally sensitive. It further contributes to Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) of infrastructure investment, job creation and transformation of construction and property industries through implementation of EPWP projects. In pursuit of achieving this mandate, the programme has allocated a budget of R1.155 billion during 2022/23 adjustment budget, over the MTEF period R1.087 billion in 2023/24 is allocated, R1.102 billion in 2024/25 and R1.110 billion in 2025/26.

The department has allocated R414.6 million in 2023/24 for the payments of municipal rates and taxes, while new tariffs will be required based on the new billing rates introduced by various municipalities across the North-West Province. The day to day building maintenance for all four districts and provincial head office is being allocated R43.8 million, which include landscaping, plumbing and carpentry. The department is planning to acquire multi-tenancy office building to address issues of leases and rates and taxes within Mahikeng.

In 2023/24 financial year the programme is intending to accelerate the replacement, upgrading and refurbishment of some immovable tangible capital assets which are:

- Installation of transformer and generators at Garona;
- Construction of New Offices for PWR Sub-District Workshop, Vryburg Roads camp;
- Renovation of Chamber of Traditional Council at Old Parliament;
- Renovation of Mmabatho Agri-center;
- Upgrading of Security Entrances at Old Parliament;
- Old Parliament phase 3 (b) - Renovations to offices (Water Back-Up);
- Old Parliament phase 3 (b) - Renovations to offices;
- NMM Sub-district offices Extensions;
- Construction of Perimeter Wall at Geoscience building;
- Potchefstroom Agriculture Cluster B (Completion Contract);
- Construction of false roof at 149 Kruis Street;
- Installation of High Mast Light Naledi sub-district office;

- Security Upgrades at Garona;
- Security Upgrades at Old Parliament;
- Information Technology Infrastructure throughout the province; and
- Installation of UPS.

### **Transport Infrastructure**

In 2023/24 financial year the PRMG is been allocated R1.426 billion and additional to this amount is R405 million for floods damage funded through equitable share for roads upgrading of which.

The following projects will commence for 2023/24 financial year:

- Regravelling of road D332, D506 to Z559 from Sesobe to Dwarsberg approximately 49 km.
- Pothole patching and reseal of road D980 (K8) between Brits and Rosslyn including intersection improvement at road D2726 in Ga-Rankua for approximately 21 km (Safety improvement).
- Special maintenance of road D625 and D626 in Maubane for approximately 10 km; Regravelling of road D3545 from Mofine towards Mania approximately 30 km;
- Upgrading of road Z374 from Austrey to Goodwood 42km;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of road D208, D206, D209 from Manthe through villages of Pitsong, Dikhuting, Graspan Phase 2 45 km;
- Upgrading of gravel to surface standard of road D327 from Ganyesa to Vrygas to Madinonyane (57 km), Phase II of road D327 from Vrygas to the Northern Cape border and of road Z389 from road D327 to Madinonyane;
- Upgrading of road D327 from Ganyesa to Vragas to Madinonyane 57 km Phase 2;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of road Z431 from end of tar to Kgora entrance (3.7 km) including training centre internal road (2.2 km), rehabilitation of road Z431 from N18 to end of tar (3.3 km); and
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of road D479 from Khunotsoana village to T Junction of N4 and Tweenfontein approximately 27 km Phase 3 of 11 km.

### **Community Based Programme**

The purpose of the sub-programme is to develop and assist emerging contractors with guidance and support to ensure that they develop into substantial enterprises. The total budget allocation for the programme Community Based Programme is R227.5 million of which R60 million is funded from the PRMG and R35.8 million for EPWP Integrated grant for the 2023/24 financial year.

The following key indicators is intended to be achieved:

- Number of EPWP work opportunities to be created is 800 for performance on job creation is intended to be achieved from public works and roads sector in this financial year;
- 16 persons living with disability, 440 youth and 480 women have been targeted to be employed/empowered in Public Works and Roads;
- Number of EPWP work opportunities to be created is 13 000 and 16 persons living with disability, 7 150 youth and 7 800 women have been targeted to be employed/empowered in Transport Infrastructure;
- An amount of R60 million has been set aside for the Itelele road maintenance programme which include bush clearing, culverts cleaning, road guardrails maintenance and repairs as well as road markings; and
- Resuscitation of brick making plants within the province.

