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Mr. M.W. Makhubela (COPE-Limpopo) to ask the Minister of Finance:

(1) Whether the Government had fully developed policy with regard to providing loans to

SADC countries and more importantly ensuring that Parliament was kept fully

informed about the borrowing country's compliance with (a) terms and conditions, (b)

monitoring and reporting, and (c) servicing and redemption of the loan; if not, why not;

and if so, what are the relevant details?

REPLY:

Each request for financial assistance is considered on an individual basis. A variety

of instruments are currently being utilised depending on the type, urgency and

amount of assistance required. As such, there is no single policy covering loans but

rather a framework of differing requirements dependent on the vehicle through which

the assistance is channelled and the purposed of its application. Instruments

available to Government include the African Renaissance Fund, the Export Credit

Insurance Corporation of South Africa (ECIC), the Development Bank of Southern

Africa (DBSA), the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC) and bilateral financial

assistance.

It is expected that with the establishment of the South African Development

Partnership Agency (SADPA) (an Agency to be housed within the Department of

International Relations and Cooperation (DIRCO)), the government will be in a

position to develop a policy framework that will inform how loans and grants are

provided to other countries.

Parliament will be fully informed of any loans to SADC countries and the relevant

terms and condition, when such loans are approved by Government.
