Ms B V Mncube (ANC-Gauteng) to ask the Minister of Finance:

Whether he will consider the reviewing of the provincial allocation according to the Equitable

Share funding formula as the population of Gauteng is growing yearly as a result of

migration; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details?

REPLY:

An objective redistributive formula, consisting of seven components: Education; Health;

Basic Share; Poverty; Economic Activity; and Institutional, is used to divide the equitable

share among provinces. The formula is reviewed and updated with new data annually. Only

data which satisfies quality and data integrity criteria (official demographic data) is used. This

includes annually updated school enrolment data provided by the Department of Basic

Education, annually updated mid-year population estimates and the most recent General

Households Survey and GDP-R data as published by StatsSA.

Because the formula is largely population-driven, the allocations it generates are sensitive to

shifts in population across provinces. The formula therefore responds to the changes in the

relative demand for public services across the provinces, including Gauteng. Data updates to

provincial shares are phased in over a three year period to enable provinces to adjust to their

revised allocations. A detailed discussion of the technical revisions is contained in

Annexure E/W1 to the annual Budget Reviews and annual Division of Revenue Bills.

More comprehensive reviews (policy reviews) of the structure of the formula are also

undertaken as and when appropriate. The outcomes of a review of the provincial equitable

share formula, recently approved by Cabinet, will be announced as part of the 2010 Medium

Term Budget Policy Statement for implementation from the 2011 Budget.