#### **4 Reprioritization**

- An amount of R5 million has been reprioritised from Transport infrastructure on item communication, operating payment and machinery, to goods and services and salaries of the office of the MEC to cover logistical expenses;
- The amount of R38 million has been reprioritized from Facility Management to Miss, following the approved new structure to fund the property payment (security);
- An amount of R20 million has been reprioritised within Transport Infrastructure under payment for capital assets on building and other fixed structures item to current payments on goods and services to maintain Pilanesburg Park Roads;
- A further R10 million has been reprioritised from rates and taxes in programme 02 to programme 01 under item property payment for security services;
- R28 million is reprioritised from Public Works Infrastructure to Administration due to centralisation of security function; and
- An amount of R1.7 million is reprioritised from programme 03 to offset the pressure under travel and subsistence in programme 01: administration.

#### **5 Procurement**

The following are some of roads upgrading and maintenance projects will be procured for 2023/24 financial year:

- Reseal and rehabilitation of road D132 from N4 to Enzelberg/Mokgola;
- Rehabilitation of road P175/1 from Potchefstroom to Vanderbijlpark(Border Gauteng) 15 km of 35 km, phase1;
- Rehabilitation of road D201 from Sekhing to Kgomotso 13.325 km of 25 km Phase 2;

- Upgrading from gravel to standard (Tar) road D433 from the intersection with road D40 to Nootgedacht and road D433 from Nootgedacht to Makouspan of approximately 15 km;
- Rehabilitation of road P117/1 from Ottosdal to P32/2 to Hartebeespoort 20km of 46 km phase 1
- Special maintenance of critical section of road P2/4 from D1526 to D1437;
- Upgrading from gravel to surface standard of road D479 from Khunotswana village to T – Junction of N4 to Tweefontein in Ngaka Modiri Molema 10 km of 27 km Phase 2; and
- Upgrading of road P66/1(Kgomo-Kgomo) to P65/1, road D614/Z614 (P65/1 to Lebotlweane).

The department is mainly funded from equitable share and conditional grants. Over the 2023 MTEF period the allocation amounts to R3.825 billion, R3.489 billion, R3.649 million in the 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26 financial years respectively.

### Equitable Share

Equitable share allocation for 2023/24 amounts to R2.322 billion and is increasing in the following by R69.7 million to R2.391 billion and by R109.8 million to R2.501 billion in 2024/25 and 2025/26 financial years respectively. The allocation for Provincial Road Maintenance Grant (PRMG) is determined by National department of Transport and it has continuously increased from its original allocation of 2022/23 to R1.426 billion in 2023/24, R1.055.6 billion in 2024/25 financial year and R1.102 billion for 2025/26 financial year. The vote has been allocated Improvement in Condition of Service (ICS) 2023/24 an amount of R21.2 million, R22.1 million for 2024/25 and R22.9 million of 2025/26 last financial year of the MTEF period.

## Conditional Grant

### Expanded Public Works Programme Integrated Grant for Provinces

The EPWP integrated grant for the province allocation has increased by R7.9 million from 2022/23 to R35.8 million for 2023/24 financial year. This grant will incentivize the department to expand its work creation efforts by utilizing labour intensive delivery methods in the identified focus areas. However, the department will continue to expand the labour-intensive projects through road, building construction and maintenance programmes aligned with the objective of the EPWP principles.

During the 2023/24 financial year, R60 million will be added to the grant, which will be implemented in accordance with the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) framework. Through road and building construction and maintenance programmes aligned with the objectives of EPWP, the department will continue to expand labour-intensive projects. The current allocated integrated grant of R35.883 million is for EPWP Grant has been set aside to increase employment on the NYS programme.

