#### Mr D Joseph (DA-WC) to ask the Minister of Finance:

- (1) What is the percentage of the budget that has been spent on personnel in the (a) Public Health and (b) Public Education in relation to the 62 percent that has been spent on personnel employed in the SA Navy;
- (2) whether the cost to personnel is benchmarked against international standards; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details?

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#### **REPLY**:

1. (a) In the health function the percentage for compensation of employees in 2011/12 was 60.6% (R60.0 billion of a total expenditure of R113.8 billion).

(b) For the education function, excluding the Higher Education and Training sector, 78 % of the total budget (R122.2 billion of a total expenditure of R156.5 billion) was spent on compensation of employees in 2011/12.

2. The government does not benchmark its spending allocations against spending patterns of other countries, as there is no international standard for the management of personnel costs given the structure of public and private provision of services vary considerably across different countries.

Using education as an example, the table below with data from the UNESCO database shows the percentage that salaries (excluding those at Higher Education and Training institutions) make-up of total education expenditure (excluding Higher Education and Training spending) in 2009 from selected countries including South Africa.
