## NATIONAL COUNCIL OF PROVINCES QUESTION FOR WRITTEN REPLY QUESTION NUMBER: 301 [CW313E]

## 301. Mr S F du Toit (North West: FF Plus) to ask the Minister of Finance:

(a) How much was lost in (i) revenue and (ii) taxes during the Covid-19 lockdown as a result of non-black economic empowerment compliant businesses that had to close down and (b) how many jobs were lost as a result thereof?

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## REPLY:

(a)(i) As communicated at the supplementary budget for the year to date period 01 April 2020 up until 31 May 2020 SARS collected an amount of R142.3bn against a Printed Estimate (PE) of R179.4bn, yielding a deficit of R 37.1bn (-20.7%) with Prior Year (PY) growth at R-33.3bn (-19.0%).

The above revenue shortfalls can largely be attributed to the impact of the nationwide economic lockdown, which was implemented in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. The fact that the main tax types namely PAYE, VAT, CIT and Import Taxes under pressure provides a clear indication of an ailing economy that has been hit hard by the pandemic amongst other pre-COVID 19 challenges including deteriorating compliance.

- (ii) The tax administration system does not collect primary information on BBBEE compliant and non-BBBEE statuses of taxpayers as such referral is made to the relevant government agencies that administer such information
- (b) Whilst SARS administers tax directives including retrenchments, correlating tax directives to job losses in entities that are BBBEE or non-BBBEE compliant is not in the purview or mandate of the South African Revenue Service. In this regard, deferral is made to the relevant government agencies.