### Provincial Roads Maintenance Grant

The purpose of this grant is to supplement provincial investments and support preventative, routine and emergency maintenance on provincial road networks; to ensure that provinces implement and maintain road asset management systems and promote the use of labor-intensive methods in road maintenance. The department continues to comply with Road Infrastructure Strategic Framework for South Africa (RISFSA), of which 5 per cent of the allocation is ring-fenced for road safety appraisals and conditional assessment inspection. Road Asset Management System (RAMS) has been allocated R10 million for 2023/24 and the outer year of the MTEF, to ensure that system is implemented and maintained properly according to Technical Method of Highways (TMH) 22. The grant allocation has been revised to R1.462 billion in 2023/24, R1.056 billion in 2024/25 and R1.103 billion in 2025/26 financial years.

The department has registered a significant revenue collection in 2021/22 financial year, which is attributed to the sales of tender documents, house rentals and unserviceable yellow fleet assets. The late transfer of rental payment by client departments resulted in the decrease of sales of goods and services other than capital assets in 2022/23 financial year, reminders are currently carried out to ensure the timely transfer of rentals amounting to R3.6 million. The department is slowly implementing the rental tariffs as approved by EXCO and Department of Finance.

The department is in the process of asset disposal (Sale of properties) which will raise the revenue collection significantly in 2022/23 financial year. The vote has planned auctions of unserviceable yellow fleet assets for the coming 2023/24 financial year as could not be succeed in 2022/23.

Interest, dividends and rent on land related to the income received on outstanding staff debts. The income received on this classification is inconsistent and marginally low. Statements are sent out to debtors on monthly basis to maximize collection and referral to legal services is done to ensure maximum collection. The closure of Thusong Hospital is also contributing to the under collection of revenue for period of 2022/23.

Transaction in financial assets and liabilities relates to the recoveries of outstanding staff debts and overpayments to creditors from previous years. The previous year recoveries are unpredictable, the increase is mainly due to the late payment of rentals on behalf of officials by government departments.

## **7 Payment summary**

### **7.1 Key assumptions**

Preparation of this budget took cognizance of the Treasury's 2023 budget guidelines with an inflationary projection on CPIX at 5.1 per cent in 2023/24 financial, 4.6 per cent and 4.6 per cent in the each of the outer years respectively.

The budget was provided for cost of living adjustment and the carry through effect was based on the implementation of 2022/23 ICS. These adjustments have been accommodated in this budget allocation to close the gap with an additional funding from Treasury during the 2022/23 adjustment budget. All concomitant COE cost drivers such as housing, pension and medical allowances will be met within the allocations provided.

The department of Public Works and Roads is formed by four below mentioned programmes.

The total payments and estimates for outcomes of three financial years indicates the imperfect spending pattern. In 2021/22, the department had an underspending of 16 per cent largely from the late awarding of road infrastructure projects, hence the application for rollover funds.

The total departmental spending in the third quarter of 2021/22 was at 63 per cent, which was 12 per cent below the target. The difference was as a result of late awarding of road infrastructure projects.

**Programme 1: Administration:** The Programme allocation is R256.6 million in 2023/24, R266.9 million in 2024/25 and R281.8 million in 2025/26.

**Programme 2: Public Works Infrastructure:** The Programme allocation is R1.086 billion in 2023/24, R1.111 billion for 2024/25 and R1.180 billion in 2025/26.

**Programme 3: Transport Infrastructure:** The Programme allocation is R2.253 billion in 2023/24, R1.906 billion in 2024/25 and R1.971 billion in 2025/26.

**Programme 4: Community Based Programme:** The Programme allocation is R227.5 million in 2023/24, R206.4 million in 2024/25 and R215.7 million in 2025/26.

#### Compensation of employees:

The department has registered a significant budget growth between 2022/23 and 2023/24 financial years. This increase was largely influenced by number of key critical positions already filled and other vacancies planned to be filled in 2023/24 financial year. The department received an additional amount of R21.169 million for ICS (Improvement in Condition of Service) during the adjustment budget of financial year 2022/23 and again received R21.262 million in 2023/24.

The department has made budget available in 2022/23 MTEF period for the filling of technical positions particularly in programme 2: Public Works Infrastructure and Programme 3: Transport Infrastructure. The department will continue to monitor the growth trends of compensation of employees to ensure it is within the allocated budget. In financial year 2023/24 the budget allocation for Compensation of Employees is R902.7 million.

