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Mr M Swart (DA) to ask the Minister of Finance:

Whether each province has its own funding allocation model in order to determine

what level of funding their respective health departments receive; if not, (a) why not

and (b) how are funding allocations determined; if so, what model is used in each

province?

REPLY:

Health services in provinces are funded through the provincial equitable share and

health conditional grants. Conditional grants have to be spent according to specified

conditions. The conditions and allocation criteria used to allocate conditional grants

to provinces are determined by the national Department of Health.

Each province has its own approach in allocating its provincial equitable share,

including the funding allocation to health. Most provinces attempt to take into

account previous spending levels and new national priorities. However, provinces

tend to differ in the way that they approach provincial specific priorities and

pressures.

This matter is currently under discussion with the provinces with a view to creating

greater certainty for provincial health budgets, and ensuring that national objectives

in respect to health are achieved.
