Consolidated set of provincial government tables – non-financial (performance) information

Introduction

The tables in Annexure B present consolidated datasets of performance output information for five sectors within provincial government. The information gives an overview of provincial departments' performances against predetermined objectives and targets that they set in their annual performance plans. The datasets have been verified against the actual data published in Part II of each of the relevant provincial departments' annual report. In addition the different Heads of Department have provided official sign-off on the correctness of the data relating to each of their departments. Despite these measures there are still anomalies in the datasets, consequently the data should be regarded as "soft" – indicative of trends rather than absolute measures of performance.

This is the second time that this consolidated dataset is being published. It is envisaged that in subsequent years the completeness and reliability of the information supplied by provincial departments will improve with the result that this information will become increasingly useful for holding provincial government accountable.