#### Goods and Services:

The inconsistent growth pattern on Goods and Services is as a result of outcome and budget appropriation of Provincial Roads Maintenance Grant (PRMG) and EPWP integrated Grant from National Departments. Increase in 2022/23 outcome is as a result of the roll-over and additional funds during adjustment in 2022/23 financial year. The budget for this economic classification has increased from financial year of 2022/23 by R90.5 million to R2.012 billion in 2023/24 financial year. Procurement of fuel, maintenance and repairs, construction equipment, material and supplies remain a huge budget challenge for the department.

### **Transfers and subsidies:**

The continuous growth of rates and taxes is largely contributed by the construction of new infrastructure buildings of other departments, such as Health, Education and Sport Development. Allocation for 2023/24 financial year Rate and Taxes amounts to R414.6 million. Household allocation is mostly for leave gratuity and injury on duty remain unpredictable with R14.9 million allocated for the 2023/24 financial year.

### **Payment of capital assets:**

Buildings and other fixed structures item is solely funded from provincial equitable share allocation and it includes roads and buildings infrastructure. Its main function is to upgrade and construct new infrastructures assets, the acquisition of road construction plant and equipment as well as procurement of machinery and equipment. The department in the financial year 2022/23 has committed R2.7 million for only one yellow fleet. Budget allocation for 2023/24 is R15.7 million, 2024/25 R16.441 million and outer year with an allocation of R17.1 million.

### **7.4.1 Departmental infrastructure payments**

The vote has planned to carry out major road infrastructure maintenance following heavy rains that eroded most provincial roads. Furthermore, the MTEF part of the allocation is meant for rural roads. The maintenance of state owned buildings will be considered with allocation that has been set aside.

#### **7.4.2 Maintenance (Table B 5)**

Maintenance and repairs include among others day-to-day routine activities, periodically scheduled activities, specialised and mechanical maintenance. The department will be implementing maintenance and repair of building infrastructure in phases to address the backlogs, as guided by allocation over the 2023 MTEF period. An amount of R60 million was transferred to Community Based Programme in 2022/23 financial year to accelerate the payment of co-operatives. The department has put aside an extra amount of R138 million for PRMG 2022/23 financial year under vukuphile projects. The funding will address grass cutting and road maintenance programme to create job opportunities, of which youth and persons living with disability is considered.

#### **Non-infrastructure items (Table B 5)**

The department has allocated R22.1 million for 2023/24, R78.1 million 2024/25 and R83.8 million in 2025/26 MTEF for the recruitment and appointment of technical experts on buildings infrastructure programme. The department has also set aside 5 per cent of the Provincial Roads Maintenance Grant for road safety appraisals and improvements, which was introduced for the first time back in 2017/18 by National Department of Transport. An amount of R10 million has been allocated in the coming financial year period for the implementation and maintenance of Road Asset Management System (RAMS).

Administration programme reflects the steady growth over the five-year period. The key positions of HOD, CFO and Director Supply Chain has been filled 2022/23 financial year. The programme sees an increased allocation in 2023/24 MTEF period due the function of Security Service (Property/Payments) being moved to MISS under Corporate Service in line with the departmental structure. The transfer payments and subsidies has been allocated an amount of R969 thousands in 2023/24 financial year, which will be solely used to expense items such as leave gratuity and injury on duties. This classification is also used to expense pay-outs related to resignations.

The decentralization of white fleet from the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management function will be implemented with effective from the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023. The total budget of the programme for the financial year 2023/24 is R256.6 million.

- To ensure that all government owned properties are properly maintained;
- To facilitate the development of emerging contractors through maintenance projects;
- To ensure efficient, appropriate and economic management of provincial building immovable assets;
- To coordinate the securing of office space for provincial departments, allocate habitable residential accommodation to political office bearers and officials; and
- To ensure that payments of all utilities and rates & taxes are made for government owned properties.

The programme has a steady expenditure growth for a period of five years and has been allocated an amount of R1.087 billion in financial year 2023/24, R1.110 billion for 2024/25 financial year and R1.180 billion in 2025/26 financial year. The programme is anticipating expenditure growth percentage in 2023/24 financial year due to the procurement of domestic equipment for the foreseen appointed Members of the Provincial Legislature (MPL).

**Planning:** Is intended to plan infrastructure development based on demand, to monitoring performance and to ensure the enforcement of built sector and property management norms and standards. The sub-programme had a funding challenge in terms of condition assessment, of which the funding need urgent considerations. The sub-programme experienced a significantly growth over five years' period, however compensation of employee's expenditure will start to grow since some critical posts are filled.

**Designs:** To design plans related to refurbishment, rehabilitation and renovations required for existing building infrastructure as well as to design plans for new infrastructure in line with applicable architectural standards and frameworks with an allocation of R4.966 million in 2023/24.

**Construction:** To upgrade and refurbish buildings and construct new building infrastructure within the parameters of reasonable cost, quality and time. The budget for this sub-programme is increasing for the financial period 2023/24 R71.105 million, 2024/25 R74.296 million and 2025/26 R77.625 million. During the adjustment period in current financial year 2022/23 the sub-programme received an amount of R14 million as additional for Compensation of Employees to address the Occupational Specific Dispensation (OSD) appointments.

**Maintenance:** To implement routine, periodic and preventative maintenance based on the condition assessment reports in order to ensure the optimum performance of infrastructure assets throughout their respective life cycles. The baseline allocation for 2023/24 is R429.2 million including the four districts, R423.3 million in 2024/25 and R462.3 million in financial year 2025/26.

**Immovable Asset Management:** The management of property portfolio of provincial government through the provisioning of residential and office accommodation and by providing integrated property management services to clients and users departments throughout the life cycle of respective properties/assets. The sub programme has a growth increase in the baseline throughout the MTEF period. The allocation for MTEF is R24.4 million in 2023/24, R25.5 million for 2024/25 and R26.7 million in 2025/26 financial years respectively.

**Facility Management:** Provision of operations facility management services such as cleaning, landscaping, gardening, security and day to day building maintenance. The programme will continue to monitor the payments of municipal rates and taxes to ensure that we are spending within the allocated budget. The programme is verifying the billing tariffs charged by municipalities and taking

stock of what is really charged by the municipalities. The prestige maintenance is adequately funded with the provincial equitable share allocation to address infrastructure maintenance.

### **Compensation of employees**

The growth pattern on compensation of employees is continuing to grow throughout the MTEF period. Positions of two Chief Directors, Building Infrastructure and Facility Management has been filled. This programme had experienced filling of high number of vacancies of cleaners and groundsman in financial year 2022/23. The budget allocation for this item is continuously increasing since more positions of this programme is experiencing high rate of vacant positions. The allocation is R414.3 million for 2023/24, R422.5 million in 2024/25 and R441.5 million for 2025/26 financial year.

### **Goods and Services**

The item growth pattern on goods and services is consistent. The overs pending of Goods and Services is as a result of high rise on security services payments. This implies that the amount of R200.7 million in 2023/24 financial year will be allocated, R212.9 million in 2024/25 and R242.4 million in 2025/26.

### **Transfers and subsidies**

The transfer and subsidies include the payments to municipalities (rates and taxes) as well as households (leave gratuities and injury on duty). The department is currently verifying the tariffs charged by municipalities against the property owned. The budget allocated for rates and taxes is R414.6 million for 2023/24 financial years. The household's allocation for the programme is R6.4 million for 2023/24, an amount of R6.7 million in 2024/25 and R7.1 million for 2023 MTEF period.

### **Payments of capital assets**

The growth pattern of capital assets is dependent on need analysis report for new and upgrading of infrastructure buildings, hence it remains inconsistent. The economic classification will remain to be observed in order to ensure that it is within the allocated budget. The department allocated an amount of R51.2 million in 2023/24, R53.5 million 2024/25 and R55.9 million 2024/25 MTEF.

### **Service delivery measures**

Table below illustrates some of the main service delivery measures applicable to Programme 2. The programme has a service delivery agreement with its client department, below listed performance indicators comply fully with the customised measures of the public works sector. Some of the previous year performance indicators were reviewed and new and revised ones are factored into performance indicator tables.

The varying growth percentage pattern indicated above is as a result of the underspending and inconsistent allocation of provincial road maintenance grant (PRMG) as well as the provincial equitable share allocation for upgrading road infrastructure and maintain, repairs and yellow fleet.

**Programme Support - Roads:** Provides general operational support to the programme, which include programme management and support personnel as well as their operational expenditure such as financial, procurement, administrative support and RAMS components. The allocated budget for MTEF is R64.4 million in financial year 2023/24.

**Planning - Roads:** Provides planning services in support of integrated transport infrastructure network, to promote and improve road safety and data collection. The programme will continue with planning of all roads related projects according to need assessment and the political pronouncements. The allocated budgeted is R3.1 million in 2023/24 financial year.

**Design - Roads:** To provide for the design of transport infrastructure including support functions such as Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), Transport Impact Assessment (TIA), surveys, expropriations, material investigations and testing, road classification and upgrading of geographic information systems. The budget will also be essential for the road classification and upgrading of geographic information systems.

**Construction - Roads:** To provide for construction of new roads, upgrading and rehabilitation of existing infrastructure. The total provincial maintenance grant budget is allocated under this sub-programme as well as upgrading and other fixed structures. An amount of R60 million in 2023/24 throughout the outer years to 2025/26 financial year will be transferred to Programme 4: Community Based Programme for Iterele road maintenance programme. The allocation for this sub-programme for financial year 2023/24 is R1.771 billion.

**Maintenance - Roads:** To provide for the maintenance and repairs of provincial road networks in the province by using internal and outsource capacity. The PRMG allocation has been allocated to districts in three functional responsibilities, which includes re-gravelling, routine road maintenance and specialized maintenance.

- Day to day maintenance such as clearing and cleaning of drains and culverts, vegetation control, line markings and guard rail repairs will continue in 2023/24 financial year;
- Periodically scheduled maintenance activities, which will include fog sprays or rejuvenators, surface seals, functional asphalt overlays and re-gravelling;
- Special maintenance on selected pavements areas, which include reinstatement of slope stability and repairs caused by accidents or floods; and
- Rehabilitation of roads by increasing the structural capacity of existing pavement through recycling of existing layers or addition of granular layer.

### **Compensation of employees**

The inconsistent growth since 2020/21 was as a result of high vacancy rate in the programme, which is as a result of poor turnout of applicants as well as retirements and resignation of employees especially the roads maintenance employees. A continuous budget monitoring will be exercised to avoid over and under spending in 2023/24 financial year. The allocation of budget for the financial year 2023/24 is R332.7 million.

### **Goods and Services**

The programme has a budget challenge of financing the maintenance and repairs of existing yellow fleet. The department will continue to reprioritise the budget to ensure the adequate allocation of diesel and road maintenance materials are budgeted. The total allocation of PRMG for the 2023/24 financial year is R1.426 billion, R1.055 billion on 2024/25 and R1.102 billion in 2025/26 financial year. The total of goods & services for this programme has increased by R20 million from upgrading of Pilanesberg Park road maintenance.

### **Transfers and subsidies**

The allocation in this economic classification is guided by number of resignation and retirements of employees. The outcome shows the fluctuating trends, which is an indication of the unpredictability and the nature of the expenditure of this economic classification.

### **Payment of capital assets**

The budget allocation under other fixed structure is based on the Infrastructure Programme Management Plan (IPMP). The budget has increased from R380 million in 2022/23 financial year to R385 million in 2023/24 financial year for upgrading of roads infrastructure. The programme is planning to upgrade 23 roads from gravel to surface standard in 2023/24 financial year with an increase of budget by R25 million funded through equitable share.

### **Service delivery measures**

The table below reflects some of the main service delivery measures of programme three. The performance indicators provided fully complies with the customised of Transport sector. The budget programme is continuously rising due to the new service delivery mandate.

**Description and objectives:** The purpose of the programme is to direct and manage the implementation of EPWP programs and strategies that lead to the development and empowerment of communities and contractors. Other objectives include the following:

- To ensure that there is a 5-year plan for the management, implementation, support and monitoring of the Provincial EPWP plan in order to meet the target set by national government;
- To ensure that the programme is in place to support local municipalities and provincial government department in implementing expanded public works programmes.
- To ensure that there is a dedicated technical support programme for the infrastructure sector to maximize the potential use of labour-intensive construction method;
- To ensure capacity building through training of beneficiaries on critical and scarce skills such as artisans, entrepreneurship and contractor development; and
- To ensure that new Programmes are identified, funded and included in the EPWP programme.

The programme's budget has declines by R135 million from main appropriation of 2022/23 financial year to R227.5 million in 2023/24 financial year and only recover in 2025/26 financial year.

**Programme Support:** The aim of sub programme is to provide operational support to the programme. The programme is currently working with seven (7) officials as well as four (04) contract workers for data capturing. The budget is increasing throughout the 2025/26 MTEF period but at a very low percentage.

**Community Development:** The sub-programme is intended to develop and assist emerging contractors with guidance and support to ensure they are developed into sustainable enterprises. The increase of EPWP incentive grant budget allocation helped the increase intake of EPWP. An amount of R60 million from programme 03: Transport Infrastructure in 2022/23 financial year for Iterele programme has been included in the programme allocation. The mentioned figures are aimed at capacitating the programme and ensure that, it champion the implementation of Itirele road maintenance programme with the purpose of upscaling the creation of work opportunities and income support to the poor unemployed people through the use of labour-intensive delivery mechanisms in routine road maintenance activities.

**Innovation and Empowerment:** To develop new training programmes and identify new opportunities. In 2023/24 financial year this sub-programme will receive an amount of R5.3 million, R6.6 million in financial year 2024/25 and R5.8 million in last period of the MTEF.

**EPWP Co-ordination and monitoring:** To coordinate and monitor the implementation of EPWP related plans and strategies. The sub-programme is intended to allow officials to monitor the operation of the projects, provide advice and identify new contractors and innovations ways of productivity and sustainability. The budget allocation is R384 thousands for 2023/24, however the budget performance will be monitored to ensure that no overspending is realised.

### Compensation of employees

The programme has managed to fill the vacant positions. The programme has an allocation of R7.2 million in 2023/24 in 2024/25 R7.6 million and R7.9 million 2025/26 financial year.

### Goods and Services

In 2016/17 the department took a resolution to re-classify the Provincial Road Maintenance Grant (PRMG) into Goods and Services, to comply with grant condition. The allocation for 2023/24 financial year is an amount to R220.1 million, R198.6 million 2024/25 financial year with R207.5 million for 2025/26.

### Transfer Payments.

This economic classification remains uncertain due to the nature of its expenditure. In 2023/24 R29 thousand is allocated MTEF period the economic classification is marginally allocated, which is as a result of historical spending.

### Payments of capital assets

The programme continued to make a budget provision under this economic classification and onwards for the procurement and replacement of computers and printers for existing and new employees. The allocation for 2023/24 MTEF period is increasing at a marginal level, and it is aimed at procuring for the replacements of computer related items amounting to R122 thousands.

### Service delivery measures

The table below reflects the main service delivery measures relevant to Community Based Programme. The indicators provided comply fully with the customised measures for Transport and Public Works sector. Some of the key indicators were not included in the service delivery measures reported in the last EPRE.

The department according to the Skills Development Act is required to budget the minimum of one per cent of its wage bill for personnel training and development. The training demand is in line with workplace skills programme and personal development plan, of which all employment levels are targeted. The human resource development is also embarking on internships and learnerships which has a maximum duration of 12 and 18 months for universities and TVET colleges respectively.

The department is awarding bursaries to employees according to bursary policy and the funding is from training and development allocation. Short courses, workshops, conferences and the registration with professional bodies are part of the training the department is implementing to ensure that, officials are well developed and become productive. The budget is centralized under programme 1 Administration. The department has introduced two apprenticeship programmes, plumbing and Electrical.
